



SUPREME COURT VI Stockton, Calif.



 What should constitute "professional" racquetball? I hope it is not what was seen at the Burlington, Vermont, pro-am tournament held at the spacious Court Club facility.

The word professional means that outside reading and work must be done. The long hours of concentrated practice put in by the gifted racquetball athlete were greatly appreciated by the capacity crowd at the Court Club. The all glass side wall afforded excellent viewing. But, what was also viewed was the unprofessional and unbelievable conduct of some of the pro-players . . . and off court—some of the racquetball promoters.

What I thought was going to be a great promotion for the game in the East resulted in quite the opposite. Many derogatory comments were made to me, as the IRA Massachusett's state chairman, about the miserable similarity of some of the conduct here to conduct in prize-fighting!

The reasons for such comparisons were: (1) line judges were so busy drinking they couldn't call the shots; (2) Racquetball promoters were also busy drinking, beating on the side glass walls, and yelling for all bets to be placed quickly; (3) Some of the pro-players, already eliminated, were so drunk they had to lie down to watch the matches; and last, (4) Some of the pro-players received verbal abuse from those already eliminated!

GENTLEMEN—please do not set this sport back 50 years by unsportsmanlike conduct and barroom behavior.

There are too many of us who love the game and want to see it become the greatest sport in the world!!

A proposition: Ask the IRA to form, appoint, or elect a board to oversee tournament conduct, difficulties, complaints, and to investigate, and thus fine—if necessary—all who are guilty of improper-behavior.

If we are to expect growth outward, we must better our inward game first. I ask you—would Pete Roselle put up with this?

Due to the tremendous turnout we have had for our events, and time being a factor, all matches played in the Sarasota outdoor four-wall had a single 31point game.

Larry Lieving, program director for the YMCA ran the entire tournament. If the growth of racquetball in Florida continues at the present rate we may not have a large enough complex in which to operate during our next Florida

Championship Tournament . . . and may have to divide it into two weekends.

We have asked that pictures of the tournament be sent to the IRA, and hope they arrive in time for the next issue.

 In response to your recent telephone call I am glad to give you a few comments on the growth of this sport.

The General Sportcraft Co. has been

involved in this game of racquetball for many years now. It was in the early 60's, as I recall, that we began producing a paddle racket for a game called paddle rackets, then almost completely unknown. That was about the time Joe Sobek moved around the various Y's and clubs instructing and promoting this new game.

As you know, it became "Racquetball" many years later when the IRA Association was formed. At that time we associated ourselves with the IRA at its inception, produced and sold approved racquets, also sold approved balls as well.

Our sales of rackets began in very modest quantities during 1960 and enjoyed substantial growth during the ensuing years. Increased activity began to be felt in the late 1960's. During the five-year period commencing in 1969, sales of racquets increased by approximately 50% each successive year and experienced the same, if not larger increases in the sale of Racquetball Balls. I have limited my comments above to generalities rather than actual dollar sales or quantities of racquets and balls, approved and otherwise, sold by us. I believe that kind of information might

be interesting but in a different type of statistical study.

 In regard to the letter on page 4 of the Racquetball Handbook Volume 4 Number 5, I would like to make a comment about Mr. Goss' formula for tennis elbow.

In my four years of being a varsity athletic trainer at several local high schools and assisting on the college level, along with three years experience working in a physical therapy department, I, along with many other people, have developed a very simple 100% effective method of curing this problem.

The answer lies in common sense. The policy of R and R (rest and relaxation) somehow seems to have an almost 100 percent batting average. If a player wants to keep playing when this condition persists, he is not helping himself, but as the rule book says, "HINDER-ING" himself.

• In 1938, six rooms were a part of the structure in the Carr Health Building at Murray Normal School. These rooms were enclosed (four walls), complete with windows. The dimensions were 17x17x37. (No one can determine where these came from.) They also were equipped with heat ducts and a small storage area, cut out in the back corner.

The sources of light for these courts were two large light bulbs placed in a cut out portion of each end of the ceiling, covered with chicken wire. These were the facilities which racquetballers, handballers, and paddleballers used for 37 years.

During these 37 years, Murray Normal School has become Murray State University and these six antiquated rooms have been transformed into six of the most





modern in the country. They include a panel system and a unique ventilation system, which circulates the air completely every 20 seconds. This will afford play year round.

We are proud of our new courts, and of the growth of racquetball in our community. We invite visiting racquetballers to stop by the campus when in town, and to roll out a few with us.

We also want to congratulate DeWitt Shy and/or the executive committee for its selection of Tom McKie as the new executive director, and to wish him great success in the new post.

State and Regional Commissioners Conference

Delta Towers in New Orleans was the site of the second State Chairmen and Regional Commissioner's Conference held December 6-7, 1975. Twenty representatives convened to help the I.R.A. coordinate its energies and to improve its lines of communication.

Discussion centered around ways to Increase membership and attract more racquetball players to the I.R.A. Many methods were suggested and a membership committee was formed to consolidate these into a recommendation.

The new improved Vittert V-77 ball was presented to the conference members and its manufacturing process explained. Jim Brubaker, Sales and Marketing Director for Vittert, attended the conference to answer questions. After the participants had a chance to play with the ball, it received favorable ratings.

Ivan Bruner, National Commissioner, coordinated discussions on seeking and securing tournament sites and what the responsibilities of the state chairmen and regional commissioner should be I.R.A. Executive Director, Tom McKie, explained what services the national office provides and gave an update on what is happening in the I.R.A. Lyn McKie, the I.R.A.'s secretary and Coordinator of Membership showed what steps the national office has taken in regard to membership.





Here is the special issue you have been waiting for. As you will notice the size of our membership has grown tremendously since the list was included in the October 1974 Handbook. Also notice the list of racquetball facilities. It has more than doubled showing how much the game is growing. We are working our hardest to keep it accurate but if you know of additional facilities please let us know their names and addresses. An additional feature of this issue is that the IRA Official Rules have once again been included for your convenience.


Many other tournaments and events are happening in our world of racquetball but you can read about these in the following pages. Since I'm sure you are anxious to start reading -- it's all yours.

If you have a ranking system within your state, club, or YMCA that you feel is good, please explain how you do it and why you feel it is good.







Gene Grapes, 53, Irwin, Pa., and Sam Caiazza, 54, New Castle, Pa.—the oldest team in the Masters Invitational—followed the slogan that appeared on all jerseys given to players at the tournament: Racquetball, Fountain of Youth.

Grapes and Caiazza, runnerups to Sellers and Walker a year ago, turned the tables on the defending national champions, underscoring the fact they had not gotten older during the intervening 12 months—just better.

The duo went through the entire competition undefeated. They were shooting from all over the court. When one would cool off, the other would be hot. They shot and played this way through all their matches.

Second place winners, Dr. Bill Sellars and Richard Walker, both out of the Texas hotbed of racquetball, went down to defeat in but two of their matches, but this was enough to throw them 4.4 points behind the winners, and but .2 points ahead of the number three team.

Edged out of second place were Joe Bechard, Wisconsin, and Phillip Dzuik, Illinois.

Each team in the invitational played each other a game of 25 points. Points were scored the following method: one point for every five points scored; one bonus point for a winning match. Second, third, fourth and fifth places were not decided until the final round of play.







July 11, 1975. "Courts Galore" sounds like a snazzy name for a new facility. Not so. I am talking about racquetball court situations here in good old Washington state.

My modesty will not permit me to tell you that my own home town of Tacoma and the surrounding area is a hotbed of racquetball activity in Washington state.

