

Kathy Gzill, Writing the look on Illinois Racquetball?



I always find it somewhat strange to learn what goes on with racquetball friends and opponents in the real world after the racquets get put in their bag. It is even stranger still to find that a top Illinois player even has a life outside of a racquetball court. This is especially true with the winner of this year's Illinois State Women's Open, Kathy Grill of Champaign. Kathy is a best selling novelist with not one, but two novels under her pen name of Katherine Greyle. If her luck holds out, we might see a made for TV movie or even a feature film made from one or both of her books! Her first book is titled Oracle, which is a romance

novel set in a futuristic/time-travel world where magic, danger and wizards rule. Patricia White from 'Under the Cover Book Reviews' states that "the Oracle is a powerful book, full of conflict, internal and external, and is almost impossible to put down." Great review, which is one of several noted on Amazon.com's site. The book has won several awards, including Best Futuristic and Best of the Best from Prism Reviews, Kathy's second book, Rules for a Lady, is due out in January.

Kathy's real world background includes a Masters' in Screen Writing at University of Southern California. A background which is very helpful with the process that happens after a book gets written. She is currently working with her agent in negotiations for movie rights on both books, a process which she says many enter but few come out of. Still, her second book has entered the "development" phase, which reduces the odds from one in thousands to one in hundreds.

Does Racquetball play any role in her writing success? Surprisingly, Kathy notes many similarities. Both require much patience and practice. While these recent two books have become a success, Kathy noted that Oracle was the 6th or 7th book that she wrote. Dealing with rejection, knowledge that success comes only after hard work is a key. The ability to deal with tough competition; pressure, keeping your cool in dealing with your opponent or publishers and lawyers all help.

With a laugh, Kathy noted that she has not yet worked a racquetball theme into one of her novels, although she did once write a screen play around a racquetball theme. No luck that time. "Maybe sometime in the future," she noted. Still racquetball is an important element in her daily life, as her day job includes running the racquetball program as head racquetball pro at The Fitness Center in Champaign. This dedication helped her best good Chicago area competition, beating Patrice Calvi, Laurel Davis and Liz Molitor at the ISRA State Singles Championships, an accomplishment she ranks up there with the birth of her two daughters and getting published. All in all, Kathy seems to have her eye on the ball and with her determination, who knows where that will lead her? -Mike Davern.







Junior Clinic Tour Finishes Strong



Playing a Pro

ed. note. Mike wrote this essay for his 8th grade English class. We don't know for sure if he got an "A" but we sure liked it. Hope you do, too...

I bounced down the stairs at my local racquetball club as I run into one of my racquetball instructors. He said, "Did you know the pros are coming to this club?"

My jaw dropped in surprise. I asked, "Which pros are coming?"

"Cliff Swain and Derek Robinson." (Cliff is currently the #2 player in the world, and Derek is currently #5). Then both of us got into a conversation and went into the locker room to change. I played that night for about four hours, then on the way home I told my dad that the pros were coming up to our club in four days. He was also surprised. After going to school thinking about that the whole time, it was finally the fourth day and I couldn't wait to get off the bus. I walked home as fast as I could to call my dad to see what time we were leaving.

He said with excitement, "around five o'clock." (It was around 3:30) I waited and waited with anxiousness and excitement for that sound of the Ford Diesel to pull up in the driveway. I finally heard the sound of it at about five. I was all excited when Dad walked in the door and said to pack my bag and we'll go. I ran through the kitchen to throw my clothes in my bag as I waited anxiously for my dad to do the same. He came walking through the kitchen as he said, "Do you know why you're bringing your racquetball stuff?"

I asked, "No, why are we?"

He just walked out the door and mumbled, "you'll see when you get there." We drove to the club, (we live about two minutes away) walked through the front door and I ran downstairs to get changed. I did not see the pros anywhere. I bounced back up the stairs and to my surprise, my instructor came up to me and exclaimed, "Do ya wanna meet Derek?"

I excitedly said, "Sure." We walked down the stairs as my instructor said that both of the pros were probably in the locker room getting stretched out to play. I walked in and I saw a towering man, about 6'4". I walked up to him and I looked up almost directly at the ceiling. My instructor introduced me to Derek and I shook his hand. He squeezed my hand pretty hard and I tried to do the same. I was absolutely amazed that I got to meet him in person. At other tournaments I have seen the pros play, and I have also gotten some signatures on racquetballs, but I was never introduced. I barely got out the word "Hi", as he said, "Hi." He said he had to get stretched out to play Cliff, so I ran back upstairs as quickly as I could to tell my dad. He smiled as he put me in front of him with a spot on the top where I was looking down on the bright empty court. I then heard a bag drop outside the court door, then I saw Cliff Swain and Derek Robinson sprint up the stairs to answer questions from the crowd. There were questions like, "What do you eat before you go to play a game?" and "What kind of exercises do you do to stay in shape?" The pros answered all of the questions and then went downstairs to do warm ups.

