Cheryl won the US Open and attributes much of her success to Illinois role models like Chris Evon and Lynn Adams, Illinois practice partners including Bob Clar, Ted Huddleston, Gary Lehnert and Steve MacInnis, and workouts designed by her Illinois trainer, Eugene Coyle.

Eugene's talents are showcased in his own article. It seems Eugene has not only helped Cheryl gain success, but has also helped Sudsy Monchik get back to the top of his game after suffering an injury. And, guess what? Sudsy won the men's side of the US Open.

If you continue reading the magazine, you'll find our own Krystal Csuk, recognized for earning a spot on the US National Team by virtue of her win in last spring's US Intercollegiate Championships and for being a two-time recipient of a USRA scholarship. You'll also be reminded that Dave Negrete is leading the men's professional tour as IRT Commissioner.

Then there are the lists. First and second place finishers are listed for each division offered in the US Open. There are 8 Illinois players listed there. Four won first place (Cheryl, Ben Croft, Leo Klimaitis, and Brenda White). The other four came

Further back in the magazine are the ranking lists. Illinois players are listed **52** times here. Age group rankings include Trevor Snyders in the Boy's 10 and Under, Philip Dziuk in the Men's 75+...and lots of others in between.

The next issue of Racquetball Magazine will include the ballots for the annual USRA Board Elections. You'll find Illinois there, too, as Geoff Peters seeks to regain his position on the USRA Board of Directors. Don't forget to vote.

The ISRA State Doubles Championships were held the first weekend of February. About 25% of our membership participated (203 players). Just think if we could move that number up to 35 or 40% for ISRA State Singles the first week of April. Illinois would really rock!



December 8, 2002 Athletic Club of Bloomingdale


On a cold but sunny day in December...just when we thought the 2002 tournaments were but a fond memory...along came...