One of the finest facilities to be found anywhere is located in Gig Harbor, just across the Narrows Bridge. The Town & Country Tennis & Health Club has four racquetball courts, three with glass-back walls and four more courts with glass walls on the drawing board, six indoor tennis courts, with tennis pros Dave Rassmussen and Norma K. Adamson giving instructions. The Town & Country also features a huge swimming pool, saunas, hydro tubs, jacuzzis, exercise and weight lifting areas, and a Pro Shop.

Mel Chipman, Board President and Director of the Town & Country is now in the process of opening another such facility in Federal Way, Washington. He has an open door policy to any racquetball player passing through our state to stop by and hit a few and look his club over.

The local YMCA has gone co-ed and is planning to build a new com-

plex that will feature eight courts with glass back-walls. Arlene Keith, Athletic Director, has a racquetball program already, but the need for more courts has grown so quickly that we can not really be effective in teaching the sport until we have more courts.

Ft. Lewis Military Base has ten courts, four of which are new and in use from morning until night. Mc-Chord A.F.B. has two courts and three more due to be built soon.

The 565 Club in downtown Tacoma features three racquetball courts, swimming pool, steam bath, and exercise rooms.

Outside of Tacoma is Olympia, Washington, the State Capitol, which has many courts now. The Tumwater Valley Racquet Club has eight new courts, two with glass windows and upstairs viewing over each court.

Ed Odegard, Club Manager, has worked hard to make the Tumwater Club as fine as it is and is always ready to put on another tournament.

The Olympia YMCA has two courts and always has a tournament on tap. I could go on and on about courts in Washington State, but I won't . . . except to say that in Vancouver, Washington, where the population is a little over 16,000 people, they will be soon working on the construction of the 17th racquetball court.

Phil Mays, at D. B. Frampton company, last summer said the growth of racquetball is entering its boom period. Asked what were his predictions for the next five years, he said, "For the year 1975 we expect to build about 200 courts. This would be a doubling of the preceding year. It could be even more than that —you wouldn't believe the inquiries we have received from coast to coast."

Mays observed that racquetball versus handball activity is now running about 85 percent racquetball—15 percent handball. "A lot of the handball mainstays turn to racquetball when they find handball too strenuous ... and at the same time women find racquetball a wonderful sport, but show little or no interest in handball."

Jim Brubaker, at Vittert was as enthusiastic as Mays: "Just look at racquetball in the St. Louis, Missouri, area. Spaulding has ten courts with another eight on the drawing boards; West James has six; Court House has eight; Town and Country, 13 courts; Castle Oaks, nine, and are planning one more, for sure."

Brubaker added, "Our faith in the future growth of the sport is both obvious and sincere. We do not feel this is a boom and bust. And, we feel this is just the beginning!"

Tom Sattler, PE professor at University of Illinois has been quoted as saying, "Racquetball is drowning handball in most places."

Bruce Hendin, San Antonio, says, "Handball is difficult to play and demands that a player be in good condition. Racquetball, on the other hand, is easy to play, and puts a person in good condition."

Plus four more for Memphis Dr. George Nichopoulos, Memphis, Tennessee, chairman of the board of Racquetball of Memphis, Inc., announced plans for construction of a new ten-court facility to be known as Racquetball East.

The 18,000 square foot facility will be located at 2500 Mt. Moriah, just a short distance south of the I-240 interchange. It will house ten regulation racquetball/handball courts, men's and women's locker rooms with showers, sauna, whirlpool, complete pro shop, children's nursery with attendant, two

glass exhibition courts, and a lounge with backgammon available.

The club will be open 7 am to 10 pm Monday through Friday, and from 8 am to 9 pm on weekends. Members may reserve time in advance.

Dr. Nichopoulos pointed out that racquetball is the fastest growing sport in America today. He said the Mt. Moriah project is the first of four such facilities planned for the Memphis area by Racquetball of Memphis, Inc.

Target date for completion of this first ten-court complex is April 1976.

Rules as reprinted on this and following pages are the IRA official rules of racquetball, and have been published for the benefit of all IRA members. Particular attention should be paid to the corrections concerning the OFFICIAL IRA BALL-the blue Vittert V-77. See Rule 2.2, paragraph (a); Rule 2.3; and third line of Rule 2.5. These changes pertaining to the official ball are the only rules changes. Members are asked to make the needed corrections in the Racquetball Handbook, page 43.



IRA Official Rules of Racquetball

FOUR-WALL

PART I. THE GAME

Rule 1.1-Types of Games. Racquetball may be played by two or four players. When played by two it is called "singles," and when played by four, "doubles."
Rule 1.2—Description. Racquetball, as

the name implies, is a competitive game in which a racquet is used to serve and return the ball.

Rule 1.3-Objective. The objective is to win each rally by serving or returning the ball so the opponent is unable to keep the ball in play. A rally is over when a side makes an error, or is unable to return the ball before it touches the floor twice.

Rule 1.4-Points and Outs. Points are scored only by the serving side when it serves an ace or wins a rally. When the serving side loses a rally, it loses the serve. Losing the serve is called an "out" in singles, and a "handout" in doubles.

Rule 1.5-Game. A game is won by the side first scoring 21 points.

Rule 1.6-Match. A match is won by the side first winning two games.

PART II. COURTS AND EQUIPMENT

Rule 2.1—Courts. The specifications for the standard four-wall racquetball court are:

- (a) Dimension. The dimensions shall be 20 feet wide, 20 feet high, and 40 feet long, with back wall at least 12 feet high.
- (b) Lines and Zones. Racquetball courts shall be divided and marked on the floors with 11/2 inch wide red or white lines as
- (1) Short Line. The short line is midway between and is parallel with the front and back walls dividing the court into equal front and back courts.

(2) Service Line. The service line is parallel with and located 5 feet in front of the short line.

- (3) Service Zone. The service zone is the space between the outer edges of the short and service lines.
- (4) Service Boxes. A service box is located at each end of the service zone by lines 18 inches from and parallel with each side wall.
- (5) Receiving Lines. Five feet back of the short line, vertical lines shall be marked on each side wall extending 3 inches from the floor. See rule 4.7(a).

Rule 2.2-Ball Specifications. The specifications for the standard racquetball

(a) Official ball. IRA's official ball is the blue Vittert V-77. The ball shall be 21/4 inches in diameter; weight approximately 1.40 ounces with a bounce at 67-72 inches from 100 inch drop at a temperature of 76 degrees F.

Rule 2.3-Ball Selection. A new ball shall be selected by the referee for use in each match in all tournaments. During a game the referee may, at his discretion or at the request of either player or team, select another ball. Balls that are not round or which bounce erratically shall not be used. The blue Vittert V-77 ball is official for all IRA sanctioned tournaments.

Rule 2.4-Racquet Specifications. The specifications for the standard racquetball racquet are:

(a) Official Racquet. Any racquet which carries the endorsed stamp of approval from the IRA is an official racquet.

(b) Dimensions. The official racquet will have a maximum head length of 11 inches and a width of 9 inches. These measurements are computed from the outer edge of the racquet head rims. The handle may not exceed 7 inches in length. Total length and width of the racquet may not exceed a total of 27 inches.

(c) The racquet must include a thong

that must be securely wrapped on the player's wrist.

(d) The racquet frame may be made of any material, as long as it conforms to the above specifications.

(e) The strings of the racquet should be gut, monofilament or nylon. Metal or steel strings are permitted only if they do not mark or deface the ball.

