The RAM State Doubles was contested over the first weekend in December once again. This year, the event moved to the beautiful **Michigan Athletic Club** in East Lansing. This is one of the great clubs in the nation and last summer, the MAC hosted the USAR Junior National Championships. If it's good enough for the best Juniors in the nation, it must be good enough for us. This event is one of the highlights in the Michigan schedule and this year's event did not disappoint. It featured great play, great hospitality, and a great club. Sounds like the only place to be.

The ladies divisions had a good showing with five teams in each, plenty to put on some great competition. The Women's Open Championship went to **Paula Saad** and **Tia Lecland** who defeated **Michele Geile** and **Laura Johnson** in the finals. This was Tia's first run at Open, and she showed just how far she has come in a short time as she held her own all weekend.

Michele and Laura upset former National Champs Claire Kruse and Sandy White in the Semis and Paula and Tia defeated Laura Patterson and Melody Gorno.

The Womens 40+ Championship went to **Chris Todd** and **Maureen Price** after they defeated **Laura Patterson** and **Melody Gorno**. The teams of Claire Kruse and Sandy White and Michele Geile and Laura Johnson finished in the Semis.

The Mixed Open Doubles was quite a battle as **Paula Saad** and **Greg Lewerenz** defeated **Karen Kronmeyer** and **Mike Anderson** to win the Championship. Paula and Greg are

becoming perennial favorites, and Mike is always a threat, but Karen is new to racquetball after transitioning from being an internationally-ranked squash player. Not bad for her first tournament. The teams of Maureen Price and Steve Price and Terry Fields and Ron Barton made it to the semis.

Ruth Beier and **Steve Gruber** took the Mixed A/B Championship by defeating **Mercedes Arias** and **Lucas Arias**. The teams of Christina Neros and Dan Mullin and Chris Todd and Allen Militich rounded out the semis.

This year marked the first time we offered a Junior/Veteran Division. The genesis was a father/son division, but not everyone has a father who plays, and not everyone who plays is a son. Not to mention many other permutations. The inaugural event drew five teams. And oddly enough, the eventual Champions were Lucas and Ed Arias – a well-known father and son combination. They defeated Brad Schopieray and Dave Chirio in the Final. The teams of Kevin White and Tom Blakeslee and Bryan and Don Schopieray rounded out the semis. Considering all of the smiles and laughter during these matches, I'd say this division was a big success.

The Mens Open division has seen a number of new teams win in the past few years, with no team returning to defend its title. This year was no different. Mike Anderson and Shannon Kohl teamed up for their first run at the title. At the end of the weekend, this was the first State Championship for either of them after defeating **Ron Barton** and **Greg Lewerenz**. The teams of Mark Werthman

MICHIGAN CROWNS TWO US OPEN NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

Another November, another US Open. Racquetball's first Grand Slam event continues to get bigger and better each year with Doug Ganim, Jim Hiser and USA Racquetball helping bring the sport to greater heights. This year over 729 professionals and amateurs came to Memphis for fun, racquetball and the chance to be crowned US Open Champion. This year 26 players made the trip from Michigan. Team Michigan took home 10 medals and crowned two new US Open Champions.

Leading the pack for Team Michigan was **Mr. David Lund**. Mr. Lund has become a top-ranked player in the 70+ Open Division and is a threat to win any tournament he enters. This event was no exception. Mr. Lund made it through a tough draw of 11 players to win another US Open Championship.

Another repeat winner, **Tia Lecland** has made great strides in her short time on the racquetball scene. She is also a threat to win any event she enters. Tia took on a tough Women's C Division and came out on top.

Congratulations to our new US Open Champions.

Twayne Howard was Michigan's only double medalist. He finished as a runner up in the Mens 35+B Division and a semi-finalist in the Mens 25+B Division. In the end lack of tournament play and fitness did him in.

Karen Green moved in to the Womens 50+ Division and knew it would be a challenge. Karen lost in a close final to perennial favorite, and former Michigander, Linda Moore. Linda commented that Karen had her worried, and was impressed with her run.

Sharon Huczek continued her world-class play in Memphis. She was runner-up in the Womens 55+A Division. Another great trip to the Open.

Dale Graham has been a regular in big tournaments in recent years. In Memphis, Dale made it to the semis in the Mens 60+ Division.

Pete Harvey is another staple in Houston and Memphis. Pete finished in the semi-finals in the Mens 55+B Division.

Lindsey Anderson made her final trip to Memphis for a couple years. Our Lindsey is off to the Air Force. She made her temporary swan song in the Womens 24-C Division where she finished in the semis.

