MICHIGAN CROWNS NEW CHAMPIONS AT THE STATE DOUBLES TOURNEY

As always Michigan players flock to this tournament for the great club, the great competition and the chance to be a State Champion.

In 2004, the Men's Open Division crowned a new pair of champions as **Jeff Mullins** and **George Yarbenet** got past Mike Anderson and Paul Stanwick in a tough tie-breaker. This was the first state championship for both players. Lewis Forrest/Brad McIlhargie and Ron Barton/John Torres were the semi-finalists.

The Woman's Open Championship went to Claire Kruse and Sandy White over Diana Easthope and Melody Gorno. This was also a first time championship for this team. Jan Insko /Christine Todd and Stacey Barbas/Paula Saad completed the semi-finals.

Another first time pairing of **Ron Barton** and **Paula Saad** defeated Rich Torres/Melody Gorno and Mike Anderson/Lindsay Anderson to win the Mixed Open Championship. Thus completing the Open division sweep by new team pairings.

February is another busy month with tournaments in Davison at the Davison Athletic Club, in Mt.Clemens at Total Sports, and in Lansing at the Michigan Athletic Club. March wraps up with tournaments in Warren at Players Athletic Club, a Ladies Only tournament at Genesys Athletic Club in Grand Blanc and at the Grand Rapids MAC. All of this leads us up to the State Singles Championships at the Coliseum in Taylor.

MICHIGAN CROWNS THREE NATIONAL CHAMPS AT THE US OPEN IN MEMPHIS

Each year as Thanksgiving draws near, the attention of the racquetball world turns to Memphis, Tennessee and the US Open Racquetball Championship. This year twenty-four members of Team Michigan made the trip to prove themselves against some of the best racquetball players in the world.

Tia Lecland made her first trip to Memphis, and it is one that she won't soon forget. After nearly a week of tough competition, Tia was Michigan's most accomplished competitor as she brought home a Gold Medal in the Women's D Division, and a Silver Medal in the Women's 35+45+C Division. I would call this a very successful trip.

One of Tia's coaches also did quite well herself. **Karen Green** earned the Gold Medal in the Women's 45+/55+A Division as well making the Semi-Finals in the Women's 45+ Division. Karen is making a habit of taking home Gold in the biggest tournaments.

Jeff Johnson earned Gold in the Men's 25+B Division. This follows up Jeff's National Championship from a few season back. Apparently, Michigan is growing a new crop of "big game" players. Congratulations to our newest US Open Champions!!!

Another double-medalist was **John Trendell** who earned a Silver Medal in the Men's 25+B Division after falling to Jeff Johnson. John also made the semi-finals in the Men's B Doubles Division with his partner **Andre Roy**.

Lindsay Anderson, another newcomer, took home the Silver Medal in the Women's D Division finishing just behind Tia Lecland. Lindsay has been working very hard over the last year, and clearly it is paying off.

Veteran **David Lund** also took home a Silver Medal in the Men's 65+ Division. This will go well with the Gold he earned in this division a few years ago. This is always a tough division and to medal in it twice is more than impressive.



JUNIOR'S CORNER.

Team Michigan Junior Racquetball has been growing. Several of the Team Michigan Juniors have been earning a higher skill level by testing with their racquetball director.

To review, at the State Singles and the State Doubles tournaments Team Michigan Junior Racquetball players who have earned either a red, blue or gold T-Shirt will receive them if they have completed their testing prior to these tournaments. Please have the person who administered the testing notify Karen Green at 248-663-0175 if a skill level has been passed so we can order the appropriate shirt color for the junior player.

Again, all juniors wishing to test should do so with their club racquetball director. If a junior does not have a club racquetball director, another AmPro certified racquetball player should administer the test. If there is no racquetball director or AmPro certified player, the junior may make arrangements to test with another racquetball director at a different club, at a tournament or at the State Singles or State Doubles Tournament. It is preferable to test when a tournament is not in session due to the limited availability of court space. First time junior players participating in either the State Singles or the State Doubles will receive a white, introductory level, Team Michigan Junior Racquetball player T-Shirt.

There is no charge for testing for a particular level for the first time during a playing season. If a player tests for a particular level and does not pass, a \$10.00 fee will be assessed for each additional test administered during a playing season. The \$10.00 fee should be forwarded to the State Racquetball Association. This policy is to encourage players to test when they are sure they are ready to pass a particular level.

All players who pass the Gold Level skill testing must also pass the referee certification test. As always, if there are any questions, please call Karen Green at 248-663-0175.



Used for the first time during Spartan Splat last October, the pagers kept tournament play running smoothly and on time. No more waiting hours past scheduled start times. As players registered, they were handed individual pagers and told to listen for their call. Players carried their pagers in their pockets or clipped to their bags as they roamed the MAC waiting for the next available court. Players even playfully whined when, in earshot of the desk, they were called to court by voice rather than being paged!

The tabletop transmitting unit is capable of up to a two mile range and had ample power to reach players anywhere in the MAC, including the restaurant or locker rooms. Though we can only dream of needing this amount, the tabletop unit can handle over 200 pagers at one time.