Rule 2.5-Uniform. The basic body of the uniform must be of a light or bright color so as not to blend in with the darkness of the ball when it passes close to the body of the player. The uniform trim and shoes may be of any color. The front of the pants and shirt may contain a decal not measuring over five inches in any dimension. The decal may contain a club insignia or commercial advertising of any kind. The back of the uniform must be completely unadorned except that a player's name may be placed in one horizontal line across a shirt in letters not over three inches high. Doubles teams should wear similar colors to ease problems of referee identification. Warmup suits not worn in actual play may be of any color and may have any insignia anywhere. Players may not play without shirts in tournament competition.

PART III. OFFICIATING

Rule 3.1-Tournaments. All tournaments shall be managed by a committee or chairman, who shall designate the of-

Rule 3.2-Officials. The officials shall include a referee and a scorer. Additional assistants and record keepers may be designated as desired.

Rule 3.3-Qualifications. Since the quality of the officiating often determines the success of each tournament, all officials shall be experienced or trained, and shall be thoroughly familiar with these

rules and with the local playing conditions.

Rule 3.4—Rule Briefing. Before all tournaments, all officials and players shall be briefed on rules and on local court hinders or other regulations.

Rule 3.5—Referees. (a) Pre-Match Duties. Before each match commences, it shall be the duty of the referee to:

- (1) Check on adequacy of preparation of the court with respect to cleanliness, lighting and temperature, and upon location of locker rooms, drinking fountains, etc.
- (2) Check on availability and suitability of all materials necessary for the match such as balls, towels, score cards and pencils.
- (3) Check readiness and qualifications of assisting officials.
- (4) Explain court regulations to players and inspect the compliance of racquets with rules.
- (5) Remind players to have an extra supply of adequate racquets and uniforms.

(6) Introduce players, toss coin, and signal start of first game.

(b) Decisions. During games the referee shall decide all questions that may arise in accordance with these rules. If there is body contact on the back swing, the player should call it quickly. On all

questions involving judgment and on all

questions not covered by these rules, the decision of the referee is final.

(c) Protests. Any decision not involving the judgment of the referee may on protest be decided by the chairman, if present, or his delegated representative.

(d) Forfeitures. A match may be for-

feited by the referee when:

 Any player refuses to abide by the referee's decision, or engages in unsportsmanlike conduct.

(2) After warning, any player leaves the court without permission of the referee either during a game or between the first

and second games.

(3) Any player for a singles match, or any team for a doubles match fails to report to play. Normally, 20 minutes from the scheduled game time will be allowed before forfeiture. The tournament chairman may permit a longer delay if circumstances warrant such a decision.

(4) If both players for a singles, or both teams for doubles fail to appear to play for consolation matches or other playoffs, they shall forfeit their ratings for future tournaments, and forfeit any trophies, medals, or awards.

(5) A third technical foul is assessed to any one player or team during the course of a match. See Rule 4.13.

Rule 3.6—Scorers. The scorer shall keep a record of the progress of the game in the manner prescribed by the committee or chairman. As a minimum the progress record shall include the order of serves, outs, and points. The referee or scorer shall announce the score before each serve.

Rule 3.7—Record Keepers. In addition to the scorer, the committee may designate additional persons to keep more detailed records for statistical purposes of the progress of the game.

PART IV. PLAY REGULATIONS

Rule 4.1—Serve, Generally. (a) Order. The player or side winning the toss becomes the first server and starts the first game, and the third game, if any.

(b) Start. Games are started by the

referee calling "play ball."

- (c) Place. The server may serve from any place in the service zone. No part of either foot may extend beyond either line of the service zone. Stepping on the line (but not beyond it) is permitted. Server must remain in the service zone until the served ball passes short line. Violations are called "foot faults."
- (d) Manner. A serve is commenced as the ball leaves the server's hand. The ball must bounce to the floor in the service zone and on the first hounce be struck by the server's racquet so that it hits the front wall first and on the rebound hits the floor back of the short line, either with or without touching one of the side walls.

(e) Readiness. Serves shall not be made until the receiving side is ready, or the

referee has called play ball.

Rule 4.2—Serve, In Doubles. (a) Server. At the beginning of each game in doubles, each side shall inform the referee of the order of service, which order shall be followed throughout the game. Only the first server serves the first time up and continues to serve first throughout the game. When the first server is out—the side is out. Thereafter both players on each side shall serve until a hand-out occurs. It is not necessary for the server to alternate serves to their opponents.

(b) Partner's Position. On each serve, the server's partner shall stand erect with his back to the side wall and with both feet on the floor within the service box until the served ball passes the short line.

Violations are called "foot faults."

Rule 4.3—Defective Serves. Defective serves are of three types resulting in penalties as follows:

- (a) Dead Ball Serve. A dead ball serve results in no penalty and the server is given another serve without cancelling a prior illegal serve.
- (b) Fault Serve. Two fault serves result in a hand-out.
- (c) Out Serves. An out serve results in a hand-out.

Rule 4.4—Dead Ball Serves. Dead ball serves do not cancel any previous illegal serve. They occur when an otherwise legal serve:

- (a) Hits Partner. Hits the server's partner on the fly on the rebound from the front wall while the server's partner is in the service box. Any serve that touches the floor before hitting the partner in the box is a short.
- (b) Screen Balls. Passes too close to the server or the server's partner to obstruct the view of the returning side. Any serve passing behind the server's partner and the side wall is an automatic screen.

(c) Court Hinders. Hits any part of the court that under local rules is a dead ball.

Rule 4.5—Fault Serves. The following serves are faults and any two in succession result in a handout:

- (a) Foot Faults. A foot fault results:
- When the server leaves the service zone before the served ball passes the short line.
- (2) When the server's partner leaves the service zone before the served ball passes the short line.
- (b) Short Serve. A short serve is any served ball that first hits the front wall and on the rebound hits the floor in front of the back edge of the short line either with or without touching one side wall; or
- (c) Three-Wall Serve. A two-side serve is any ball served that first hits the front wall and on the rebound hits two side walls on the fly.
- (d) Ceiling Serve. A ceiling serve is any served ball that touches the ceiling after hitting the front wall either with or without touching one side wall.
- (e) Long Serve. A long serve is any served ball that first hits the front wall and rebounds to the back wall before touching the floor.
- (f) Out of Court Serve. Any ball going out of the court on the serve.

Rule 4.6—Out Serves. Any one of the following serves results in a handout:

- (a) Bounces. Bouncing the ball more than three times while in the service zone before striking the ball. One bounce is counted each time the ball hits the floor within the service zone. Once the server is within the service zone and the receiver is ready, the ball may not be bounced anywhere but on the floor within the service zone. Accidental dropping of the ball counts as one bounce.
- (b) Missed Ball. Any attempt to strike the ball on the first bounce that results either in a total miss or in touching any part of the server's body other than his racquet.
- (c) Non-front Serve. Any served ball that strikes the server's partner, or the ceiling, floor or side wall, before striking the front wall.
- (d) Touched Serve. Any served ball that on the rebound from the front wall touches the server, or touches the server's partner while any part of his body is out of the service box, or the server's partner intentionally catches the served ball on the fly.
- (e) Out-of-Order Serve. In doubles, when either partner serves out of order. Any points which may have been scored during an out-of-order serve will be automatically void with the score reverting to the score prior to the out-oforder serve.
- (f) Crotch Serve. If the served ball hits the crotch in the front wall it is considered the same as hitting the floor and is an out. A crotch serve into the back wall is good and in play.

Rule 4.7—Return of Serve. (a) Receiving Position. The receiver or receivers must stand at least 5 feet back of the short line, as indicated by the 3 inch vertical line on each side wall, and cannot return the ball until it passes the short line. Any infraction results in a point for the server.

