President's Message: A Perspective on 10 Years in Albuquerque

The current Charles Kuralt TV documentary entitled, "On the Road to '95, Ten Years of the World Seniors," is quite entertaining and powerful. Not since I saw Mr. Kuralt's lead-in to the 1976 "Bicentennial," has any show hit me so hard. With stops in Carlsbad at the Caverns and the White Sands National Monument in June, he paused long enough for a hot shower at the Las Cruces Motel 6, and to catch his breath after devouring a bowl of Hatch green chile stew. We next saw him move northeast into the Sacramento Mountains to play a round of golf at the Victorian resort at Cloudcroft. The show ended while he was wagering on some horses at the Ruidoso Downs Race Track nearby.

In July, Mr. Kuralt and crew were seen in the northeastern part of New Mexico, on foot in the Pecos Wilderness negotiating switchbacks, before turning in at the historic "haunted" Plaza Hotel in Las Vegas. Next it was on to Santa Fe for a luncheon at the La Fonda Hotel before an afternoon excursion at Bandelier National Monument to view ancient Anasazi ruins. The next day we saw him in his motorhome traversing the streets of Los Alamos to find a scientist or two to interview about radioactive fallout. His radio was playing oldies on KBOM.

In early August, the documentary opened during a bed and breakfast reprieve in Durango, Colorado, in preparation for a rafting tour down the Animas River in the Four Corners Region. Next it was down 666 through the Navajo Reservation toward Gallup to shop and interview the mayor about his successful closure of all drive-up liquor establishments.

Mr. Kuralt and crew recently moved eastward along historical Route 66 into Albuquerque, securing a room in an early 20th century hotel and experiencing some

fine southwestern cuisine. He had indicated an interest in attending our 10th Anniversary Banquet. First, however, he needs a Sandia Aerial Tram Tour, a Nob Hill walking tour of eateries and boutiques, and enough time to sip some cafe ole at a dessertery and read "The rest of the WSRC story" this last decade.

While many of us are still playing and working to create our *Racquetball Vacation*, some have not been fortunate enough to stick around. We mourn the passing of **Joseph Goldstein, Howard Cole, Al Wetherill, Mike Steele, Pierre Miller, and John Becker**. The Academy Court Club and Rio Grande Club have also passed on.

Most of you probably do not remember the 85 first-timers in '85. Some of us were still shy of enough years to participate! Can you believe we played to 7 points? Congrats to **Mary Walker** for pushing for more players of the feminine gender; we are approaching the century mark for women players, a far cry from the 9 women in '85.

And what about the first banquet with **Jordan Teplitz** performing Buddy Hackettesque to the delight and howling of many of us, but to the offense of a few in attendance. He has not been back since! When we were first designated World Senior Championships in '89, our Bavarian friend **Walter Shtick** arrived with a beautiful fraulein a third his age, sharing lodging quarters in a tent pitched behind the now-defunct Academy Court Club.

And what about the match of the decade when **Dario Mas** met **Ernie Nellos** in the

Twenty countries represented, not a small feat considering political and economic realities. We certainly are not a novelty any longer, just an old-fashioned good time amongst friends and quality people.

WSRC Awards First New Mexico College Scholarships

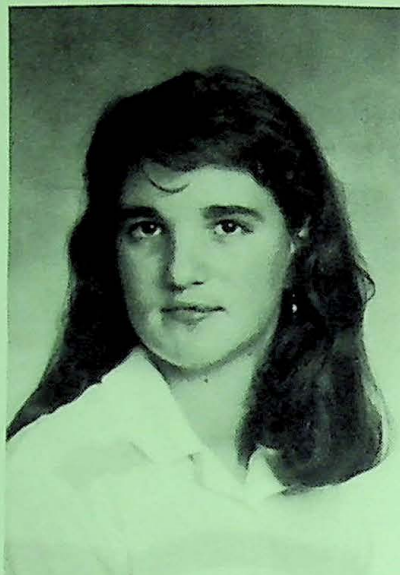
In conjunction with the Sixth World Senior Racquetball Championships (WSRC) and the 10th Anniversary of its senior racquetball tournament in Albuquerque, the WSRC Council is proud to announce the winners of the its first two New Mexico WSRC college scholarships. The WSRC Council has awarded \$500 each for the Fall 1994 semester to **Rachel Gellman**, a junior at UNM, and **Raymond Maestas**, a third-year law student at UNM.

