## TO ALL MICHIGAN RACQUETBALL PLAYERS:

Even though the state singles tournament is just concluded, there are an abundance of events coming your way this spring. Also, there are some developments you will find most interesting and worthwhile. Turn the page for details, sites and dates.

The biggest breakthrough made by the Michigan Racquetball Association this year is our computer ranking system. Each of you who have participated in sanctioned tournaments have helped make this possible. Also, a big thank you goes out to Denny Wood who was largely responsible for it and gave it the needed push to get it rolling. The rankings and how they work follow:

### THE MICHIGAN RATING SYSTEM

Each player is initially assigned a rating according to their skill, based either on prior tournament performance or with other rated players. A person's rating fluctuates according to the outcome of their match. Using the illustrated table, let's go through a few examples. Give John a rating of 1910 and Bill a 1890 rating. The difference in points is 20, which falls in the first category. If John won, he would gain 8 points; and Bill would lose 8 points. If Bill won, he would gain 8, and John would lose 8. Now, let's give John a rating of 1965 and leave Bill at 1890. The difference is now 75 points, the third category. If John won, he gains 5, Bill loses 5. If John lost, he loses 12 and Bill gains 12. As the rating point spread gets bigger, the player who should win gains less and the other player loses less. But if an upset occurs, the player who should win loses a greater amount of points and the other player increases the same amount to his rating. A running total is kept for all matches a person plays, and a net gain or loss is then figured to his existing rating, and a new rating is then established to be used in the next tournament. All ratings used in calculations are based on the exiting rating going into the tournament. In other words, a rating used to calculate a person's first match is the same rating used in his last match.

"C" players Seniors and Masters are only on the mailing list. Due to the expense of the rating system, there are not enough Seniors or Masters to justify the cost, and 95% of the "C" players are from the host club area and do not travel around to other tournaments. The top four players in the "C" Class will receive a rating of 1600 points.

## Annual Racquetball Awards

A traveling trophy will be given annually to the individual who most represents the spirit of "good sportsmanship" in Michigan racquetball. The trophy inscription reads ... "Awarded In Honor To The Person Who Most Represents The Ideal of Good Sportsmanship Under Extreme Competitive Conditions." The winner will keep the trophy for the following year, relinquishing it to the new recipient at the State Singles tournament. Ten individuals will be nominated for the award by the Michigan Racquetball Association Board of Directors and players participating in the State Singles will vote to determine the recipient.

A second trophy, the "Contributional Trophy", also a traveling trophy, will be given annually at the State Singles tournament to the individual who has contributed most to the sport of racquetball. The recipient will be determined by a vote of the MRA Board of Directors. Both trophies were awarded at this year's state tournament in April.

# **Eyeguards Are Mandatory**

Beginning September 1, eyeguards are mandatory at all Michigan sanctioned tournaments. No player will be allowed to compete without eyeguards or some type of eye protection - eyeglasses. This regulation will be made clear on the tournament entry form and the tournament director will be responsible for carrying it out. Every racquetball player will benefit by the rule for it protects against someday playing with one eye or not playing at all. Also, it protects each of us from causing a crippling eye injury to a friend.