(b) Defective Serve. To eliminate any misunderstanding the receiving side should not catch or touch a defectively served ball until called by the referee or it has touched the floor for the second time.

(c) Fly Return. In making a fly return, no part of the receiver's body or racquet may enter into the service zone. A violation by a receiver results in a point for the server.

- (d) Legal Return. After the ball is legally served, one of the players on the receiving side must strike the ball with his racquet either on the fly or after the first bounce and before the ball touches the floor the second time to return the ball to the front wall either directly or after touching one or both side walls, the back wall or the ceiling, or any combination of those surfaces. A returned ball may not touch the floor before touching the front wall. (1) It is legal to return the ball by striking the ball into the back wall first, then hitting the front wall on the fly or after hitting the side wall or ceiling.
- (e) Failure to Return. The failure to return a serve results in a point for the server.

Rule 4.8—Changes of Serve. (a) Handout. A server is entitled to continue serving until:

- Out Serve. He makes an out serve under Rule 4.6 or;
- (2) Fault Serves. He makes two fault serves in succession under Rule 4.5, or;
- (3) Hits Partner. He hits his partner with an attempted return before the ball touches the floor a second time.
- (4) Return Failure. He or his partner fails to keep the ball in play by returning it as required by Rule 4.7(d).
- (5) Avoidable Hinder. He or his partner commits an avoidable hinder under Rule 4.11.
- (b) Side-out (1) In Singles. In singles, retiring the server retires the side.
- (2) In Doubles. In doubles, the side is retired when both partners have been put out, except on the first serve as provided in Rule 4.2(a).
- (c) Effect. When the server or the side loses the serve, the server or serving side shall become the receiver; and the receiving side, the server; and so alternately in all subsequent services of the game.

Rule 4.9-Rallies. Each legal return

after the serve is called a rally. Play during rallies shall be according to the following rules:

(a) One or Both Hands. Only the head of the racquet may be used at any time to return the ball. The ball must be hit with the racquet in one or both hands. Switching hands to hit a ball is out. The use of any portion of the body is an out.

(b) One Touch. In attempting returns, the ball may be touched only once by one player on the returning side. In doubles both partners may swing at, but only one may hit the ball. Each violation of (a) or (b) results in a handout or point.

(c) Return Attempts. (1) In Singles. In singles, if a player swings at but misses the ball in play, the player may repeat his attempts to return the ball until it touches the floor the second time.

(2) In Doubles. In doubles if one player swings at but misses the ball, both he and his partner may make further attempts to return the ball until it touches the floor the second time. Both partners on a side are entitled to an attempt to return the ball.

(3) Hinders. In singles or doubles, if a player swings at but misses the ball in play, and in his, or his partner's attempt again to play the ball there is an unintentional interference by an opponent it shall be a hinder. (See Rule 4.10).

(d) Touching Ball. Except as provided in Rule 4.10, (a)(2), any touching of a ball before it touches the floor the second time by a player other than the one making a return is a point or out against the offending player.

(e) Out of Court Ball. (1) After Return. Any ball returned to the front wall which on the rebound or on the first bounce goes into the gallery or through any opening in a side wall shall be declared dead and the serve replayed.

(2) No Return. Any ball not returned to the front wall, but which caroms off a player's racquet into the gallery or into any opening in a side wall either with or without touching the ceiling, side or back wall, shall be an out or point against the players failing to make the return.

(f) Dry Ball. During the game and particularly on service every effort should be made to keep the ball dry. Deliberately wetting shall result in an out. The ball may be inspected by the referee at any time during a game.

(g) Broken Ball. If there is any suspicion that a ball has broken on the serve or during a rally, play shall continue until the end of the rally. The referee or any player may request the ball be examined. If the referee decides the ball is broken or otherwise defective, a new ball shall be put into play and the point replayed.

(h) Play Stoppage. (1) If a player loses a shoe or other equipment, or foreign objects enter the court, or any other outside interference occurs, the referee shall stop the play. (2) If a player loses

control of his racquet, time should called after the point has been decided, providing the racquet does not strike an opponent or interfere with ensuing play.

Rule 4.10—Dead Ball Hinders. Hinders are of two types—"dead ball" and "avoidable." Dead ball hinders as described in this rule result in the point being replayed. Avoidable hinders are described in Rule 4.11.

(a) Situations. When called by the referee, the following are dead ball hinders:

- Court Hinders. Hits any part of the court which under local rules is a dead ball.
- (2) Hitting opponent. Any returned ball that touches an opponent on the fly before it returns to the front wall.

(3) Body Contact. Any body contact with an opponent that interferes with seeing or returning ball.

(4) Screen Ball. Any ball rebounding from the front wall close to the body of a player on the side which just returned the ball, to interfere with or prevent the returning side from seeing the ball. See Rule 4.4(b).

(5) Straddle Ball. A ball passing between the legs of a player on the side which just returned the ball, if there is no fair chance to see or return the ball.

(6) Other Interference. Any other unintentional interference which prevents an opponent from having a fair chance to see or return the ball.

(b) Effect. A call by the referee of a "hinder" stops the play and voids any situation following, such as the ball hitting a player. No player is authorized to call a hinder, except on the back swing and such a call must be made immediately as provided in Rule 3.5 (b). The decision of the referee will be final as to whether or not the violation impeded the ensuing rally.

(c) Avoidance. While making an attempt to return the ball, a player is entitled to a fair chance to see and return the ball. It is the duty of the side that has just served or returned the ball to move so that the receiving side may go straight to the ball and not be required to go around an opponent. The referee should be liberal in calling hinders to discourage any practice of playing the ball where an adversary cannot see it until too late. It is no excuse that the ball is "killed," unless in the opinion of the referee the ball could not be returned. Hinders should be called without a claim by a player, especially in close plays and on game points.

(d) In Doubles. In doubles, both players on a side are entitled to a fair and unobstructed chance at the ball and either one is entitled to a hinder even though it naturally would be his partner's ball and even though his partner may have attempted to play the ball or that he may already have missed it. It is not a hinder when one player hinders his partner. Rule 4.11—Avoidable Hinders. An avoidable hinder results in an "out" or a point depending upon whether the offender was serving or receiving.

(1) Failure to Move. Does not move sufficiently to allow opponent his shot.

(2) Blocking. Moves into a position effecting a block, on the opponent about to return the ball, or, in doubles, one partner moves in front of an opponent as his partner is returning the ball, or

(3) Moving into Ball. Moves in the way and is struck by the ball just played by

his opponent.

(4) Pushing. Deliberately pushing or shoving an opponent during a rally.

Rule 4.12—Rest Periods. (a) Delays. Deliberate delay exceeding ten seconds by server, or receiver shall result in an out or point against the offender.

- (b) Time Outs. During a game each player in singles, or each side in doubles, either while serving or receiving may request a "time out" for a towel, wiping glasses, change or adjustment. Each "time out" shall not exceed 30 seconds. No more than three "time outs" in a game shall be granted each singles player or each team in doubles. No player may call a time out once the ball is in play. See Rule 4.1(d).
- (c) Injury. No time out shall be charged to a player who is injured during play. An injured player shall not be allowed more than a total of fifteen minutes of rest. If the injured player is not able to resume play after total rests of 15 minutes the match shall be awarded to the opponent or opponents. On any further injury to same player, the Commissioner, if present, or committee, after considering any available medical opinion shall determine whether the injured player will be allowed to continue.
- (d) A time out may be called by the referee, at the request of a player and after substantiation by the referee, because of faulty equipment or uniform. Two minutes are to be allowed for any uniform adjustment needed and 30 seconds for any equipment adjustment.
- (e) Between Games. A two minute rest period is allowed between the first and second games, at which times the players should NOT leave the court, without approval of the referee. A ten minute rest period is allowed between the second and third games, at which time players may leave the court.

