His pictures say it all

Sergio: A proud father

MIAMI — If a picture is worth 1,000 words, Sergio Gonzalez has done a lot of talking. Sergio, whose two sons Oscar and Oscar are among the best racquetball players in the nation, has taken enough pictures to keep the film business thriving.

Locating nostalgic items won't be a problem for Sergio and Oscar. Their father, an admitted fanatic, has 7,223 pictures (count them). Converted into albums, that's 65 for Sergio and 47 for Oscar, who, Mr. Gonzalez quickly points out hasn't been playing as long.

Sergio Sr. can easily be spotted at racquetball tournaments. He's the one with the baseball hat turned around. You know him, the guy with the smile taking all those pictures and urging his sons on.

There was a time in his life when Sergio Sr. never thought he'd see the outside, much less have the opportunity to take thousands of pictures. A former Olympics track and swimming performer for Cuba in 1952 and 1960, he and a group of others tried to blow up a Russian ship and a utility plant. They were caught and many were shot on the spot. "If we had succeeded we would have put a dent in his (Fidel Castro) plans," Sergio Sr. said. He was sentenced to 30 years in jail and began his term when Sergio was only five months old. Married only one year, he spent Christmas Day in solitary confinement. "It's something you never forget. At 3 or 4 in the morning they'd take people out of jail and shoot them," he vividly recalled.

Miraculously, on December 14, 1968 his sentence was commuted. He later found out his father, an excellent surgeon, agreed to stay and practice in Cuba if they would

release his son. His wife had left with Sergio and their daughter in 1966 and went to Nebraska where his sister resided.

After going through the bureaucracy (Cuban officials told the U.S. authorities he was dead), Sergio was cleared to leave the country. "Oscar was born November 13th in 1968. It was very quick," he quipped. Mr. Gonzalez stayed in Nebraska for five years. A former skin diver, he missed the sea and moved his family to Miami.

They belonged to a club called Americus which had an outside court with four walls and a half ceiling. "I was playing pretty good. My first match ever, I played against Mike Mojer. He came in with sweatpants and never took them off. I thought I would kill him. I scored two points."

His son, Sergio, was 13 when he was introduced to the sport and the first of more than 7,000 pictures soon followed. "He never played novice or C's. In his first tournament he was in B's and went into open a year later. In the age groups he never lost one match. I played in tournaments and then I quit. In one tournament we were all playing at the same time. Oscar was 7 and I used my three timeouts in the first five minutes. I couldn't take it so I decided to stop playing tournaments."

At the time there was no racquetball facilities in Miami so Sergio took his son to the courtrooms in Fort Lauderdale where Fred Blaesse was offering a junior program. For four years he took Sergio to Fort Lauderdale and began taking pictures.

"Today, Mr. Gonzalez is an open photographer, although he was a novice for a while.

"I know the players real well so I can take specific shots because I'm waiting for it," he said.

Sergio proudly brings visitors into the Florida room of his home which has become a Racquetball Hall of Fame. Plaques take up all the wall space and trophies are stacked up neatly all over the room.

He admits to driving his kids, forcing them to practice. "I know I'm too much of a disciplinarian. I get angry when you have an easy shot and then miss it. I never lost a game on the outside."

He's had the opportunity to see his sons excel in the game. "Sergio is already there and Oscar is there but isn't quite there yet. Sergio was beating everyone, but stopped caring. I can see why. When you win all the time you get bored. The only time he was really up to play was when he played Hogan (The Coliseum, Coral Gables) and took him to a tie-breaker. When he wants to win no one can beat him."

With Sergio in St. Petersburg, Mr. Gonzalez is concentrating on Oscar. "When I was growing up, no one had to tell me about training. I never smoked or drank Coke," he recalled. His workouts with Oscar are grueling. "We drill and drill. I guess my background, knowing you have to make sacrifices to be the best is responsible for the way I feel today. By next year, Oscar will be tough to beat."

Next year, Sergio is hoping for a Gonzalez final in the state championships and a sparkle in his eye when he mentions his ultimate fantasy.

"I wish one of them makes the Olympic team in 1992."

Now, that would make a great picture.

