Hall/Cole 'three-peat' at State Doubles

Not too long ago, former Los Angelas Laker coach Pat Riley, coined a nifty phrase that he had patented: "threepeat" was his term for three National Basketball Association Championships in a row, as his two time defending champs were trying to put the Laker name in the record books. Though his Lakers succumbed in the finals to the awesome onslaught of the wondrous Detroit Pistons, Riley's term became fair game for anyone going for three championships in a row.

This year's Michigan State Doubles Championships at the newly remodeled Ann Arbor One on One Athletic Club featured a possible three-peat performance in Men's Open Davison's Troy Hall and Chris Cole were attempting to adopt their own version of three-peat having won two Open State Doubles titles Standing in their way was the Ferris State duo of Jim Floyd and Jeff Kummler, who have formed a good combination with decidedly different game styles.

Although game one saw

Cole and Hall victorious, it was the second game that forced the explosion of a true battle Floyd and Kummler quickly jumped to take leads of 8-5 and 13-7, sending the reigning champs reeling. The crowd, boisterous as usual when the charismatic Floyd is on the court, began pulling for the Ferris State duo from the start and picked up steam even more as Floyd/Kummler expanded their lead and gave all indications they would get to see that which they came to watch for: a thrilling winnertake-all five dives per rally tie breaker. However, something happened to quiet the crowd, something Hall/Cole have begun to patent lately: the cardiac comeback, as they rallied to score eight straight points in route to a 15-13 second game triumph and their third straight Men's Open State Championships

In other divisional play, Hastings added another State title to his growing collection, teaming with Jack White to win Men's 30+ White and mixed doubles partner Buffy Gutowski were the only two players to walk away with a double scoop this weekend with White/ Gutowski taking home the prize in Mixed Open with a chaotic 11-10 tie breaker victory over Hastings and

Cole makes U.S. national team

Michigan's Chris Cole, by virtue of his ninth place finish at the National Singles last May, has been selected to be on the United States National team. He and two other players, Tim Hansen (Georgia) and Mike Guidry (Texas) were picked to fill three vacancies made available by the former U.S. Team members Tim Doyle, Andy Roberts and Brian Hawkes Because of a confusing process, these former U.S. Team players have resigned their places as part of an agreement with the Men's Professional Racquetball Association whereby those pros ranked in the Top 16 would not be allowed to be a part of the U.S. Team or eligible for amateur competition. Of the four singles players on the U.S. Team right before the **AARA** National Doubles Championships in October, only National Singles Champion Tim Sweeney (Illinois) decided to keep his amateur status and remain with the U.S. Team, thus creating the void recently filled by Cole, Hansen and Guidry

The players on the U.S. Team are chosen from Men's and Women's Open players from the various national tournaments the AARA puts on. These finishes will earn people spots on the team: first through third place at National Singles, first place ant National Doubles, first place at Intercollegiate Nationals

(#1 singles only), and U.S. Olympic Festival first place (both doubles and singles).

Obviously, with the various possibilities to make the team, double qualifiers are probable, thus placement at National Singles goes beyond finishing in the top three. Here is a rundown of how the National Singles Championships went and why certain people made the team: First-Sweeney (still with the team), second-Egan Inoue of Hawaii (ineligible because of a suspension imposed on him by the AARA), semi's-Doyle and Roberts (resigned from team), fifth-Hawks (resigned from team), sixth-Hansen (on the team for the past year after winning National Doubles with Michigan's Jim Floyd, lost in 1991 National Doubles in quarterfinals, named to

U.S. Team as singles player in place of Doyle), seventh-Doug Ganim (already on team for winning Doubles at Olympic Festival with Hawkes), eighth-Guidry (named to replace Roberts).

With one more singles spot to be filled it was necessary for the U.S. National team committee to look past the quarters at the National Singles and thus the ninth place finisher, Cole, to find the third replacement for Hawkes Unfortunately, missing out by one spot was Grand Rapid's Joel Bonnett who placed tenth at National Singles.

"I feel badly for Joel," said Cole, "because we played off at Houston for ninth place the very last day of the national tournament. We were told Continued on page 11

Seniors tournament draws 100

Play was available in Men's divisions from 35+ through 65+ and in Women's 35 and 40 divisions Many racquetball champions attended, including former U.S. National 70 champion Earl Acuff, current Canadian National 65+ champion Ed Boyer and Women's National 40+ quarter finalist Shelly Ogden The competition was quite fierce and only one or two points in many cases decided who advanced out of the

brackets into the playoffs and even who won individual matches

Hosted by the new Michigan Athletic Club in Lansing, players from all over the midwest got a look at Michigan's premier racquet and health facility.

As a part of the tournament, a banquet was held on Saturday evening Racquetball equipment and memorabilia was auctioned off in support of the U.S. National Team.


Team USA and Fran's commitment as Assistant Coach for the Adult U.S. Team, they were still up for any challenge thrown their way

From the Rule Book

by W.T. Blakeslee

The weekend of December 7, 1991, at the State Doubles Tournament, the following rules were the most often discussed

OUT OF ORDER SERVE

In doubles, when either partner serves out-of-order, the points scored by that server will be subtracted and an out of serve will be called: if the second server serves out-of-order, the serve will be applied to the first server and the second server will resume serving. If the player designated as the first server serves out-of-order, a sideout will be called. In a match with line judges, the referee may enlist their aid to recall the number of points scored in out of serve order.

RULE 4.2 START

The server may not start the service motion until the referee has called the score or "second serve." The serve is started from any place within the service zone. (Certain drive exception, see Rule 4.6) Neither the ball, nor any part of either foot may extend beyond either line of the service zone when initiating the service motion. Stepping on, but not over, the lines is permitted. When completing the service motion, the server may step over the serve (front) line provided that some part of both feet remain on or inside the line until the served ball passes the short line. The server may not step over the short line until the ball passes the short line. See Rules 4.10(a) and 4.11(k) for penalties and violations.

RULE 3.7 APPEALS - (d) LIMIT ON APPEALS

A player or team may make three appeals per game However, if either line judge agrees with the referee's call, that appeal will not count against the three-appeal limit. In addition, the game ending rally may be appealed even if the three-appeal limit has been reached