(f) Postponed Games. Any games postponed by referee shall be resumed with the same score as when postponed.

Rule 4.13—Technical Foul. Results in a point or side out. It may be called by a referee at anytime, whenever he feels that a player has executed or exhibited unsportsmanlike conduct either vocally or by any other means during the course of a match. A third technical foul called upon any one single player during the course of a match will result in the automatic immediate forfeiture of that match.

Rule 4.14—Age Group Divisions. Age is determined as of the first day of the tournament.

- Female. Open division only. (This
 is subject to change, at the discretion of
 the tournament committee, depending on
 the size of the draw.)
 - (2) Male.
 - (a) Junior Open-18 and under.
 - (b) Open-everyone is eligible.
 - (c) Senior Open—35 years and over.(d) Masters—45 years and over.
- (e) Golden Masters-55 years and over
- (3) Doubles Teams. Ages apply as above.

PART V. TOURNAMENTS

Rule 5.1—Draws. (a) If possible, all draws shall be made at least two days before the tournament commences. The seeding method of drawing shall be approved by the International Racquetball Association.

(b) The draw and seeding committee shall be chaired by the IRA Executive Director and shall consist of the Executive Director, the National Co-ordinator, National Seeding Chairman, and the host tournament chairman. No other persons shall participate in the draw or seeding unless at the invitation of the draw and seeding committee.

(c) In local, state and regional tournaments the draw shall be the responsibility of the tournament chairman. In regional play the tournament chairman should work in co-ordination with the IRA representative at the tournament.

Rule 5.2—Scheduling (a) Preliminary Matches. If one or more contestants are entered in both singles and doubles, they may be required to play both singles and doubles on the same day or night with little rest between matches. This is a risk assumed on entering both singles and doubles. If possible the schedule should provide at least a one hour rest period between all matches.

(b) Final Matches. Where one or more players have reached the finals in both singles and doubles, it is recommended that the doubles match be played on the day preceding the singles. This would assume more rest between the final matches. If both final matches must be played on the same day or night, the following procedure is recommended:

The singles match be played first.
 A rest period of not less than ONE
 HOUR be allowed between the finals in singles and doubles.

Rule 5.3—Notice of Matches. After the first round of matches, it is the responsibility of each player to check the posted schedules to determine the time and place of each subsequent match. If any change is made in the schedule after posting, it shall be the duty of the committee or chairman to notify the players of the change.

Rule 5.4—Third Place. In championship tournaments; national, regional, state, etc., the loser in the semi-finals must play for third place or lose his ranking for the

next year unless he is unable to compete because of injury or illness. See Rule 3.5(d)(4):

Rule 5.5—IRA Regional Tournaments. The United States and Canada are divided into a combined total of ten regions.

(a) A player may compete in only one regional tournament per event.

(b) A player may make his own choice of the regional in which he wishes to compete.

(c) A player can participate in only two events in a regional tournament.

(d) Awards and remuneration to the IRA International Championships will be posted on the entry blank.

Rule 5.6—Tournament Management In all IRA-sanctioned tournaments the tournament chairman and-or the national IRA official in attendance may decide on a change of courts after the completion of any tournament game if such a change will accommodate better spectator conditions.

Rule 5.7—Tournament Conduct: In all IRA-sanctioned tournaments the referee is empowered to default a match if an individual player or team conducts itself to the detriment of the tournament and the game.

Rule 5.8—IRA Eligibility. Any paid-up IRA member in good standing may compete in any IRA-sanctioned tournament.

Rule 5.9—IRA International Championships. Starting in 1974, the International Singles and International Doubles are separated and will be played on two different weekends, with only four days (Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday) allotted to each tournament. Each age category will be limited to a maximum 64-player draw. Each player will be limited to one event. There will be a consolation round in each division.

- (1) Qualifying, Singles. A player will have to qualify at one of the ten regional tournaments. See Rule 5.5 (a).
- (a) The International Ratings Committee will handle the rating of each region and determine how many players shall qualify from each regional tournament.
- (b) All International finalists in each division will be exempt from qualifying for the same division the following year.
- (c) There will be a tournament one day ahead of the International Tournament, at the same site, to qualify eight players in each division who were unable to qualify or who failed to qualify in the regionals. This rule is in force only when a division is obviously over-subscribed for the 64-player limit.

(2) Qualifying, Doubles. There will be no regional qualifying for doubles.

Rule 5.10—Intercollegiate Tournament. It will be conducted at a separate date and location.

Rule 5.11—Invitational Tournaments. Eligibility by invitation only to the top 16 players or teams.

Rule 5.12—Round Robin Invitational Tournaments. Consist of 10 players (singles) or 10 teams (doubles). Tournament is conducted over three consecutive days. Each day's play consists of three (3) matches played on a round robin basis. Each match consists of one 31-point game. An individual or team limit of four times out is permitted for each match.

SUPPORT YOUR IRA

ONE-WALL & THREE-WALL

Basically racquetball rules for one-wall, three-wall and four-wall are the same with the following exceptions:

ONE-WALL—Court Size—Wall shall be 20 ft. in width and 16 ft. high, floor 20 ft. in width and 34 ft. from the wall to the back edge of the long line. There should be a minimum of 3 feet beyond the long line and 6 feet outside each side line and behind the long line to permit movement area for the players.

Short Line—Back edge 16 feet from the wall. Service Markers—Lines at least 6 inches long parallel to and midway bet-

ween the long and short lines, extending in from the side lines. The imaginary extension and joining of these lines indicates the service line. Lines are 1½ inches in width. Service Zone—floor area inside and including the short, side and service lines. Receiving Zone—floor area in back of short line bounded by and including the long and side lines.

THREE-WALL—Serve—A serve that goes beyond the side walls on the fly is player or side out. A serve that goes beyond the long line on a fly but within the side walls is the same as a "short."





FOOTWORK, DIVING, CONCENTRATION AND PHYSICAL CONDITIONING

Footwork

Of all the different aspects of racquetball and, for that matter, sports in general, footwork is probably the most underrated and the most taken for granted. Like heat is essential to cooking, so is footwork to racquetball.

It would be simple if the ball would cooperate by coming to you after your opponent's every shot. If that were possible, this chapter could have been omitted, and we could have gone on to discuss the more exciting elements of the game, such as strategy and the process of outsmarting your opponent. As it is the nature of the game to hit the ball away from your opponent, rather than to him, the necessity of dealing briefly with footwork is obvious.

Footwork is unique in the sense that it is the only ingredient of proper shot-making that will, by necessity, change every time you hit the ball. It has been, and will be, stressed throughout the book that consistency in the swing is essential. Of course, the angle of the shot, its height, where you plan to hit it, etc., will have their influence on your swing, but the fundamentals of the shot remain the same. Getting to the ball via footwork is another matter.

It is possible that the placement of your feet may never be the same for any two shots during a match. The distance to be covered to reach a shot, the time you have to get there, the location of your opponent and the type of shot you plan to hit all combine to force a change in the placement of feet for each shot. As such, it is a fundamental requirement of the game to master the art of footwork.

One of the more important things to remember about footwork is to keep the knees bent. When a person is standing straight-legged, the first thing he does before beginning to run is an involuntary and unconscious bending of the knees. Make sure they are already slightly bent and remain slightly bent throughout the point.

