### Michigan racquetballers trek to Ohio regional

The 1992 U.S. Ektelon/ American Amateur Racquetball Association Regional Racquetball Championships were held the last weekend in February at the Sawmill and Westerville Athletic Clubs and Columbus, Ohio. The qualifying event for the U.S. National Singles Championships was hosted by the Ohio Racquetball Association and its President Doug Ganim, ably aided by an excellent staff headed by Steve Lerner. The tournament was sponsored thankfully by the Olive Garden restaurant, which provided the magnificent hospitality all weekend, and Coors Light.

With a count of 425 players, this year's Regional was aptly dubbed "the largest racquetball tournament ever held in the state of Ohio". Add to that number 315 second division players and the enormity of this event is put into clearer focus. Some 94 Michigan players traveled to the Buckeye state and none did as well as Johnny Northern who captured double-gold in the Men's 30+ and 35+. "Superman"

Johnny, even made it through a truly murderous road on Sunday having to play six rounds to win both of his divisions. A lesser human would have thrown in the towel, but Johnny gritted his teeth and kept hitting photons to victory The only other winner from Michigan was Darla Furze from Flint who won the Women's C title. This was her first trek out of state to compete in a racquetball tourney and it certainly turned out to be a good

This year's Regionals have come and gone with many Michigan weekend warriors enjoying their trip to friendly Columbus, Ohio and the warm confines of both the Sawmill and Westerville Athletic Clubs. Hosted by the Ohio Racquetball Association, the whole tournament was run exceptionally smooth (albeit I cannot say who things went at the Westerville club since all my matches were at Sawmill) and complaints for such a large draw were few. Kudos to Ohio Racquetball Association President Doug Ganim and all of his fine staff for putting on a first class event. (Applause, applause)

I had hoped more Michigan players would have gone, but

it is a long trip (4 hours from Flint) and can get expensive with most players having to take off work Friday along with hotel, food, and gas bills. However, ninety-four players is not a bad representation considering this year's Regionals were so far away from most Michigan R-Ballers.

Personal kudos from myself go to good friend Johnny Northern who portrayed Superman on Sunday winning all six of his matches en route to double championships in the Men's 30+ and 35+. Honestly, at this level of play, at this age (99% of all 20 yearolds couldn't play this quality and intense ball without dying), Johnny has got to be called nothing short of phenomenal. Along the way, he had to defeat Ohio's Dave Koyanda (ranked #2 in the U.S.) in an unbelievable 11-10 tie-breaker, and he had to then beat Kovanda's fellow Buckeye Ron Woolard (ranked #5 in the U.S.). Logic would dictate that Johnny's power game would wane as the weekend wore on and the number of matches piled up, but his game stayed the same. He blasted photon after photon and it's hard to imagine being able to do something like that, but if I had my man's chisled physique, there'd be no stopping this finesse player then!

## Outdoor racquetball offers challenge to indoor game

EDITOR'S NOTE: The following article was submitted to The Racquetball Reporter last summer. I am reprinting it due to its suggestions and ideas which are pertinent to the ending of any racquetball season. As the summer approaches, don't put down that racquet!

It's summer and time to take it easy: play some golf, go on a few picnics, hit the beach and get a tan or try some watersports. Whatever you chose for summer enjoyment, it is definitely time to put away all the racquetball equipment until next Fall — after all, who wants to be cooped up inside, when there is great weather outside, right? Maybe, but who says that racquetball has to be played inside?

It may be summer, but it is actually a great time to grab a racquet (usually an old one) and head for the outdoor courts. If you have not tried racquetball outside, then you don't know what you are missing. The rules are basically the same as indoor racquetball, but the outdoor game is unique in itself. Let me explain.

First, there isn't a backwall in outdoor racquetball and a passing shot literally goes right past you Secondly, you cannot just cream the ball —

shots past the 40 foot mark on the fly are considered out and result in either a point or a side out. You might think this could never happen to you, but just spend a few minutes on an outdoor court and my point will be proven. Balls that hit just before the end line are still in play and one must go and return them — therefore it is expected that one has to hit a 50 foot kill shot at many times throughout the game.

The equipment necessary in outdoor racquetball can be found in most of our closets: old racquets (because concrete walls are tough on new ones), sun glasses, wide brim hats, suntan lotion and old racquetballs are just about all that you will need

### 20 Blakeslee Rules

- 1. Get your first serves in.
- 2. Keep the serve off the back wall.
- 3. Return the serve.
- 4. Make no mistakes.
- 5. Don't skip the ball.
- 6. Focus and concentrate.
- 7. Don't abuse the referee it is only one point.
- 8. Use your timeouts to conserve energy, start or stop momentum.
- 9. Score points in bunches.
- 10. Hit the ball when you can.
- 11. Play your game.
- 12. Cross court down the line return.
- 13. Down the line cross court return
- 14 Opponent in front? Pass.
- 15. Opponent behind? Pinch.
- 16. Think about strategy before the match.
- 17. Play text book racquetball percentages.
- 18. Cross train.
- 19. Use good equipment (Ektelon and eyeguards).
- 20 Give it all you got.





The following rules are being proposed for September 1, 1992.

### Proposed Change #1

- 1. <u>Current Rule</u>: A player may compete in only one regional singles and doubles tournament per year. See Rule 5.6 (a) on page 24 of the 1990-91 Official Rulebook. Note: The Board of Directors waived this rule for all 1992 Regional tournaments. So, this year, players may enter more than one tournament provided they do not enter a "Championship Event" (no skill designation) that they won at a previous regional tournament this year.
- 2 <u>Proposed change:</u> Make the waiver permanent by changing the rules to allow players to enter as many regional tournaments as they want provided they do not enter a "Championship Event" (no skill designation) that they won at a previous regional tournament that same year

### Proposed Change #2

- 1 <u>Current Rule</u>: Currently there is no rule requiring that players wear eyeguards or wrist thongs as they practice prior to the match or between games. At such times, however, the likelihood of being hit is greater than being hit during play due to the usual presence of more than one ball and decreased attention being paid to what the opponent is doing
- 2. <u>Proposed change:</u> Add the following as rule 2.5 (c): Equipment Requirement During Warm-up. Approved eyeguards must be worn and wrist thongs must be used during any oncourt warm-up period. The referee should give a technical foul if a player continues to not comply after receiving such a warning.

### Proposed Change #3

- 1 <u>Current Rule</u>: The racquet length, including bumper guard and solid parts of the handle, may not exceed 21 inches. For a few years, however, the AARA has granted a waiver permitting the use of racquets as long as 21.5 inches except in AARA Regional and National tournaments. See rule 2.4 (a) on page 7 of the 1990-91 Official Rulebook. Note: If this rule change is approved, the Board will be asked to consider granting a waiver until the new rule goes into effect.
- 2 <u>Proposed Change:</u> Revise Rule 2.4 (a) to read: "The racquet, including bumper guard and all solid parts of the handle, may not exceed 21.5 inches."
