## FROM THE PRESIDENT

### AARA LEADERSHIP SEMINAR

Each January, the AARA National Office in Colorado Springs hosts a leadership seminar at the Olympic Training Center, for the benefit of state directors. Lori Kaiser and I attended the three day meeting, and we found the seminar to be constructive, and motivating. Attendees stay and eat free at the Training Center Dormitories, and AARA rebates \$100 of the airline fare.

WHO WAS THERE? - Forty nine state officers, the Canadian Racquetball President and Executive Director, six manufacturers' reps, plus most of the National Office staff.

#### • HIGHLIGHTS •

The program began with a fine keynote address by Dr. Gary Walton, Professor of Economics, University of California (Berkeley). Despite his economics background, Dr. Walton is a nationally recognized authority on motivational science, and the role of athletics, coaches and leaders in character development. He is the author of *Beyond Winning*, which I highly recommend.

Product line managers from the top racquetball manufacturers (most of whom stayed for the entire conference) cited new products and plans for the 1995 - 1996 season. Each manufacturer intends to devote effort toward areas of special emphasis, and it appears that all segments of racquetball will enjoy solid support. Key, specific remarks included:

- Rob Ahrens Dorf, EKTELON - Both tennis (Prince) and racquetball sales are flat, but they are optimistic about 1995. Ektelon's sponsored players must promote racquetball or they will be dropped.
- John Hooghe, TRANSITION - Aiming for grass roots and beginning players young and old. Transition is now official racquet of AARA.
- Amy Wishingrad, PENN- 1994 sales down 20% from 1990. Penn will continue to consolidate sales staff. Green "Pro" ball now International Racquetball Tour (IRT) standard. Penn will continue the AARA tournament ball program (see article inside).
- Jeff Miller, SPALDING - Spalding will continue introduction of new products, and is optimistic about future growth.
- John Weaver PROKENNEX - ProKennex is rebuilding. Now publishes IRT News. ProKennex donated one top-of-the-line racquet to every state organization for evaluation and fund-raising (ISRA has donated it for a raffle benefiting charity). The company now offers a ball, and will be awarding cash rebates to state junior development programs. Also, look for a "trade in your racquet" promotion in the near future.
- Teri Graham, WILSON - Wilson now sponsors ACRA and national skill level championships. Illinois' Lynn Adams will head up college development. Current sales are double their forecasts.

Then we got down to business. Four groups rotated between four, 1 1/4 hour work stations, and discussed many important issues. Briefly summarized, key topics were:

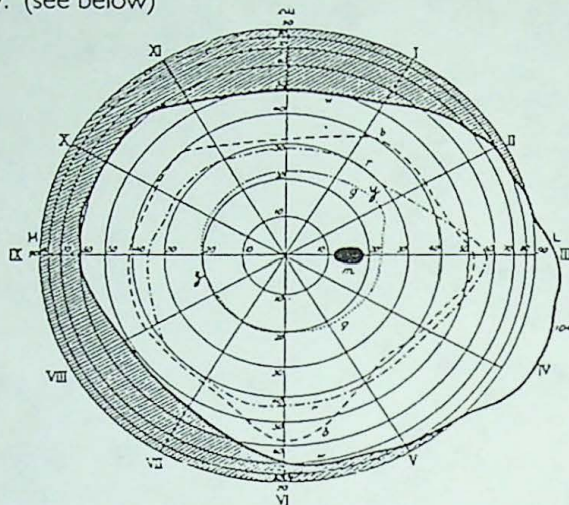


FIG. 504. Showing the color fields of the human retina mapped by means of the perimeter (chap. 77). (After Hartridge). When with the eyes of the subject looking straight ahead a colored patch (green, yellow, red or blue) is moved peripherally in the different meridians of the visual field the sensation of green is the first to be lost, next yellow, then red, and finally blue.