Ordinarily, the saying "stay on your toes" is an encouragement to be alert. In the case of footwork, however, it is to be taken in its most literal sense. Overall quickness is immeasurably increased and reaction time immeasurably decreased by staying posed on your toes. If you have trouble setting up for a shot once you have arrived in the general area of the ball, try bouncing lightly on your

toes. It will facilitate bringing your feet into proper position to swing the racquet.

The feet must be kept apart, but not too far. With your feet close together, you may trip if you suddenly turn for a quick pass. By the same token, the feet can be placed too far apart, resulting in slow and awkward movement. The proper stance depends on the individual. Usually, the feet should be about a shoulder width apart while standing poised in anticipation of the next shot.

When more than one or two quick steps are needed in moving for a shot, the first step should be taken with the foot furthest from your destination (i.e. move the left foot first to go right, the back foot first to go forward, etc.). By doing so, you will have avoided any unnecessary steps that could have caused you to miss, rather than reach, the ball.

When a player becomes fatigued, footwork is often the first part of his game to suffer. It is nearly impossible to hit a ceiling ball while stretching over your shoulder and running after the ball. It can be made easier by moving quickly and efficiently to outrace the ball and get in proper position to step into the ball for a balanced swing. Inadequate hustle and improper footwork are often the downfall of an exhausted or lazy player.

Diving

Diving is a technique of last resort being used by many players today. It is dangerous in the sense that a player is in poor position for a return if he doesn't hit a winner. More importantly, it can be physically dangerous.

Diving for the ball sometimes is the only possible way to make a return, but

it should not be attempted until it can be performed safely.

As strange as it may seem, a player should practice diving to learn the proper technique. It is recommended that you land on your chest or stomach rather than your knees or shoulder. If you must land on your knees, wear knee pads to minimize the possibility of injury.

There are right times to dive and wrong times to dive. Unless you are particularly adept, dive only when you cannot reach the ball any other way. When the score is 2-2 or 20-2 it is unwise to dive. When the score is 20-20, you'd better consider diving.

Once you have learned how to do it correctly, don't hesitate to dive if the situation warrants it.

Concentration

Once a racquetball player has trained his mind and body to physically respond in the form of a booming forehand, a well-placed backhand or an irretrievable serve, it is time to work on the pure mental part of the game. To become a successful tournament player, that intangible mental sharpness, otherwise known as concentration, must be attained and maintained.

Unfortunately, there are no drills a player can perform or diagrams he can draw to improve his ability to concentrate. Some people are innately better at concentrating than others, so that it is not impossible for a player of lesser physical strength and skill to defeat a superior opponent. Lapses in concentration can be as destructive as a poorly devised strategy or lack of conditioning.

Concentration is not easily defined, nor easily mastered. One thing, however, is certain, and that is that concentration should be involved in each aspect of your game. For instance, when you are hitting a ceiling ball a number of things should be going through your mind. Thinking about the correct stroke and follow-through, or where to go after hitting the ceiling ball, where your opponent may hit his next shot, or how hard to hit your shot are all among the possibilities that deserve your concentration.

It is nearly impossible to concentrate every minute of every match because of the tendency for the mind to wander. So, the closer a player can come to 100 per cent concentration, the more complete and well-rounded his game will be.

If he is thinking about his last mistake while attempting a kill on the next point, chances are he will miss the shot. It's fine to ponder a missed shot, but only until the next point begins.



Concentration and watching the ball are essential for playing well.

It is important that a beginning player concentrate on the techniques of hitting the various shots, or footwork, or any other fundamental. Eventually, the shots and the footwork will become habit, making it possible to concentrate on other aspects of the match. Think about where to hit the ball, where to move or your opponent's strategy.

In each match there are fixed components and variable components. The fixed components are my fundamentals. I know my limits, my shots, and I know I will hustle. Each will change very little from match to match, so that I can concentrate my attention on the variable components — my strategy and my opponent. I adjust to each situation by changing my strategy, but not my fundamentals. I look at my opponent and size him up in order to decide what type of strategy I should use.

There is little to compare with the pleasure derived from outsmarting your opponent. If he is in the back court and, expecting a short shot of some kind, comes rushing forward, only to be beaten with a passing shot to the back court, you will have reaped the benefits

of concentration. Without it, you might not have known where he was and where he was going.

Without concentration, your performance is limited. With it, your shots become sharper, your movement has a definite purpose and your confidence is heightened. For instance, a player's instinct tells him to chase the ball the moment it comes off the wall. If he does, he may find that he has run all over the court, only to discover that the ball ended up at the point where he began running. Energy and aggravation can be spared by concentrating, thinking, and anticipating where the ball will end up.

There are some subtle and not-sosubtle methods players have used to maintain concentration. Some players need only begin the game thinking about what they should do. Others need constant reminders. It is not uncommon to hear someone in the stands send down a vocal reminder to concentrate. It may even be necessary to write "concentrate" on your hand. Any device or scheme to help you concentrate is well worth the effort.

Unfortunately, some players will never be able to concentrate, even if the word is stenciled in foot-high letters on the front wall. He who realizes the value of concentration will be the better player for having done so.

Physical Condition

It is likely that, in a match between two players of virtually equal ability, the player who is in better physical condition will win. As suggested in the section entitled "Playing a Tournament Match," it is even possible to defeat a superior opponent by testing his stamina.

Poor conditioning is every bit as much of a liability as a poor backhand, forehand or serve. Tired players make for tired shots. If you are out of shape and exhausted, you are sapped of your ability to get full use out of the skills you have acquired.

The amount of conditioning necessary is dependent on a player's level of competition. There are those who play only once or twice a week, simply for the purpose of having a good time and regular exercise. The more serious player who competes three to five times a week probably will work himself into adequate physical condition by the act of playing.

For the player who enters tournaments, on-the-court activity is not sufficient. It should be supplemented by strenuous exercise and conditioning. If you are ever called upon to play three grueling matches of 2 to 3 games each in one day, you will understand why.

Popular conditioning exercises include jogging, sprints, jumping rope, swimming, lifting weights, pushups, pullups, and situps. They aren't intended to make a player muscle-bound, but only to prepare him for a rigorous tournament match.

Nothing is better than running for building up the legs and stamina. Before a practice match I will do 350 to 450 jump ropes and, after one to three hours of playing, finish my workout by doing either sprints or long-distance running. A lot of the boredom of exercising can be eliminated by variety.

My sprints consist of about 15 minutes of hard running for short distances, which is enough to completely wear me out. Every other day or so, I will run two to four miles, which, along with jumping rope and sprints, builds up my legs and increases my stamina.

I exercise my upper body in the mornings by doing situps and pushups. It's relatively easy to decide how many of each to do. When you can't do any more, you've had enough. Only by pushing yourself and making the muscles work to the point of pain will you get much benefit out of exercising.

The serious tournament player must not only reach a certain level of conditioning, but he also has to maintain or, better yet, continue to improve it. It is unrealistic to enter a tournament in poor shape and expect to win many matches. It is also unrealistic to expect to get in shape in a short period of time. Peak physical condition is the end-product of several weeks of work.

Work out a conditioning schedule for yourself and do your best to stick with it. The extra stamina and the muscles you develop will pay off on the court.

There's something about poor conditioning that takes the fun out of tournament racquetball.



For juniors, the open singles paragraph applies.







But when it came to the finals, the pros—the "old pros"—appeared to have improved even faster than their competition was growing up.


In the men's division, it was Brumfield. In the women's, it was Steding. Solidly and decisively, they turned back the best of the younger challengers.

Charlie Brumfield, the world's all time Number One Racquetball player, defeated a very, very, tired Steve Serot by the scores of 21-10, 21-5 to pick up another \$1,500 check in the second annual pro tournament, sponsored by Mr. William B. Tanner.

