## VCI Pro Stop/L.A.C. Holiday Classic Swain was rockin' and, certainly, rolling.

One of Colorado's most exciting tournaments got even better this year with the addition of the VCI PRO TOUR to the annual HOLIDAY RACQUETBALL CLASSIC at the Lakewood Athletic Club on Dec 2-5.

Thanks to the efforts and support of Bob & Mary Rodriguez of RJR CIRCUITS, Dave Peck and Jim Balfanz of EKTELON, Larry Daub of PENN Racquet Sports, Hank Marcus and Ed Ray of the VCI PRO TOUR, and COCA-COLA the L.A.C. was able to return Pro racquetball to the Denver metro area.

The tourney opened with the pro qualifier on Thursday. All the top seeds advanced to the round of 16, but not without some challenges from the top local players including Tony Boscia, Scott Liparelli, Scott Parrill, Jay Reinsma, Bobby Rodriguez, Jeff Mulligan, Mick Eitzel, Steve Nielsen and Eric Thompson.

Mike Guidry, from Texas, was out to claim his first Pro Championship title on the same courts he won his first National title in 1988. At that time Mike won the Boy's 18 & under when the Junior Nationals were held at the L.A.C., then called the Sportsclub. However, Cliff Swain, the dominating player on the tour, had different plans and defeated Mike in the finals to take home the top prize of \$2700. Guidry received \$1500 as the runner-up.

The pros played to a sold out crowd of racquetball enthusiasts jammed into the L.A.C. championship court area. With few exceptions, the players were very professional, exciting, and fun to watch. They displayed amazing athletic ability as well as a very amiable and professional attitude on and off the court. Virtually all the players proved to be a great asset to racquetball. Tour director, Hank Marcus, should be commended for his leadership and organizational skills.

Meanwhile, courts 3-14 were packed during the four-day event with over 250 players from across the state competing in a full slate of divisions. See the PENN TOURNAMENT SCORE BOARD for complete results.

Many thanks to Sue Ruhl; Renee, Molly and Philip Law; Mary and Bobby Rodriguez Jr; Salina Hernandez; and, all the C.R.A. members who helped staff the tournament desk. A special note of thanks to the staff at Lakewood Athletic Club.

## AARA Rule Changes

The AARA Board of Directors have approved the following rule changes that went into effect September 1, 1993.

1) The penalty for use of a racquet that exceeds the 21-inch limitation should be immediate forfeiture of the game in progress or forfeiture of the preceding game if the illegal racquet is discovered between games.

(If a racquet measures more than 21-inches from the butt end of the handle to the top of the head then it is not legal.)

2) The penalty for serving the ball while the receiver is signaling "not ready" will be a fault serve. Any two fault serves will result in a side out. ▀

## STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS SET FOR AURORA ATHLETIC CLUB

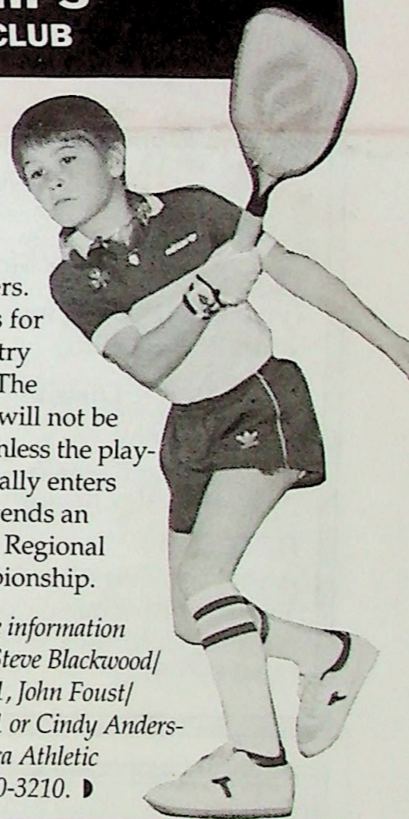
After a long absence from the State Championship scene, the Aurora Athletic Club is set to host the 1994 CRA/AARA Racquetball Singles Championships on March 23-27. The tournament will include men and women's skill divisions (Open, A, B, etc.) in addition to age group and junior divisions.

Local area matches will start on Wednesday, March 23rd, depending on the overall player turnout. Matches on Thursday will start at 4:00pm, if necessary, while all players must be ready to play starting at 12:00pm on Friday.

Awards will be presented to 1st, 2nd, 3rd and consolation winners. Currently under consideration by the C.R.A. board is a proposal to pay the Regional open entry for the

men and women's open winners. This is for the entry only. The entry will not be paid unless the player actually enters and attends an AARA Regional Championship.

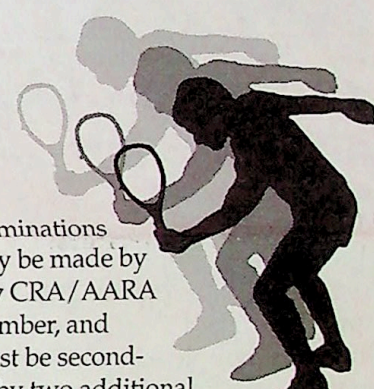
## 1994 JOHN MOONEY AWARD

The 1995 WPPFG are scheduled to be held in Australia. D

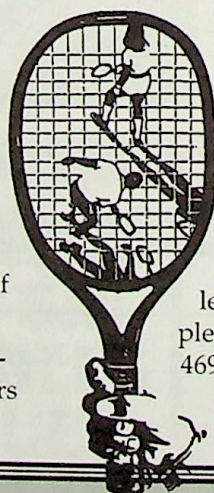
## WAC-IT-BALL-TRAVEL-LEAGUE New Travel League Being Formed

