AARA ANNOUNCES DUES INCREASE FOR 1990-91

The AARA has announced the first membership dues increase in the past eight years. Effective January 1, 1991, membership to the AARA and RAM will be \$15.00 per year. Membership in RAM and AARA includes six issues of RAM's newsletter, "The Racquetball Reporter" and six issues of AARA's newsletter, "Racquetball USA." It also includes a membership card, rulebook, travel and some equipment discounts and sanctioned tournament entry forms mailed to your home.

The new benefit added to the membership will be plans for health insurance coverage at sanctioned events for all RAM/AARA members. This coverage will include \$10,000 Accidental Death/Dismemberment; \$25,000 Medical, Excess; and a \$250 Deductible. This policy is designed only for injuries which occur during competition, it is not designed for sickness.

This new benefit will be available to all players who join after January 1, 1991 Players who join between December 10 and December 31, 1990 will pay \$10, but their memberships will only be good until June 30, 1991 and will

include the insurance benefit. Any current member who wishes to add the insurance benefit to his existing membership may do so, by completing a membership form and paying an additional \$5. This is called adding a competitive license to your membership. If your current membership is a multi-year, you must purchase a competitive license for each year of your membership. Existing members who do not purchase a competitive license will not be covered by the insurance policy until they renew their memberships.

CERTIFIED RACQUETBALL REFEREES

People are always asking me how do they become a certified racquetball referee Basically the requirements are that you have to be an AARA member in good standing, have to referee a minimum of 10 matches at Level 2 AARA sanctioned tournaments, have to attend a rules/referee clinic and you have to take the referee certification exam and score 85% or higher.

There are three different levels of certification for referees.

Level I - You met all of the qualifications above, including scoring 85% on the exam. Scoring 85% on the exam means you got 85 out of 100 questions right. Therefore you are now qualified to referee at a Level 2 tournament A Level I referee should be able to referee any match within his/her state.

Level II - You met all the qualifications above, and you scored 90% on the exam. Scoring 90% on the exam means you got 90 out of the 100 questions right Therefore you are now qualified to referee any match at a Level 3 or Level 4 tournament. A Level II referee should be able to referee any match at a regional tournament

Level III - You met all the qualifications above, and you scored 96% on the exam. Scoring 96% on the exam means you got 96 out of the 100 questions right. Therefore you are now qualified to referee any match at a Level 5 or Level 6 tournament ALevel III referee should be able to referee any match at the Nationals, at a Pro-stop or the World Games. That person should be able to referee ANY MATCH, ANY-WHERE.

A rules/referee clinic is a lecture and question and answer session, usually lasting about 2-3 hours. This clinic deals with the interpretation of the rules, any new rules and any unique rules or situations. It also deals with all sorts of refereeing situations and how to handle them.

A referee Certification Exam is a 100 question multiple choice test that deals with all kinds of rule interpretations and referee situations. The Exam usually takes about 2 hours.

There will be a Rules/Referee Clinic and a Referee Certification Examination at the Oak Park YMCA in Lansing on Saturday, January 19, 1991. The Rules/Referee Clinic will start at 9:00 am and will run until 12:00 noon. The Referee Certification Examination will then start at 1:30 pm and last until 3:30 pm. The cost is \$10 for either the Rules/ Referee Clinic or the Referee Certification Exam of \$15 to attend both on the same day.