However, Charlie was not the whole story in this fine tournament. To show how the game is changing, we had five young men in the quarterfinals: Hogan, 17; McCoy, Wagner and Serot, each 19; and Bledsoe, 24.

To emphasize how young some of the pro players were, it was the first time in memory, that the hospitality room was supplied with more Gerbers than Schlitz. If the trend continues there'll be so many mothers on the tour we'll have to start a special division.

Perhaps, the star of the tourney was mercurial Davey Bledsoe who bested Steve Keeley in an earlier three game marathon. He then came back two hours later to lead Steve Serot, 20-16, in their third game, only to lose an incredibly heartbreaking match by the scores of 21-16, 19-21, 21-20.

Bledsoe's feat boggles the mind. Beating Keeley and Serot on two successive days is one thing. But, to come within one point of beating both of them in the space of five hours borders on the unbelievable.

Also, Peggy Steding, who recently suffered her first loss in over 200 matches, showed that she will be as tough as ever. After starting slowly, and dropping a 21-19 first game to Shannon Wright, she completely overwhelmed Shannon by the scores of 21-5, 21-5.

As for Brumfield, who reminded this writer that he is number one in ten all time categories (amazing, since there are only eight), his game seems to get better and better.

As Charlie said, before the match, "I'm going to run Serot as much as I can. In fact, he doesn't know it, but I'm going to attach a pedometer to his sweat sock. I know he'll be 15-20% slower from his match with Bledsoe.

"It really made me feel sad to see both of them running for two hours, getting cramped up, and just wearing themselves out."

Charlie, in an uncharacteristic show of emotion, said, "If I see that Steve is physically out of it, I won't try to run him to physical extremes. After all, I naturally want to win, but I don't want to inflict permanent physical injury. Permanent mental injury is another thing."

This was all said before the match. After the match, Charlie said, "I was awesome. I earned every point. Even if Serot had been fresh, he wouldn't have gotten many more points.

"I've got some bad news for the other players. I'm going to work harder than ever now. With all these young kids, and the way the game is growing, I'll have

"B-u-u-u-u-ut!! I'm still Number One and rising. I'm thinking of sending my tournament wins into the Guiness Book of Records. However, I don't know if they can spare 31 pages."

As for Serot, he literally had no comment after the match.

When I talked to Serot after the Bledsoe semifinal, he had just finished his shower with his clothes still on. He had his right ankle taped up, and his left ankle was badly swollen. His face was ashen gray, and he had to be helped out of the shower by two friends, and then placed gently down on the bench.

I said, "Steve, will you be ready for tomorrow's match with Brum?" Steve whispered in a voice so low that I had to put my ear next to his mouth, "Don't worry, Gar. I'll be ready. I'm in the best shape of my life."

When Steve was more relaxed, he said, "My style of play gears me to go three games. I'll get ten to eleven hours sleep, and I'll be ready to go."

Only Brumfield knew, as the saying goes, "whether he had it in the bag . . ."

Bledsoe was more realistic. Before Serot was to play Brumfield, I asked Davey, "Do you think Serot will be ready?" Davey replied, "I know how I feel. I don't see how Steve can be ready after our exhausting match." Davey was so right.

As for the Serot-Bledsoe match, it was one of the most exciting matches seen in a long, long time.

Davey and Steve were immaculate in their new doubleknit shirts and shorts. This was in marked contrast to the referee. Who else?—Mr. Bill Schmidtke.

Bill's clothes were so bad that when he was sitting by himself with an empty coffee cup just ten minutes before the match passersby deposited \$3.45 in change in the cup.

The match itself started out as a rout. Serot was hot, and Davey was obviously a little stiff, after his two hour marathon with Keeley. Before you knew it, Serot was ahead, 11-0.

From then on, the points were incredible. Although they went in spurts for each player, each point was marked by seemingly impossible gets, fantastic dives, and unreal shots.

Serot won the first game, 21-16; lost the second, 21-19, and was losing 20-16 in the third. Both players had bad leg cramps, and were obviously exhausted.

Brumfield never looked happier though, and kept pointing to his nose, saying, "I can smell the cramps, I can smell the cramps."

At 16-20, Serot and Bledsoe were standing close to each other. Just before Bledsoe swung at his shot, referee Schmidtke yelled hinder. It was a good call.

Bledsoe apparently didn't hear him, and swung anyway, rolling the ball flat out. Naturally, Bledsoe thought he had won, but the point had to be replayed. Serot got Bledsoe out of serve, and scored five straight points to win the match. It was a match that should not have had a loser.

Bill Schmidtke was also visibly upset. I tried to cheer him up by saying, "Bill, don't worry. It wasn't a bad call. But, perhaps you should send you wife and kids to the country for a couple of weeks."

Serot said, "It was the most exhausting match I have ever played. Bledsoe is the fastest player in the game. He made amazing gets, and the momentum kept changing. At 16-20, I just tried to play my game. It was a good call."

When asked why Bledsoe has improved so much, Serot, with a sly smile on his face, said, "Look at his racquet."

We did. It was a Steve Serot signature model.

We were kind to Davey. We didn't want to ask him about the match. We didn't have to.



In the other semis, Brumfield played Marty Hogan. Before the match Hogan said, "I've learned that my racquet will win, not my mouth." I replied, "If that's the case, I might as well retire."

I asked Marty, "Why are there so many good young players?"

Marty said, "We want to win more, and we've been taken too lightly. We're all playing super. Bledsoe, McCoy, Wagner, and I should be consistently in the top eight from now on.

"As for Charlie, he knows that I can beat him. I have already done it.

"I am a contender for the National Title, and any other tournament that I play in." We're glad that Marty is letting his racquet speak for him, and not his mouth.

"I don't have to practice against a Brumfield. I can work on my game, no matter who I play.

"I'll definitely beat Charlie, today."

Charlie must have gotten wind of Hogan's remarks. He started intimidating Marty right from the start.

Calling Marty every name from midget to Dumbo, Charlie won by the scores of 21-14, 21-12 in a display of high percentage racquetball.

Charlie said, "Hogan is small, and moves like a turtle. I just kept him moving. It was like watching an old time movie.

"I've been driving the ball on a 'V' the whole tournament. I don't really have to shoot. I'm like Green Bay used to be. I'll just keep running them until I get my shot. There is no way I can lose this tournament.

"If the court and ball are conductive to my game,

I'm super invincible. If it isn't, I'm just super."

Hogan spoke a little differently after the match. "He controlled the play too well. He has great desire. Since I have beaten him before, it was hard to get up for the match.

"I'll have to make some adjustments, but I'll be stronger in all areas."

Hogan has to be kidding. He couldn't get up for Brumfield? That's like saying Garfinkel is the most graceful player in racquetball.

Hogan also said, "The younger players will be in the top eight from now on." His reasons were because of their desire, and the chance to play the best.

I agree, but not completely. There are many young players. However, if they don't have the super talent of a McCoy or Hogan, all the play and desire in the world won't propel them to the top. They must be exceptionally gifted.

In the quarterfinals, Brumfield and Schmidtke

were involved in a mystery thriller entitled "What's in Da Bag?"

This all came about at 4-0 in the first game with Schmidtke leading. Brumfield broke his racquet, and started walking off the court and up the stairs.

I was reffing, and asked Charlie where he was going. Brum replied, "I'we got to call Charlie Drake to bring my other three racquets over." You all know Charlie Drake. He resembles Kojak's twin brother. Actually, Charlie is in charge of player relations for one of the top racquet companies. He takes care of his players with a fervor. In fact, after two of his players were involved in a long, tough, match, he ordered them into the shower. Someone remarked, "How can you talk to them like that?" Drake replied, "I own them."