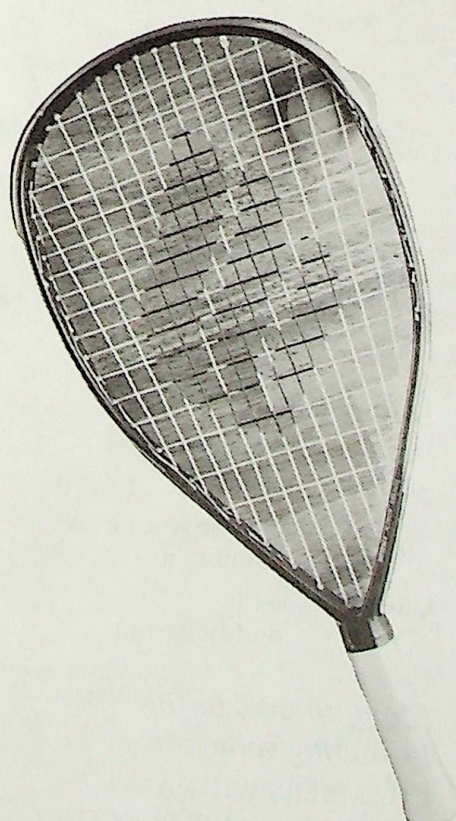

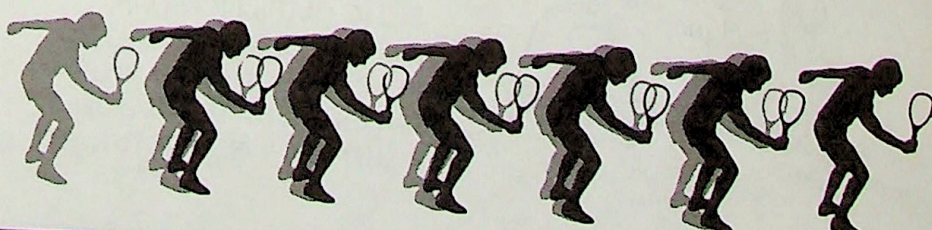

## AARA Dues Increase Slated for January 1, 1994

At the October AARA Board of Directors meeting there were decisions made that will affect all CRA/AARA members. Perhaps the most important decision was related to the dues structure. After extensive research and intense conversation by the AARA Board, the following changes regarding your membership will go into effect on January 1, 1994.

- Competitive license membership dues will be increased to \$20.00 per year. The CRA will retain \$7 of this amount with the remaining \$13 going to the AARA which covers all current benefits including **Racquetball Magazine** and your secondary accident insurance coverage.

- All two and five year memberships will be eliminated (no longer offered) as of January 1, 1994.

- All family memberships will be eliminated (no longer offered) as of January 1, 1994.

- Junior memberships will be offered at \$15 and will include all benefits as applicable to adult memberships. For those juniors wishing to purchase a competitive license membership **without the Racquetball Magazine**, they may do so for \$10.

- Lifetime memberships have been increased to \$500 effective January 1, 1994.

- If a competitive license member does not want to continue their membership but want only the magazine, a subscription may be purchased for \$15. If at any time a subscription only player wishes to participate in a sanctioned event, they must purchase the \$20 competitive license membership.

## PLAYING TIP - Better Racquet Preparation for Better Play

Racquetball is a fast paced game. It's one that requires quick decision making when played at virtually any level. The ball is moving, your opponent is working his way into position and the angles the ball can take from the walls certainly takes some getting used to. To make it more interesting - you have to get there to return the ball.

Through the years I've found there are two very fundamental mistakes that most beginner and low intermediate players have in common. Not watching the ball (more on that at another time) and poor racquet preparation.

Once your opponent has hit the ball it's important that you make a basic decision - how am I going to return this shot? Forehand or backhand. Pretty simple, it's one or the other. Make up your mind and start your racquet preparation on the way to the ball. Remember, once your racquet is up and ready your 50% through with your swing. Even if the ball takes a bad bounce you can still swing and make a shot, good or bad. If the ball hits a crack while your still dangling your racquet at your knees, you'll be fortunate to just make contact.

There are other by products to

be had as a result of good racquet preparation. Getting your racquet up means your thinking about your game. It allows the opportunity to use your

peripheral vision to scope out and hopefully make the proper shot against your opponent. You can do this

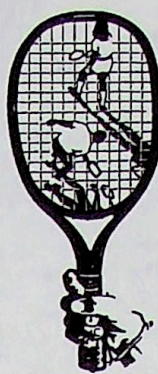
much easier when everything isn't a last minute ordeal. It will also make those

back wall shots alot more of what there supposed to be - set-ups (Why do you do think they call them set-ups anyway?). Turn yourself, get your racquet up, move with the ball and make the shot. Simple. You can't do that on a consistent basis if your not ready and in position.

So make it a project the next time you play. Force yourself to start getting your racquet up in the ready position on your way to the ball. In time you will find your shots, and concentration, will have improved.

Good luck, now go whomp somebody.

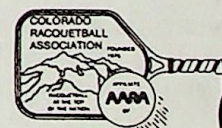

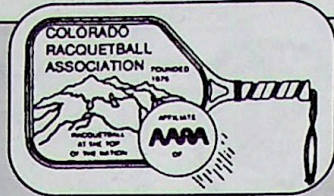

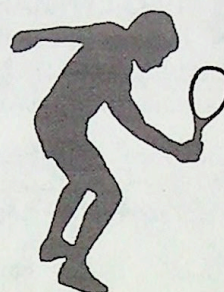