A big reason the US Open is so popular is it features the best Pro draws in the world. Not only are they large, but they are deep with the best racquetball players from all over the world challenging for the title, the check and the cup. Jack Huczek was undefeated in full IRT Pro Stops this season, his only loss coming in Grand Rapids. Jack has had a fantastic season and was the run away favorite to win his first US Open. But, yet again, Jack had to settle for a semi-final finish after a tough, five game loss to Jason Mannino. This was one of the great matches in US Open history and a crowd of nearly 1000 will never forget. In the final on Sunday, Jason took out Rocky Caron to earn his second US Open title.

I say it every year, but this is a great trip and a great event. It is the best racquetball to watch and to play and the best socializing to be found. Why don't you plan now to join us next year?



For the third time, Pro racquetball made its return to the MAC in Grand Rapids. The only Pro tournament in Michigan featured World Champion, Jack Huczek from Rochester Hills, who made the return trip to defend his back-to-back titles. Facing Jack in the Pro Draw was World # 7, Shane Vanderson from Florida and other players, both local and from as far away as Ontario Canada. Would Jack be able to defend his title? Only one way to find out. But first, the other divisions. This year 83 players came out to try their hand and vie for the Championship. As always, junior and amateur play was a huge part of the event.

This was the inaugural event in the Junior Fantastic Four series, so we had quite a few juniors strutting their stuff. In the Juniors Advanced Division, **Lucas Arias** continued his improvement and upset Brad Schopieray to take the Championship. Bryan Schopieray and Matt Barbuscak were the semi finalists.

Mercedes Arias moved to the Juniors Intermediate Division after defeating her doubles partner, Ines Lecland. Mercedes and Ines got past Kayla Reidt and Zachary D'Almeida to make the Finals. Look for other Junior Fantastic Four events in the upcoming season.

Dave Bushen won the Mens 40+A Championship by defeating Ron Griggs in the Finals. Dave and Ron defeated Mark Reed and Dennis Howell in the semis.

The Mens 45+ B Division went to **Dave Chirio** who defeated Tim Cosby to win the title. Bryan Galloway and Jeff Tloczynski made it to the semis.

The Mens 55+ Championship went to **Ric Scott** who defeated Bob Gravelyn to win the final. Al Mell and Charlie Curtis rounded out the semis.

The Mens Open Doubles Championship went to the team of **Scott Goudie** and **Jason Gorski** who defeated the teams Ken Bonnett and Charlie Curtis and Brad Schopieary and Lewis Forrest.

The Mens A Doubles Champions were **Bob Gravelyn** and **Rick Vrosh** who defeated Dave Chirio and Ron Griggs in the final. Scott Glass and Tom Ford and Dave Bushen and Gary Balavitch were the semi-finalist teams.

Mike Malcolm and **Bryan Galloway** teamed to defeat Chris Garner and Dan Mullin to win the Mens B Doubles Division. Jason Carroll and Twayne Howard and Art Murphy and Jeff Simonis were the semi-finalists.

The team of **Matt Barbuscak** and **Matthew Barbuscak** won the Round Robin Mens C Doubles Division. Rich Westerbrink and Joe Reidt took second, and Jim Pike and Dan Quarry rounded out the field.

And now to the big show. The Mens Pro Division featured eight players ranked on the International Racquetball Tour. The top seed was World #1 **Jack Huczek** who has more titles than most beaches have grains of sand. Or, at least, a comparable number. The second seed went to #7 Shane Vanderson. #10 Andy Hawthorne was the third seed and Canada's Eric Desrochers rounded out the top 4. Shannon Kohl, Joel Bonnett, Mike Anderson and Jason Gorski were the locals seeded 5 through 8.

While Jack and Shane advanced easily into the Semis, the other two matches had some drama. Joel Bonnett, the most accomplished local player took a game from Andy before going down in the fourth game. In the

other Quarter, there actually wasn't much drama, either as Shannon dominated Eric. Shannon played great racquetball and took advantage of the fact Eric hasn't had much court time due to school obligations. This one went by in three fast games. The semis went quickly as well and only Shannon was able to score 10 points, total, in the match.

Championship Sunday featured the match that everyone had anticipated. The #1 and #7 Pros on tour, Jack and Shane have played dozens of times over the years with Jack holding a significant advantage in the record. Game one went according to "chalk" as Jack eased out an 11-6 win and it looked like the route was on. Shane came back and won Game 2 11-7 as he seemed to catch Jack a bit unawares. Game 3 was a classic nail-biter before Shane pulled it out to win 12-10. In Game 4 Jack seemed to regain his edge as he won a close one 11-9.

Everyone expected the Michigander to pull out Game 5, but it was not

to be. Shane took control from the first rally and closed out the match 11-6. This was by far the best match at the MAC since the last full Pro stop in the 1980s. The crowd left buzzing about what they had just witnessed as Jack lost his first match all season in a stunning upset.

The event was run as a benefit for Children's Miracle Network / DeVos Children's Hospital. We would like to thank all of the sponsors who made this possible. Without their