Getting back to the match, Schmidtke claimed that Brumfield had racquets in his bag.

Suffice to say, Brum borrowed a racquet, and Drake showed up later. But, Charlie did manage to waste about six minutes.

Charlie won, 21-11, 21-15, in two identical games. He was ahead 17-5 in the first, and 19-9 in the second. Schmidtke would put on a brilliant finish each time, but it wasn't enough.

Bill claimed that Charlie's broken racquet episode hurt his concentration. I said, "Bill, Charlie wouldn't try to psyche you out like that." Bill replied, "Are you kidding?"

When Brum walked in, I said, "Charlie, let's see the inside of your bag." Charlie said, "I forgot the combination of the master lock on the bag?" I said, "Do you have any racquets in there?" Charlie just gave us both a smile, clutched his bag, and went out the door.

Brumfield later remarked, "Schmidtke plays as well as ever in streaks. Although he doesn't move as well as he used to, he's still a threat."

Schmidtke said, "I was dumb to play the ceiling so much with Charlie. No one can beat him like that, but I'd still like to have seen the inside of that bag."

On a serious note, the two time National Champion said, "I don't get as fired up as I used to. I've lost some confidence, and winning isn't the most important thing in the world now.

"I'm not shooting as well, and I tire quicker. Also, there are so many young kids coming up."

Bill's remarks haven't affected his dapper outfits. He was dressed for the interview with his Buddy All Star sneakers, his Oshkosh Open T-shirt that resembled a golfing sweater, because it had eighteen holes, and a pair of shorts that looked clean except—definitely—for one thing. The left leg was five inches shorter than the right.

As for Steve Keeley, he sounded very concerned about his quarterfinal match with Bledsoe. Steve, a veterinarian, was wearing his "Spay that Bitch" shirt, when I interviewed him during his flexibility exercises.

Steve said, "I'm enthused about my sneakers, and knee guards; but not my game. Also, I'm a little sad. I caught three tatrantulas in the mountains near San Deigo. Two of them: Theodore and Thomas just passed away." When asked what they died from, Keeley remarked, "Vasectomies!!"

"However," Keeley continued, brightening up, "Terrence is still left."

Davey remarked, "Keeley wasn't shooting well, but I'm winning the close ones now. I've had more experience. I'm playing harder, and I'm more patient on my shots. I'm not forcing, and I don't let the referee and linesmen bother me anymore." Davey Bledsoe may have been the star of the tournament

His self-evaluation is correct. He has improved tremendously. He will be tougher than ever.

We haven't mentioned Craig McCoy yet. Craig, a nineteen year old kid, now wears a large, bushy, moustache, that makes him look at least like a nineteen and a half year old kid.

He was playing Marty Hogan in the battle of the whiz kids in the quarters. They kept the pablum hot during the match in the hospitality room.

Hogan defeated McCoy, 21-13, 21-13, by moving the 6-2 McCoy all over the court.

Hogan said, "McCoy is quick as a cat, and I didn't want to pussyfoot around. I tried to give him hard serves, and then I would just shoot everything. I didn't want to throw away my points.

McCoy said, "The ball was bouncing crazily. It

was reacting strangely off the serves. It was doing all types of weird things. I hurt my foot at the end of the first game, and that didn't help either."

In the final quarterfinal match, Richie Wagner, from San Diego, by way of Patterson, New Jersey, played Steve Serot.

Richie's hometown of Patterson is among the nation's leaders annually in holdups, burglaries, and murders, so I was a little leery of interviewing him. Especially, when he showed up with two bodyguards carrying racquets in violin cases. (In Patterson they spell it with a "k" instead of a "q.")

Richie showed that he was more modest than most racquetball players, when he was asked why he was playing so well. Richie replied in one word, "Talent." Knowing his hometown background, I didn't argue.

Richie continued, "I hardly play at all. There is no one to play. I need competition. I would never have improved, if I hadn't gone to San Diego.

"Pro tourneys make you try harder. There is money to be made. As the game grows, different athletes will really start to play.

"Back in Patterson, I owe Freddie Rizzo everything. He got me started, and showed me some of the finer points. (Such as how to block your opponent more effectively, how to hide your double bounces, and how to psyche out your opponent.)

"Brumfield is the only one that I feel will be in the top four consistently. Keeley is losing interest. Strandemo is the most consistent; but he is hurting.

"I'm lucky. I can take a month off, and still be super. My greatest attributes are my talent, speed, and shooting on the run. Even so, I'll pick Brumfield to

win the tournament."

In the Serot-Wagner match, Richie jumped to a 16-8 lead. As Richie said, "I was controlling the play, but Serot was playing poorly. He got hot, and that changed the momentum. I lost, 21-17, and was down, 10-1, in the second.

"Even though I came back to 11-8, I was tired. I've got to get in better shape to win consistently."

As for Serot, Steve felt that he was playing super. Unfortunately, many of the top players and this writer included, feel that Serot may have peaked one and a half years ago.

He is still awfully tough, but he isn't as automatic on his shots as he used to be. There have been some nagging injuries that have bothered Steve, and this could account for his play.

In some of the more interesting round-of-sixteen matches, Davey Bledsoe defeated Bill (Ceiling Ball, Ceiling Ball, Ceiling Ball) Dunn by the close scores of 21-13, 17-21, 21-17. As Bill's nickname implies, he has a super ceiling game. In fact, when I asked Bill how he played, he replied, "My ceiling game was super." Davey said, he slowed down the game, and forced me to play his game. He is a tough competitor."

Marty Hogan defeated Ron Strom, 21-6, in the first game. Strom was down in the second, and made a great comeback to go ahead, 17-15. Marty held on to win, 21-17. Strom had defeated most of the country's top players, and is a gentleman on and off the court.

Craig McCoy defeated former IRA director Myron Roderick by the scores of 21-17, 21-18. Many of Myron's

friends were there, and they tried to show their appreciation for the job Myron had done with the IRA. (Myron was supposed to have been released from the hospital last Wednesday.)

In other pro matches, Charlie Brumfield overwhelmed Randy Stafford, 21-7, 21-5. Serot did the same to John Hennen, 21-6, 21-9. Keeley defeated Jerry Zuckerman, 21-15, 21-13, and Richie Wagner defeated Mike Zeitman, 21-15, 21-16, in two well played matches.

The youngsters are here to stay, and it is going to make this the most exciting year in the history of racquetball.

She defeated Shannon Wright by the scores of 19-21, 21-5, 21-5. After a slow start, Peggy completely dominated play with her forehand, power, and ceiling game. I have rarely seen her concentrate harder, and her Supergirl costume may not even have to be washed before the next toureny.

Peggy said, "I've had some close wins. All the girls are playing better. I've got to concentrate more.

"The loss really fired me up. The pressure is unbelievable. The girls better watch out, I've been eating an awful lot of cactus."

Even though Kenny won, he didn't find it easy. He defeated Rudi Losche, 21-16, 21-20, in the quarters; Steve Smith, 21-11, 9-21, 21-19, in the semis; and Randy Stafford, 21-18, 21-20, in the finals.

Kenny, who relies on a strong ceiling and passing game, until he gets his shot, was not as sharp as usual. But, he was good enough to represent the best of 44 open division players—top athletes from coast to coast.

The men's open mirrored the influx of extremely young players with 15-year-old Pete Teshie taking 20 points (in two games) from veteran Don Hodges.


Senior Singles







A total of 102 players enjoyed the three day tournament in Winona. Six states were represented in the entire field of players.


