The RAM State Singles Championship boasted a new and exciting twist for 2004. BLAKESLEE ELECTED TO THE RAM HALL OF FAME

The 2004 RAM State Singles Championships tournament, with upsets in the draw and a record number of junior participants was the host for another exciting moment in Michigan's racquetball history. The tournament was the site of the induction of the newest member of RAM's Raquetball Hall of Fame.

Tom Blakeslee, of Mt. Clemens, joins the other 23 members as the 24th person to be elected to the Michigan Racquetball Hall of Fame for 2004 by a vote of the Michigan players. Although his playing record is a something to be proud of with many state titles, a number of individual tournament titles and a force to be considered at any moment in all tournaments, to most of us Tom's name was synonymous with the RAM State Singles Championship!

For almost 20 years, as a member of the RAM Board of Directors, we have seen Tom sitting at the tournament desk; working the times and courts; running interference on rule interpretations; and for better or worse, making sure we had a tournament to play in. Not many people realize the time commitment and the personal sacrifice required to pull any tournament off successfully, much less the State Singles Championship. It is truly a miracle that he is still "happily married" to Karen. Tom and Karen have two beautiful daughters, Courtney and Alexandria. All of us would like to thank vou!

I've known Tom for some time, worked out with him and been his doubles partner. It's been said that my back has a heavy load on it, but in truth, I've learned as much from him as he has from me.....it's been a pleasure.

From some of us who know you best, Jim, Chris, Pete and the rest....Thank you and Congratulations as the 2004 Inductee into the RAM Racquetball Hall of Fame. - Jack White

Tom's commitment to Michigan centered largely around his functioning as President of RAM. Tom was the President of RAM for the thirteen years. Being a board member for 20 years is quite an accomplishment, but acting as President for 13 years is amazing.

Tom should be most remembered for being on the RAM board for 20 years (as of right now) and being President on RAM for 13 years. - Jim Easterling

We had approximately 160 participants this year, which included over 53 Juniors. I served as the resident roaming reporter and **Thelma** served as our photographer. We missed the play of **Stephanie Cobb** this year as she was out with an injury but she was our official presenter of the awards to the winners and runner-ups.

Tom Blakeslee (see article on page 3)was inducted into the Hall of Fame. He's been playing for about 32 years. He keeps coming back to the sport so that he can stay physically fit. He enjoys the work out. He is very proud that we have more board members. This has been a goal of his for years.

Kristin Pagels has played for 2 or 3 years. She has played in 2 State Singles tournaments. She is 14 and has never won a game... she just plays for the fun of it. Khristin says she's very busy and racquetball is a way for her to relax.

Twayne Howard is the Board's Treasurer and has been a board member for 4 or 5 years. He's been playing for 24 years and has been playing tournaments for 10 years. Twayne stated that Charles Kaiser and Stanley Kurzman (two of our seasoned, 70 year old, players) were his heros and he wanted to be just like them when he grows up.

Dennis Dinauer hails from the Bay City area and has been playing for 12 to 14 years and he was coached by our very own **Melody Gorno** when he attended Central Michigan University. Until last

year Dennis had not been playing. He missed the competitiveness so he decided to come back to the game.

Anthnita Dickerson has not played a State Singles tournament since 1995 but she came out to this tournament ready to take care of business. She took home the gold in both of her divisions. "The competition was great and I am glad that I played in this tournament. I think it will be a good warm-up tournament for Regionals".

Carlos Jones was the champ for the Men's 45A and Men's A and he has been playing since 1994 but this is his first time playing in the State Tournament. He thought that the tournament was very well organized and the location was good. Karen Green and Mike Banks were very involved in motivating him to play in more tournaments.