## KEN DILLER - NEW EKTELON REP

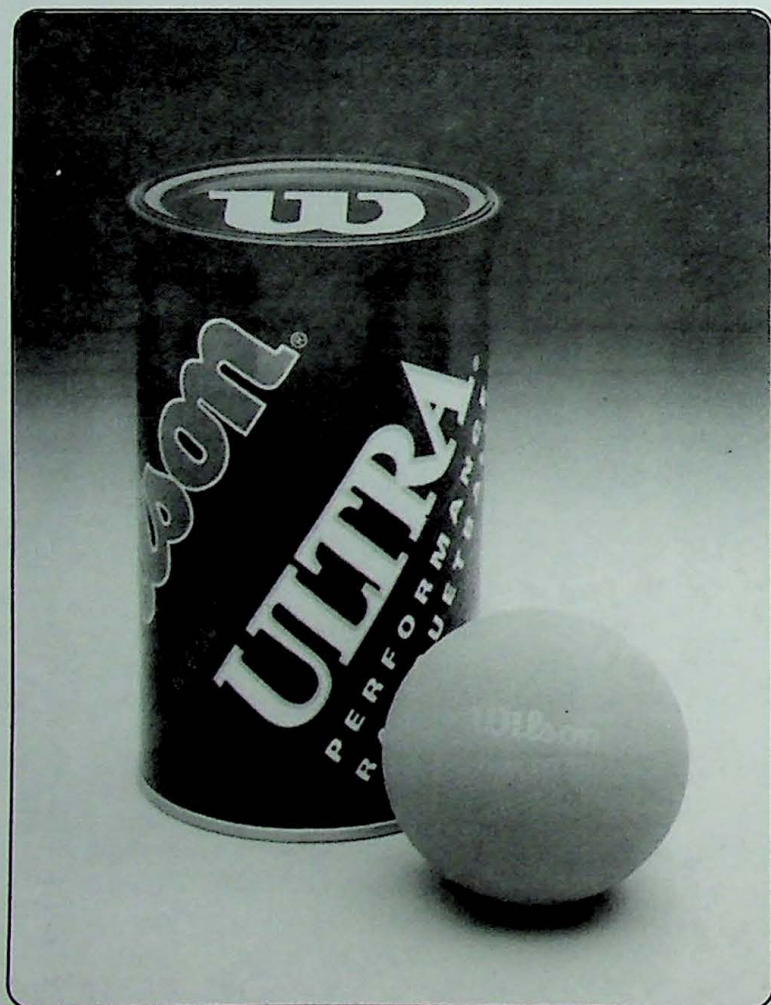

■ **Governance & Liability** (Luke St. Onge, AARA Executive Director and Kevin Joyce, Membership Director).

Discussed litigation trends, eliminating and/or transferring risk of tournament accidents. The ISRA will consider buying Officers and Directors Liability.

Any appearance of conflict of interest by Board Members must be avoided. Sponsored players, or anyone having a club ownership interest must abstain from voting on any issue presenting even a potential conflict of interest. ISRA will develop a Statement of Ethics And Conflict of Interest from the AARA model.

■ **Sponsorship and Fundraising** (Mike Arnolt - AARA V.P. & Paula Sperling - World Seniors Organizer)

How to better solicit product and cash from non-athletic sponsors, developing contributions, raffles, bid packages, what sponsors expect, obtaining grants (fundraising).

■ **Tournaments and Sanctioning** - (Jim Hiser -AARA Associate Executive Director) All tournaments should have available first aid and CPR trained people. Any player who is not an AARA member presents potentially worse liability than a member i.e. competitive license, insurance coverage. AARA club liability insurance program may not cover a player unless he/she was an AARA member at the time of accident.

■ **Newsletters** - (Linda Mojer, Editor *Racquetball Magazine*, and David Seick, Adv. Manager)

How to enhance the state newsletter, advertising and management techniques.

## KEY GENERAL TOPICS

### 1996 Regional Reorganization.

The AARA wants to establish first weekend in March as permanent date for all future regional tournaments. No sanctioned tournaments would be allowed within 300 miles of a regional site. This issue was recommended months ago by AARA Executive Board, but voting was delayed pending states' input at this seminar. Several states have voiced vigorous opposition, citing conflicts with charity events, and state tournaments.

The issue is not whether a permanent date is a good idea, *rather when*. A permanent date would greatly help in acquiring a major, national sponsor, and introduce a consistency to regionals a la National Singles. The major "con" is that several states, Illinois included, would have to hold State Singles after

regionals (perhaps too late) or at least two weeks earlier (perhaps too early).

Most protests came from snow states still tied to the seasonal idea of "state-singles-ends-the-season". We voiced Illinois' position that regionals might be better served in late March, after Easter, but we agree that a permanent date is critically important to sponsorship and exposure, and AARA should decide what is best, then the states work around it.

### Tournament Reporting Compliance

AARA cash flow is dependant on memberships, and they are continually hurt by a few states who fail to send membership dues. Yes, some states actually sell "AARA" memberships, then keep all the money, so the member never receives insurance, or *Racquetball Magazine*.

Nationwide, AARA membership is down from 1992, about 25% (Illinois is down 12%). It is partially attributable to less activity, but the majority is due to tournament players evading membership dues. It has become a widespread issue. Everyone at the conference was impressed by Illinois' pre-season newsletter warnings, our computer cross check capabilities, and efforts to tighten up on check in procedures. There was a uniform, strong sentiment that deliberate evasion of dues is grounds for disciplinary action.

We toured the AARA offices., and got acquainted with all the staff. AARA occupies most of a two story "L" shaped building having about 12 offices on two floors. A nicely appointed atrium entrance showcases AARA awards.

AARA is very well organized, and all the staff members are efficient, helpful and dedicated to assisting individual state organizations. The visit will certainly enhance the ISRA's ability to serve Illinois members.