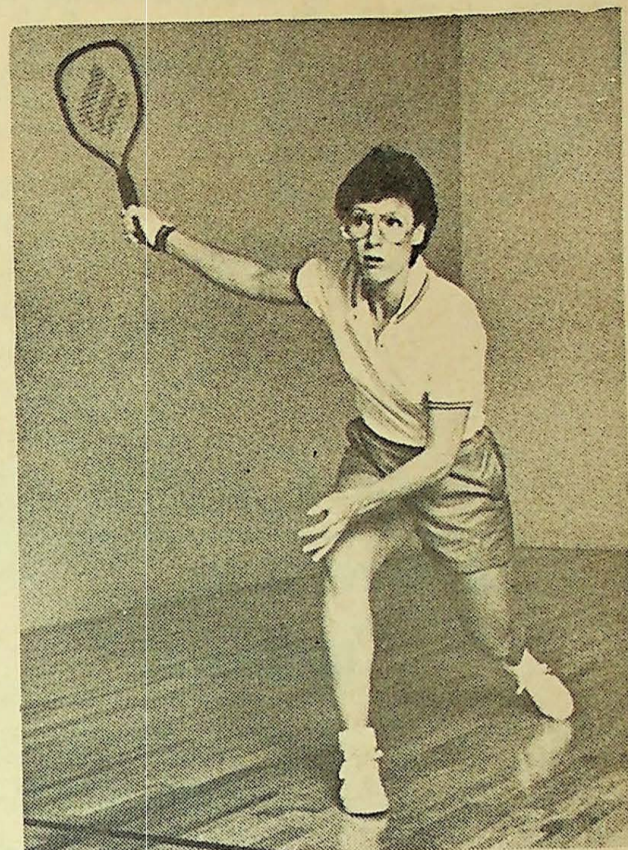

Few racquetball players, men or women have ever achieved the level of prominence within the sport like that of Lynn Adams. The current No. 1 ranked player in the world, she has won more tournaments than any other woman, and has won four National Singles and three National Doubles titles.

She became the first woman to win the Triple Crown, with victories at the 1985 WPRA, EkteLON and D.P. National Championships. In addition, Lynn has won the National Outdoor Championship five consecutive years.

An excellent instructor, Lynn will be assisted by National Doubles Champion Mary Lyons, and Jacksonville's Curtis Winter, a top open player and excellent instructor.

Racquetpower, located in Jacksonville, FL, is our host facility. TUITION:

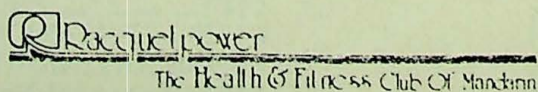

Florida juniors take the gold

Over 600 entrants came to Chicago's Charlie Club the last weekend in June for the 1986 AARA National Junior Championships.

About 50 of Florida's top juniors came to play and showed everyone else just how its done. They brought home the first place team trophy and sent last years champs, the Californians, home with a distant second place finish. Third place went to the New York team nicknamed "Team Harlem". Twenty-five states entered teams in the state competition. Each round won by an individual or doubles team earns a point for the state. Bonus points are awarded for the top three slots in each division and console winners.

Gold medals are almost commonplace in at least one Florida household this year. The Xynidis', Nicky and John won four. They were both singles and doubles champs in their respective age divisions. Nicky's partner in the 12 doubles was John Kolen from Alabama while John's 10 and under partner was Frank Dean, also from Alabama. Papa Steve had trouble wiping the smile off his face after the finals but in typical Xynidis fashion assured us that "younger sister Christy would be ready for next year's competition too!"

In the boys 14 and under division Robby Walden, the only Floridian seeded first, lived up to his potential defeating John Ellis of California in the finals 15-4, 15-6. Robby also won the coveted sportsmanship award presented at the Tuesday evening banquet to

the junior who most exemplifies sportsmanship, good manners and court decorum. Luke St. Onge, Executive Director of the AARA honored the PRP, Bradenton junior by presenting him with a white U.S. Olympic team jacket to commemorate the occasion.

In the girls division last year's 16 and under champ Claudia McCarthy of Jacksonville teamed with Vicky Yarns of St. Petersburg to win gold in the 18 and under doubles. The team got off to a slow start in the finals losing the first game 1-15 against Kelly Pulis of California and Carrie Healy of Georgia. But they rallied late in a close game to win 15-11, then played steady in the tiebreaker to win 11-7.

Debra Derr from Ormond Beach lost her first match ever in a finals tiebreaker against Dawn Gates, California, in the girls 8 and under no bounce division. Debra says she'll be back next year to try to add a gold medal to her collection though.

Britt Engel and partner Alicia Kinney from Alabama won silver medals in the girls 12 and under doubles. Britt and other consolation singles winners Katie O'Day and Julia Quinlan were also responsible for contributing valuable points to the overall team standings which helped Florida finish in first place.

The always tough and now considerably bigger Mike Altman teamed with John Gillooly from Massachusetts to win the boys 14 doubles, then beat his doubles partner to win a bronze medal

in the 14 singles.

Floridians won an overwhelming number of bronze, third place medals at the championships this year. The list includes: James Lorello, 16s; Mike Altman 14s; Allan Engle 12s; Jody Friedman 8s; Vicky Yarns 16s; Amy Simonetta 14s; Amy Simonetta and Hannah Spector 14 doubles; Allan Engle and Robby Walden 14 doubles.

Special mention should also be made of the accomplishments of Jason Waggoner and Brian Rankin who advanced to the 8s and 16s respectively in the 16 and under division where James Lorello was awarded a bronze medal. The draw in this division contained over 120 participants.

We can all be very proud of the special group of juniors who represented our state at the championships this year. The team members listed below and the adults who chaperoned them, cheered them on and coached them throughout the week are all responsible for Team Florida's outstanding first place finish. The trophy they earned was placed in the custody of Steve Xynidis and will be displayed along with a plaque inscribed with the names of the '86 team members at all major junior tournaments during the coming year. *Great going Team Florida!*
