# Three-tourney rule partially dropped

This is notification to all MRA members and players who anticipated playing in the MRA State Singles Championship. There are several divisions for which the three-tournament rule is now null and void. The participants in the following divisions need not have played in three tournaments to play in the state singles tournament. Those divisions are: Women's Seniors, Women's Veteran's (30+), Men's Golden Masters Junior 17 and Under (male and female), Junior 15 and Under (male and female)

These divisions were cancelled at some tournaments and players couldn't compete

### RULES: THE SCREEN BALL

Rule 4.3 (a) Dead Ball Serve. A dead ball serve results in no penalty and the server is given another serve without cancelling a prior illegal serve. Rule 4.4 (b) Screen Balls. Passes too close to the server or the server's partner to obstruct the view of the returning side. Any serve passing behind the server's partner and the side wall is an automatic screen. (A screen ball serve is a dead ball serve.)

# Hints to Remember

- 1. There is no 18 inch rule or other definitive rule prescribing a length or distance the ball must be from the server. It is strictly a judgement call
- 2. A screen should be called whenever it is believed that the server's body blocked the ball to such an extent that the receiver was not allowed a fair chance to see the ball well enough to make a reasonable return.
- 3. The call should never work to the advantage of the server. Therefore, a referee should be more inclined to make the call when the server hits a really tough serve, and not make the call when the receiver has a relatively easy return.
- 4. Generally the receiver is entitled to see the ball most of the way back after the ball strikes the front wall.
- 5 On drive serves hit down a wall generally it is not a screen if the ball hits the floor first, depending on how close the server was standing to the wall.
- 6 Referees should make the call loudly and quickly enough so that both players hold up. When in doubt referees should call the screen. It is better to have a point replayed unnecessarily than to have a point awarded unfairly.
- 7 Referees should not let receivers decoy them into screen serve calls. Often perfect aces to the forehand side catch the receiver off guard because he anticipates a serve to his backhand and starts to move that way. He may honestly think he was screened, but he is not entitled to a clear view of the ball if he moves out of centre court, particularly if he moves the wrong way.

Larry Fox who then sent on to win the Men's Open Finals against Jack Newman 10-21, 21-15, 11-9.


Ron Pudduck, 2nd Place MRA Master Division, won the Men's Masters (45+) against Mr. Weckerly 21-16, 21-17.

# Team Concept

Beginning Petoskey for the 1982-83 tournament season, the MRA has brought back the idea of the Team Concept. Many people asked, just what is the Team Concept? Devised originally as a way to foster more club involvement in tournaments, the idea is a great way for players to have more fun.

Basically any five players can form a team, as long as no more than 2 play in any one division. Each player may be a member of only one team and each team will be allowed one substitute members. For each tournament the team enters, there is a \$10 fee and a team can enter as many tournaments as they wish. Once a team is formed, it keeps the same members for the rest of the tournament season.

Each team will receive one point for each player playing and additional points as follows: First place - 10 points; Second place - 5 points; Semis - 3 points; and Quarters - 1 point Team points are totaled for each tournament. The only way to earn points is to enter that tournament as a team. The winning team at each tournament will receive a team trophy and each member will receive an individual souvenir. (Note: the winning teams at MRA #1, #2, & #3 will receive theirs by mail)

Each team's points will be carried over from tournament to tournament. The winning team will be the team with the highest number of points after MRA #7 in Brighton If there is a tie, results from the State Singles Championship will be used. The prize for the winning team will be a 2-night, 3-day stay for all five members at Wheels Inn in Chatham, Ontario. This will be awarded at the State Singles Championship at Franklin Racquet Club, April 8, 9, 10, 1983