Rachel Gellman is a 20-year-old junior at UNM. She is pursuing a degree in journalism which she expects to complete in December 1995 and works for the university's newspaper, *The Daily Lobo*. She is also an accomplished racquetball player having placed 1ST at state and regional tournaments and 3RD at national singles in the women's 19+ division this last year. In the women's open division, she placed 1ST at the New Mexico state singles and 3RD at the Region 12 event.. She is nationally ranked in the top eight in the women's 19+ division.

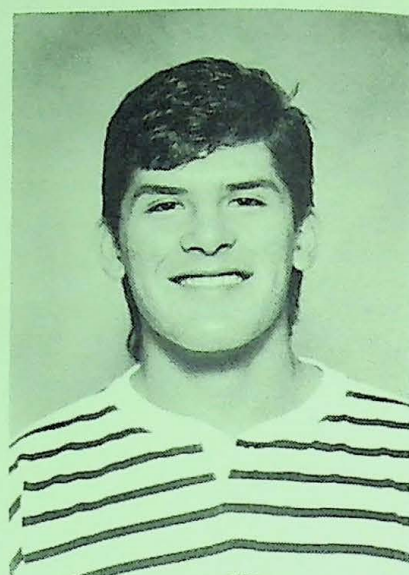
Rachel was also a member of the U.S. National Junior Team and had the opportunity to play and teach racquetball during the team's tour of Europe. She says, "Racquetball is a sport that enhances you mentally and physically. To me, racquetball is not just a means of exercise. It is a game that requires mental and physical strength. You are able to push yourself to the limits while still having fun." Rachel also plays soccer in the Albuquerque Women's Soccer League and is an instructor for the junior racquetball program at a local club.

Born in Espanola, and a graduate of West Las Vegas High School in Las Vegas, **Raymond Maestas** is a third-year student in the School of Law at UNM. He received a Bachelor's degree in Business Administration in 1992 from UNM. Raymond is a member of the NMRA Board of Directors and has competed in state, regional, and national events in the Men's A division. He attended the 1993 AARA National Elite Training Camp in Colorado Springs, Colorado, and has passed the PARI Level I and II exams.

Raymond has a long history of working with youth sports programs. He has been an instructor for the junior racquetball program at High Point Sports and Wellness Club, an instructor and coach for the National Youth Sports Program in Las Vegas; a baseball coach for the Las Vegas Little League Senior Division; and a basketball coach at Armijo Elementary School in Las Vegas. About his introduction to and love of racquetball, Raymond says, "After what I consider a successful high school athletic career, I suddenly

found my 'competitive juices' thirsting for excitement. In 1987, my father's friend who played racquetball gave us two metal racquets. We have played ever since. The lasting friendships and countless memories I acquire through the sport only make stronger my 'love affair' with the game."

The success of this senior event over the past ten years is due in large part to the tremendous support of the Albuquerque community. Year after year, so many local sponsors and volunteers have donated their time, money, and talents to support tournament operations and fund-

raising activities. In the tenth year of this event, the WSRC Council is proud to have established and awarded the first two New Mexico WSRC Scholarships. This is the first year for the program, which uses monies generated from the *Olympic Dream* fundraising efforts. Full-time students who attend any New Mexico college or university, maintain a minimum 2.5 GPA, and have some involvement in the racquetball community are eligible to apply for the scholarship. The application deadline for the Spring 1995 semester is **November 15, 1994**.

The 1994 Ektelon AARA U.S. Junior Olympic Racquetball Championships were held in Chattanooga, Tennessee June 25-29, 1994, at the Sports Barn and the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga. Both sites were very hospitable to both players and families. Eighty-four girls and 205 boys participated in the tournament. New Mexico was represented by **Ben and Nathan Bowles**, Roswell; **Rebecca Dolloff**, Hobbs; **Jeni and Jesi Fuller**, Albuquerque; and **Craig Spencer**, Roswell. Next year's Junior Nationals will be held in Anaheim, California.

