DAVISON SET TO HOST THE RED SWAIN SHOOTOUT IRT EVENT

The Davison Athletic Club will once again be host to the best racquetball players on the planet this season. The Red Swain Shootout an IRT Tier 1 tournament is set to start October 27th and run thru the 30th, it marks the first time the pros have been back to the club since 1993 and sets up to be one of the best stops on tour. Players will have an array of entry options including several VIP packages, some having the Pro Am doubles event where amateur players are partnered with the top 16 pros, and others with an exclusive clinic hosted by tournament co -director Cliff Swain and one other "surprise" guest instructor. Juniors will receive special entry pricing and be used as towel kids for all of the pro matches, lady players will also receive special entry pricing for this tournament.

This tournament is named after Cliff's father who passed away from ALS, and will feature a different type of fundraiser. Benefiting the Angel Fund, a group dedicated to ALS patient care, the first annual "Angel Fund most popular player" fundraiser will be happening all weekend. Eight players have agreed to participate by donating game used racquets that will be autographed. During the weekend tickets will be available for purchase and used to "vote" for the most popular player by placing them into players bin. The player with the most tickets

will be named the most popular. A ticket will be drawn from each of the bins with the

winner receiving that players racquet. Eight racquets will be given away and the competition to become the most popular player should be as intense as the play on the court.

Mark it on your calendar, this will prove to be the premier event on Michigan's schedule this year, more than 250 players from around the country are expected to make the trip. The last weekend of June, 2011 brought the Meijer State Games of Michigan back to West Michigan and this year it was even bigger and better. The event was held for the second year and filled to the brim with great sports drawn to this Olympic-style event. The State Games swelled to twenty four events with over 4,000 participants playing at dozens of locations in West Michigan. New additions including Archery, Golf and even Pickleball.

The greatest aspect of being included in the State Games is that thousands of people get to hear about Racquetball tournaments that might usually not hear about us. Each year, the State Games has brought out a number of first time tournament players. This year we had 9 first time tournament players. It's great exposure for Racquetball and happens to be a great tournament as well. Each division featured round robin or consolation play as well as Gold, Silver and Bronze medals in each division culminated by a full Medal ceremony with Olympic Fanfare. We got most of the play done on Saturday and players were free to enjoy the Saturday night party at Craig's Cruisers.

The weekend kicked off Friday night with the Opening Ceremonies at Fifth Third Ballpark. The coaches used the torch to light a flaming arrow, which was shot by one of the competitors to light the State Games Cauldron – the official opening of the Games. What a memorable sight as the flame jumped from the cauldron, fireworks filled the air and the thousands gathered exploded in applause.

And all of that was before we hit the courts. But, that's the reason we all signed up, so let's get straight to the action. In the Men's 25+B John Lager defeated Brandon Zeigler and Brian Richards to take the Gold. Brandon won the Silver and Brian won the Bronze.

Willie Lowe won the Gold in the Men's 35+C Division. Richard Dunnebeck took the Silver and Damon Stevens won the Bronze.

The Men's 40+ Open Division went to Twayne Howard unchallenged.

Rich Westerbrink won his first Gold in the Men's 45+B Division. He edged out Silver Medalist Art Murphy and Bronze Medalist James Hemenway.

Jim Kutt won the Gold in the Men's 55+ Open Division in a great match against Chuck Van Hoose who had to settle for a

Silver Medal.

Chuck Van Hoose won the Gold in the Men's 60+ Open Championship unchallenged.

Court Warrior Art Murphy overcame a split lip to win the Gold in the Men's 65+ Open Division. Richard Dunnebeck won the Silver Medal and Tom Sharum earned the Bronze Medal.

Art Murphy also won the Gold Medal in the Men's 35+B Division. Tom Granse won the Silver and Jim McGowan won the Bronze.

Damon Stevens won the Men's D Gold unchallenged.

Willie Lowe went Double-Gold by winning the Men's C championship over Silver Medalist Damon Stevens and Bronze Medalist Brian Tomanek.

John Lager eased through the draw to win Gold in the Men's B Division. Jeff Tloczynski took home the Silver and Matt Smith won the Bronze. Thanks to Jeff and Matt who took most of the day off from fishing to compete.

The Men's B Consolation Gold went to Jim McGowan who defeated Silver-Medalist James Hemenway. Brandon Zeigler earned the Bronze.

JUNIOR TEAM MICHIGAN TAKE ANOTHER TOP TEN FINISH AT JUNIOR NATIONALS

More than 160 of the top Junior Players from 29 different states came to Portland Oregon for the 38th annual Junior Olympic Championships. This is the USA team qualifying tournament and as you could expect the level of play was phenomenal. Michigan had four players compete this year.

Mercedes Arias represented the ladies and was once again a National Champion. Mercedes and partner Kelani Bailey of Virginia won the girls U16 doubles event which qualified them to participate in the Junior World Championships. Mercedes also finished 3rd in singles.

Braeden D'almeida scored his first gold medal of the tournament winning the boys U12 red division, he easily defeated Alabama's Quade Howell in two games. This was by far Braeden's best tournament performance and will no doubt help him as he becomes more experienced in the Championship environment.

Brad Schopieray scored a second place finish in boys U18 doubles with California partner Jose Diaz, they were the number 1 seeded team in the tournament but were no match for the team of Nick Montalbano and Josh Hungerford losing in the final 15-8 and 15-5. Brad followed that performance up with a 4th place finish in boys U18 singles. Both Brad and Jose will move on to full time professional status next season.

Matt Barbuscak played his last junior National tournament this year. Finishing his freshman year at Penn State University, matt has already become a regular winner in ECRC Intercollegiate play. Matt had the toughest draws of all the kids from Michigan and while he scored much needed points for the team Matt fell victim to losing rounds at the wrong time. Matt will now focus on studies and racquetball on the collegiate level, Matt has always shown great attitude on and off the court and will certainly be missed on the team, we wish him well in this next phase of his racquetball career.

In the end Michigan was once again able to squeak out another top ten finishing 9th overall, without the help and contributions of tournament directors Scott Sellers and Mike Chambon, who held fundraising efforts at their events, everyone who purchased a raffle ticket for our drawings, and the RAM Board of directors, we would not be able to provide the type of program we do for our Juniors. Thanks again for all your support and we will be back next year to try it again!