# 1995 REVIE SOREY CELEBRITY CLASSIC

The 1995 Revie Sorey Celebrity Classic was held January 13 - 15, at the Glass Court in Lombard, and Hillside Racquet Club in Hillside, Illinois. 385 entries from eight states and Canada, enjoyed tough competition, traditional Revie Sorey hospitality, and the Saturday night auction and party.

The Men's Open final pitted Tim Sweeney's 185 mph serves against the professional consistency and expertise of Canada's Mike Ceresia. Sweens prevailed (score) as Revie commented from the glass court. In the Women's Open finals (with Cheryl Gudinas notably absent at a pro stop) it was Kim Macharin of St. Louis, MI., defeating Val Springer of Grand Rapids, MI, in a grueling tie breaker.

## CAN YOU GET FIT PLAYING RACQUETBALL?

Racquetball may be played at a high level of intensity, but can it qualify as a good fitness activity? The answer lies in how well you play the game. Nevertheless, at any skill level, it is important to supplement racquetball with other "aerobic" activities in order to achieve a sound level of fitness.

Fitness may be defined in terms of agility, strength, flexibility or aerobic conditioning. While all are important, the benefits of aerobic fitness far exceed any others. These include: lowered risk of heart disease, weight maintenance through a more efficient metabolism (even at rest), and greater overall tone and energy.

Racquetball is classified as an "anaerobic" sport. It is played in spurts. The heart rate may be increased, but the level cannot be sustained long enough to obtain the cardiovascular benefits associated with sports like jogging or swimming. True aerobic benefits are possible for the highly skilled player who is able to maintain a high overall intensity level throughout a match. Although the heart rate drops after each rally, the average rate will remain at a level which elicits an aerobic training effect.

No matter what your playing level, it is possible to gain a limited aerobic training effect. This can be done by slowing the game with balls that are less lively, leading to longer rallies, and thus, more continuous play. It is also important to seek opponents of the same ability level in order to lengthen the rallies.

Should you play racquetball to condition, or condition to play racquetball? The latter is suggested for two reasons. Aerobic benefits may be marginal until you reach a high level of play. Secondly, muscles trained through endurance or aerobic work-outs do not succumb to fatigue and injury as readily. Even top ranked pros condition regularly in order to avoid injury, and increase their staying power for consecutive matches.

Aerobic activities are generally defined as those which utilize major muscles groups and lead to continuous movement. Activities such as cycling, swimming or jogging should be performed a minimum of three times per week for a period of 20 minutes or more in order to achieve a fitness training effect.

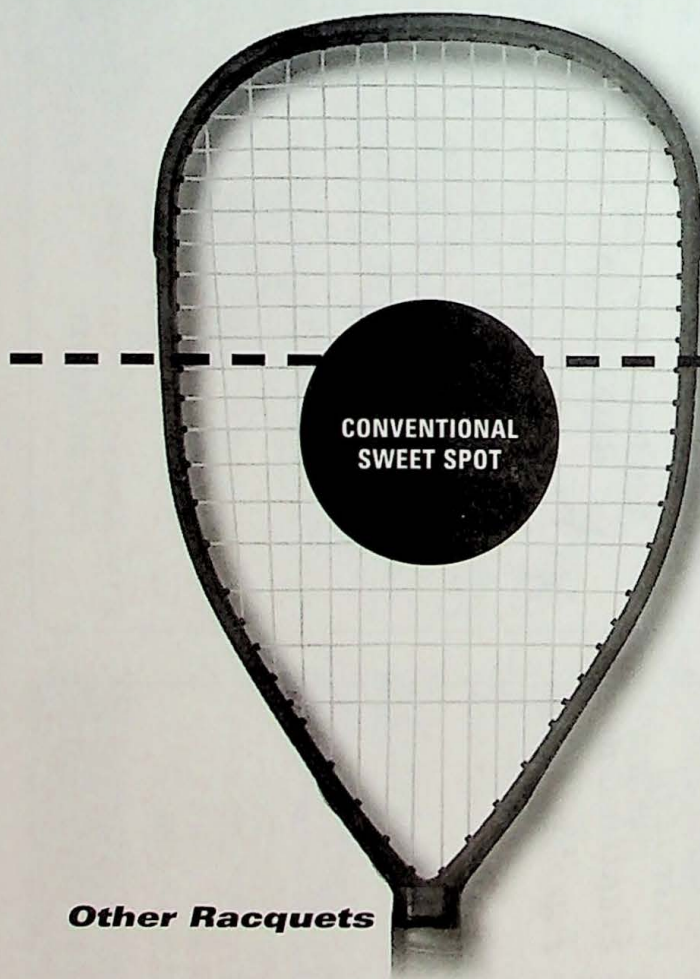