I saw them hit ceiling shots then hit kill shots. They started hitting the ball so hard, the ball almost sounded like a small, high pitched bell ringing. I looked behind me and I saw people standing on chairs trying to see the pros practice. There were so many people that showed up, the people in the front row had to turn to the side so more people could see. I turned back around and I saw the pros

starting the game. Cliff Swain served the ball as a lob serve and Derek hit a hard and low shot that got Cliff out. The game went up to eleven points, just like a tournament match. It was the tenth point and Cliff served and aced Derek out and Cliff Swain won. Both of them came upstairs to talk with the mid-west representative, Lynn Adams (seven-time women's world champion) of Wilson Racquetball, and she decides that Cliff and Derek should play one more game, and they did. Cliff Swain won, (show off). Both of the pros rocketed up the stairs and the president said that both pros were going to play three pick up games each. (A pick up game is one in which the pros would play members and visitors from the club). People who wanted to play raised their hands, and I was the first to raise my hand, of course. Lynn of Wilson picked my instructor to play Cliff Swain first, and a visitor to play him second, she scanned around the room as she glance at me and said, "The boy in the back."

I was stunned. My face turned redder than a ripe tomato and butterflies started to fly in my stomach. As both of the pros were going down the stairs, Derek winked at me and gave me a smile as a good luck sign against Cliff. I walked quickly to where I could look down on the court, and to my surprise, my instructor walked in and started to warm up. I watched as Cliff walked in and started to warm up again. The game finally started as Cliff and my instructor cracked a few jokes at each other. My instructor lost. The next "victim" walked into the court and started to warm up. They played a game, and Cliff won again. I scrambled down stairs to see Cliff. Swain. He said, "Hi," are you ready to play?"

I said, "Yeah!" I walked in with my legs shaken' like jello that fell on the floor.

I warmed up and Cliff said, "You can serve." I served a drive serve which is a hard and low shot that has to go past the second line of the serves box before it can bounce, or its short. If it hits the back wall without bouncing, it is called long. My serve was good and Cliff Swain got it with ease as he hit a ceiling shot. I ran back, hit a terrible shot, but it made it to the front wall. (If you hit a shot that hits the floor before hitting the front wall, that is called a skip and I'm serving so it would be side out, and Cliff would serve the ball.) Cliff hit a shot and I killed it hard and low. I got a point! I-0. I served the ball as a lob serve, which is a high serve that has the same rules as short and long serve. The serve hit off the side wall as Cliff hit it as hard as he could and all that I saw and heard was a high pitched ringing sound and a blur go past me as I look at Cliff as though he had missed it. He went up to the service line and hit a lob serve, as it hit the side wall, it bounced once, then it went way up in the air and I hit a very good kill shot. Cliff got the ball with ease and hit it back to me. I killed the ball again, then he killed it, and I could not get to it. I-I. He served another lob serve, right on the wall which racquetball players call wall-paper, it hit the back wall and fell straight down. Whiff! I missed it. 2-1. He then served a drive serve. Whiff! I missed another one. 3-1.

Cliff served a lob serve which hit the side wall and I hit it as hard as I possibly could and Cliff got it again. He hit a ceiling shot to me as he anticipated that I would do the same. He guessed wrong. I've practiced this shot a lot, I lined up to pretend to hit a ceiling shot, took a swing like a tennis player would on a serve, and I hit a perfect shot. The ball almost rolled out. Cliff turned around at me, gave me a dirty look and said, "Who hit that?" I just smiled and walked up to the service box where I scored four more points in a row. 5-3. Six more points until I win.



The next day when my dad came home, he got a picture of me and Cliff Swain standing together. My dad said that there was going to be a pro tournament up at a different club and he said to bring the picture with to get autographed. When we finally arrived at the other club, I saw Cliff Swain playing. Travel League Update



This past year we had 38 teams representing 21 different clubs participate in the League. We have had inquires from a number of new clubs for next year and we hope that we can expand the roster even further for the 2000-2001 season. The USRA recognized the ISRA as having the longest and most successful travel team league in the country. ISRA President, Laurel Davis, gave an impromptu description of the league at this past year's leadership conference in Colorado Springs and the talk was highlighted on the USRA newsletter that goes out to all racquetball state presidents.

The captain's meeting for the 2000-2001 season will be held on Tuesday, August 29, 2000 at 7:00pm at the Glass Court in Lombard. Any team that wants to participate in the league must (to the extent possible) have a representative present. Please call Pam Grace (630 462 0244) if you cannot attend. We are actively looking to increase participation. Therefore, any team that brings in a new club to participate will receive a reward from the ISRA. The tentative starting date for the league will be the first week of October.

Last year's league had 12 teams in Men's Open/A with 6 teams playing in the South league: Naper Olympic, Silver Lakes, Westmont, Palos Olympic, Campus Fitness and Chalet and 6 in the North league: two teams from Glass Court and Bloomingdale, one team from Schaumburg and Southlake.
