The magic continued off the court as old friends met in the friendly atmosphere of Federal Way, and past times were exchanged over a Lite Beer.

Excitement abounded as no less than ten of the top seeded teams were upset. The talk of the tournament was the 3rd round upset of the top seeded and 4-time National champions, Mark Malowitz and Jeff Kwartler of Houston, TX by Dan Massari and John Mack of Los Angeles, CA. The magic continued as two teams performed the incredible feat of winning two divisions. Bill Thurman and Bill Dunn of California in the Men's 30+ and 35 + and Burt Morrow and Less Shelton also of California in the Men's 55 + and 60 +. The magic that the team of Dr. Bud Muehleisen and Myron Roderick has had over their

opponents for years failed to appear. Though Muehleisen and Roderick repeated their National 45 + division win, they failed to repeat in the 40+ as Jim Austin of Houston and Bill Schmidtke from Minneapolis, MN defeated them in the finals.

Pennsylvania brought some Allegheny magic with them as they dominated the Women's Open (Tammy Hajjar, Harrisburg and Beth Latini, Philadelphia) and captured the Mixed Doubles (Dan Obremski and Tammy Hajjar over another Pennsylvania team of Hugh Klein and Beth Latini).

More magic occurred on Saturday evening. The awards banquet attracted 300 guests. Highlight awards were given to Bill Gillespie, Northwest Regional Director and J. P. Kidwell from Lite Beer from Miller for their continued support and contributions to amateur racquetball in the United States. Congratulations go out to the U.S. team qualifiers, Steve Trent/Stan Wright, Men's Open winners and Tammy Hajjar/Beth Latini, Women's Open winners. It is our hope that the magic will continue as they prepare


to meet the best from Canada and Mexico at the North American Regional Games March 4-6, 1983 in Montreal.

In the lower bracket, second seeded Steve Trent and Stan Wright now heavily favored since the defeat of Malowitz and Kwartler found themselves in the semis against the strong intercollegiate team of Jack Newman



If your state association does not at this time publish a monthly newsletter, I urge you to contact your state director and volunteer your time to promote and establish your own state publication.

Racquetball facilities in most states have the need for someone to act as a clearing-house during the tournament season . . . what agency is better suited to serve this purpose than the player's voice of amateur racquetball from within the state?



Continued From Pg. 1 (current National Open Singles Champion) and Brian Sheldon from Memphis State University. Wright and Trent dominated the first game 21-12, but the second game was another story. Newman got hot and blasted his way to a 16-1 lead. Trent and Wright never lost their composure, however, and slowly began a long comeback. Newman/Sheldon had game point at 20-16 four times, but could not score as Wright and Trent continued their relentless pressure to win 21-20. The finals were a repeat of the semis for Trent and Wright as Massari and Mack shot out to an 11-0 lead only to have Wright and Trent come back to win game one 21-17. It was all over but the shouting for Massari and Mack as Dan Massari who had played in the 25+ finals earlier in the day began to tire. Game 2 was dominated by Wright and Trent as they won easily 21-13 and captured the National title as well as a berth on the U.S. National Team.

WOMEN'S OPEN

The women's field was filled with one upset after another as only the #3 seeded team of Tammy Hajjar and Beth Latini, PA lived up to their billing. No. 1 seed Janet Simon and Eileen Ehrlich, Maine, went out in the first round to the highly touted

Juniors team of Mona Mook and Mo Nard from California, 21-10, 21-18 only to have this fine young team upset by locals Kim Tiedeman and Lee Jew of Washington in one of the most exciting matches of Nationals 17-21, 21-14, 11-7. In the lower brackets Hajjar and Latini were having their problems in the quarters squeaking by Connie Peterson and Kathleen Wilson from Oregon 14-21, 21-8, 11-8. The magic continued for Hajjar and Latini as they met the strong second seeded team of ex-pro Sheryl Ambler and Barb Smith of Boise, Idaho in the semis. They dropped the first game 17-21, rallied in the second to win 21-12 and dominated the tie breaker 11-6.

The most exciting match of the tournament was played in the Women's Open Finals as Tiedeman and Jew met Hajjar and Latini. So exciting, in fact, that the men's open finals was delayed an hour in order to allow the large crowd of spectators the opportunity to enjoy the outcome. Turnover after turnover occurred as the fans applauded continuously throughout the match. Game 1 went to Hajjar and Latini as they seemed to dominate Kim Tiedeman on the left side. Game 2 saw the magic shift to the Washington hopefuls as the momentum swung 180° for Tiedeman and Jew to win 21-11. The tie breaker found Tiedeman and Jew with the large crowd solidly behind them, cheering their every move. At 6-6 Hajjar called a time out and regrouped. The Pennsylvania team never lost its composure and the experience of Hajjar (national intercollegiate champion) came through as she led her team to the National title and a U.S. National team berth at 11-6.

MEN's 25+

Top seeded and local favorites Tony Krause, OR and Fielding Snow, WA breezed through the upper bracket to find themselves in the finals against Gary Mazaroff, NM and Dan Massari, CA who had their problems getting into the finals. In the semis they met the local team of Dan Allen and Gordy Pfeifer. For those non-Handball buffs, Pfeifer is the current reigning National Open Professional Champion in handball who had played racquetball only three times this year. Gordy's team lost in the tie breaker 11-9 and one can only speculate what would happen in the racquetball heirarchy if Gordy adopts racquetball in a competitive way. The finals went to Krause and Snow as they completely dominated Massari and Mazaroff 21-13, 21-13.

WOMEN's 25+

In a round robin format the top seeded open team of Janet Simon, MA and Eileen Ehrlich, ME who lost in the second round of the Open redeemed themselves by dominating the 25 + division going 4-0. Simon/Ehrlich had wins over Taffy Savard/Diane Clairmont CN Sybil McCormack/Judy Lambly, ID, Kathy Mueller/Kathy Passe, MN and Gloria Pierson/Terresa Silva, OR.

AARA **Seeking Bids**

The A.A.R.A. is now seeking site bids for the 1983 Adult National Doubles Championships to be held October 20-23, 1984, the Adult National Singles to be held May 24-28, 1984 and the Junior National Championships June 23-27, 1984.

The Adult Doubles and Singles site

will be selected at the May 25, 1983 Board of Directors meeting, while the 1984 Junior Nationals site will be awarded June 24, 1983 at the Junior Council meeting.

AARA Signs Agreement

The Board of Directors recently approved a contract with the United States Amateur Athletic Travel Union whereby members of the A.A.R.A. have the opportunity to save up to 35% on American Airlines, 25% at participating Holiday Inns and 25% off of Hertz's already low weekend rates when used in conjunction with any A.A.R.A. sanctioned events or any registered running event. The U.S.A.A.T.U. was formed to help defray the travel costs of amateur athletes and their families while traveling to and from athletic functions.

The more experienced and better team work of Dunn/Thurman proved itself once again as they held out over Strom/Page 21-16, 21-7.

Only two short years ago we were scrambling to get enough entries in the 30+ to hold the division. This group has grown in popularity as 10 top flight teams competed. The top seeded team of Jeanine Farrell, VA and Marilyn Ross, PA breezed its way to the finals and met the second seeded team of Wanda Collins/Lee Jew, WA. Both teams had little trouble getting to the finals but there the yellow brick road came to an end. In an excellent display of racquetball skill and sportsmanship, Collins/Jew defeated Farrell/Ross 13-21, 21-14, 11-3.




