

From The President

June 20, 2002

Have you ever heard the expression, "It takes a village to raise a child"? I'm not sure who uttered those profound words and I don't know everything about raising a child. I do know, however, that it takes a village (or maybe a nation) to put together a national juniors racquetball tournament for children.



By the time you read this, the 29th USRA Junior Olympic Championships (June 26 – June 30 at the Athletic Club of Bloomingdale) will be history. Hopefully the participants and their families will leave with fond memories of the tournament and their trip to the great state of Illinois. I'm sure they will find out what we already know – we put on great tournaments and Illinois is a great place to be.

But let's back up. How does it all happen? The tournament is a USRA event. The tournament sponsor is a major racquetball manufacturer, *Head Racquet Sports*. The USRA offers clubs across the country the opportunity to bid to be the host site. The USRA Tournament Director and a Junior Site Selection Committee decide on the site. A contract is negotiated and the fun starts...

The USRA focuses on promoting the event, accepting entries, creating the draw and running the Control Desk. The site is focused on preparing for the event, providing tournament necessities (towels, etc.) and maintaining the location throughout the week. So what else might be involved? I can think of many things that make a tournament more enjoyable. For a junior tournament they might include a goodie bag full of "stuff" that kids like, hospitality for players and their families, pleasant spots around the club for people to hang out and talk, and a special place for awards to be presented. How, might you ask, do you get those things going?

Well, we formed a Junior Nationals Host Committee to help make the tournament memorable. The committee consists of Dave Negrete, JTI (Junior Team Illinois) parents, ISRA board members, and anyone else who is willing to help and contribute. In addition, there is a National Juniors Council that includes members from around the country. That group has been offering support and will be helping at the tournament site. It's still too early to tell you how it will all work out. After all, we've still got 6 days to solidify our plans! I bet, though, that this will be a tournament that is talked about for a long time, and that we'll set the bar high for the next tournament site.

Our September newsletter will have full coverage of the event and will provide a complete list of volunteers and sponsors. In the meantime, I'd like to congratulate the newly elected (or reelected) members of the ISRA Board of Directors as well as those players who will be moving up to the next skill level for next season. Thanks for a great 2001-2002 season and enjoy the summer – it's short!



It was another breakout weekend for young Ben Croft against tough competition at the Regionals. It was also nice to see Chris Evon return; Chris won Women's Open over Josie Barnett. It was great to have both of these top women playing at Regionals along with the 30 other players in the women's draws. We need many more women to come out to the big tournaments! Anyway, I asked for stories, and got two of them: a press release from the tournament describing Ben's win in the Open and a comment from Bob Croft (Ben's dad). First, the press release: "Seventeen-year-old Ben Croft staged back-to-back comebacks in the finals to win both the Men's Open and the 24 & Under divisions. In the Men's

Open finals, Ben edged out Michigan's Shannon Kohl 15-12 and 15-14. Ben overcame a 7-14 deficit in the second game to clinch the title. His 24 & Under final matched him up against 21-year-old Travis Mettenbrink, current Nebraska State Champion. Ben fought back from 10-14 in the first game and edged his opponent out 15-14. After losing the second game, a convincing win in the tiebreaker gave Ben top honors in the 24's."

To add some color, I asked Bob what he could tell me of the match: "Although the Men's Open match with Ben & Shannon was very close, the 24's against Travis was quite the match to watch. Travis is quick and hits the ball a ton. Ben is also strong in both categories. They produced some unbelievable rallies. Although they have never been matched up together before, they quickly found mutual respect for each other. Many times in between rallies the two found themselves sharing a laugh, clicking racquets, acknowledging each other's performance. They shared several hard-hitting rallies that ended with one or both of them diving for that save. It was just one of those matches that was fun to watch. A spectator next to me (whom I didn't know) said to me that this match was better and more entertaining than the pro's."





Racquetball Supports Its Own

Gonzalez Brothers Represent Illinois at National Singles

I am passing on this story to you for two reasons. First, it is a great human interest story on how racquetball players support their own, and second, I hope that this story it will inspire others to make similar attempts to help talented players compete at the highest amateur levels of our sport. I want to thank Martin and Tony for letting me

tell their story and for being such great representatives of Illinois racquetball – Al Murry

Martin and Tony Gonzalez of the Bally's Matteson Club both qualified for the National Singles, held this past May in Houston. Not only did they play in the regional qualifier at the Bloomingdale Athletic Club, but they both

were able to compete at a high level. After hearing of their success at the Regionals, I congratulated them and wished them good luck at the Nationals. Martin thanked me for my support, but mentioned that he was not going to Nationals due to the high cost of attending a weeklong, out-of-town tournament.

Knowing that Martin and Tony were too modest to ask for sponsorship on their own, several of us, in cooperation with the Bally's club in Matteson, started a collection. It was close to the cut-off date for getting into the tournament, so we had to work fast. Within a few days, we had collected over \$600!!! While that was an amazing amount for local racquetball players and members of Bally's to donate, it wasn't enough to get both of them to Houston. Since both Martin and Tony had worked for Bally's in the past, I decided to contact Bally's corporate headquarters to see if they

were willing to cover the rest of the cost. To my surprise, they were happy not only to hear of the Gonzalez brothers' success, but they also agreed to help defray some of the costs. 

Racquetball Dictionary

Avoidable Hinder

A call never made in friendly club games that almost certainly comes back to haunt you in clutch situations of tournaments.

Combining Two Divisions

What usually occurs at a tournament when you are almost assured of winning the lower division you have entered and have been awarded a high seed, but now must play opponents from a higher division due to a lack of players entered in your own bracket.

Crack Shot

Any seam or junction of the floor and any side wall that — when a ball strikes it after rebounding legally from the front wall — results in an unreturnable shot. Also, the same place that your opponent swears his shot hits every time he/she blocks your view, as in "that was no screen, it cracked out".

High Seed

The player you are most likely to draw in the first round of an expensive, out-oftown tournament.

Doubles

A format that allows one player to utilize the word "we" when accepting responsibility for a loss.

"Icky Splat"

An unintentional shot by the offensive

player—which strikes only the frame of the racquet, contacts the nearest side wall, and then takes on strange, unpredictable, and almost mystical physical properties (as well as a wicked side spin) resulting in an unreturnable shot for an opponent after it hits the front wall about two inches above the floor. Usually not the result of any planned or practiced effort, this shot almost always is accompanied by a sheepish grin and an apology from the offensive player and an expletive by the

Rollout

defensive player.

A shot, almost always struck by your opponent and never by you or your own team mate, which seems most likely to occur late in a tie-breaker during the most critical rally in the match.

Round Robin


A specialized tournament format that allows you to embarrass yourself four or five times instead of just once.

Short Serve

The only proper call to make when you as a referee—are unable to actually see the drive serve struck by a player because your beer glass was blocking your view.

Short Server

The five-minute period just prior to your match in which you go onto the court and terrorize your opponent and amaze the assembled crowd watching in the gallery with rollout after rollout, shortly followed by start of the match, in which you inexplicably enter the "Spaz Zone".

(The) Spaz Zone

The time period immediately following your warm up, at which time you vaguely hear the referee call "Zero serving zero" and your left foot suddenly pretends to know nothing of what your right foot is attempting to do, so that you can hit no shot lower than head high, all of your shots rebound off the back wall to the service line, and close friends, relatives and peers watching from the gallery ask "who the heck is that on the court?"