Effects of Waivers and Releases

Last issue, I discussed the general effect of releases and waivers and how they operate to protect health club operators, tournament directors/sponsors, and other involved parties from liability for injuries by persons while either exercising or participating in a tournament.

While releases indeed limit liability, they do so only if the injured person is an adult. For minors, releases are generally unenforceable if signed by a minor and/or the minor's parent. Based on the minor's lack of capacity to contract (i.e. agree to the terms of the release), a release signed by a minor is unenforceable because he can disaffirm it.

For a sport or recreational activity, a parent's signature is usually required for a child to participate. We have all seen tournament entry forms that require a parent's signature if the participant is less than 18 years old.

But what is the effect of a parent's signature on the release? While it is recognized that parents may release their claims based on a child's injury, the parent cannot release his child's claims for the same injury. It is generally rec-

Sixth World Seniors

Championship round competition for the Sixth World Senior Racquetball Championships came to a close with a marathon, 3-hour Men's 40 finals match between **Gary Mazaroff** of New Mexico and **Phillip Parker** of Pennsylvania.

The 1994 tournament was held Tuesday, August 30, 1994, through Sunday, September 4, 1994, in Albuquerque. This year, 370 players representing seven countries participated. Throughout the duration of the tournament, over 1600 matches were played, with championship matches held on Sunday, September 4, 1994.

ognized that a parent's signature on a release does not bar his child's possible claims.

For example, in a racquetball tournament, if a minor is negligently injured, both the minor and his parent(s) might each have a legitimate claim (i.e., lawsuit). However, if the parent signed a release in order for the minor to participate, only the parent's claim(s) would be precluded. The minor could still recover for the injury.

While not enforcing releases for minors, courts usually base their decisions on public policy. For example, consider the situation where parents are unwilling or unable to provide for a seriously injured child. The child has no legal recourse against the negligent party to acquire resources needed for care if the child's parents had the authority to release the child's claims prior to injury. To prevent this injustice, it is uniformly recognized that a release signed by a parent does not waive an injured child's claim(s). Therefore, a negligently injured child can still recover for his injury even if he and/or his parent(s) signed a release.

This tournament is also a designated fundraiser for *The Olympic Dream* of racquetball, an effort to support the establishment of racquetball as a full-medal, Olympic event. At the tournament banquet and auction on Sunday evening at the Ramada Classic Hotel, **Paula Sperling**, President of the WSRC Council, presented **Mike Arnolt**, member of the AARA Board of Directors, with a check for \$10,000 as an initial contribution. The WSRC Council expects the total contribution from this tournament to reach over \$20,000.

Tournament operations were headquartered at Tom Young's Athletic Club, where competition began at 8:00 AM, Wednesday, August 31, 1994. Matches also took place at Midtown Sports and Wellness.

This is the 10th year this senior racquetball tournament has been held in Albuquerque. It was first hosted by the NMRA in 1985 as the North American 40+ Championships. Eighty-five players participated. In 1989, it was designated as the WSRC and an official fundraiser for *The Olympic Dream* of racquetball. Over \$2,000 was raised that year. In the last four years, the WSRC has raised over \$75,000.

The format for this tournament is unique among international racquetball competitions. It provides competition for senior men and women ages 35 to over 80, in five-year-increment age-group divisions, in a round-robin format that guarantees each participant at least seven preliminary-round matches.

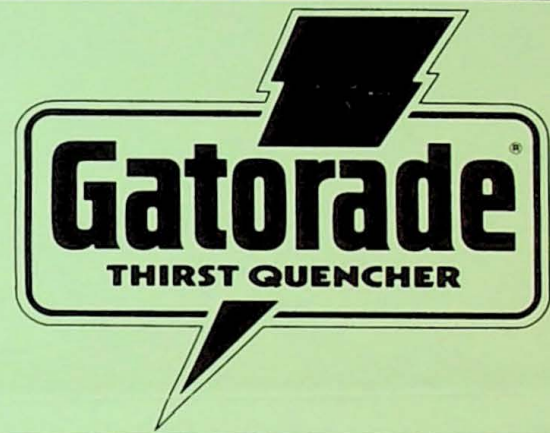
