We have a new website that will be up and running with a lot more information for you by the time you get this. Please give us your ideas and feedback.

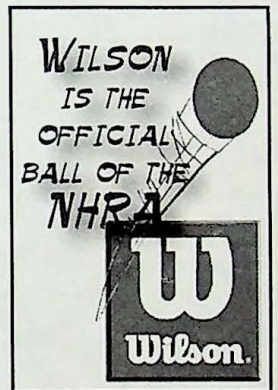
We have added a new event similar to the Granite State Cup format, but Doubles. We will also include other

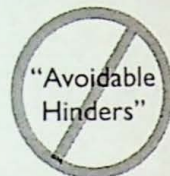
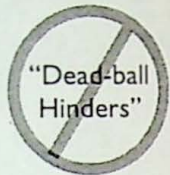

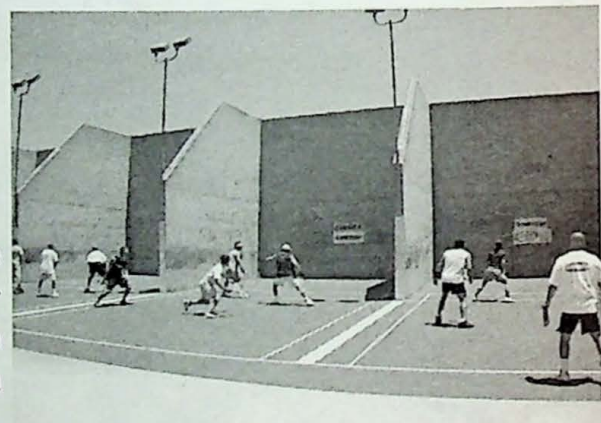

Outdoor Racquetball • Suzanne Gale

I took a trip this July to Huntington Beach, California to check out the Outdoor Nationals, which are held there every year. Since there have been rumors of outdoor courts being built at the Executive in Manchester, I thought it would be a great idea to check out the event.

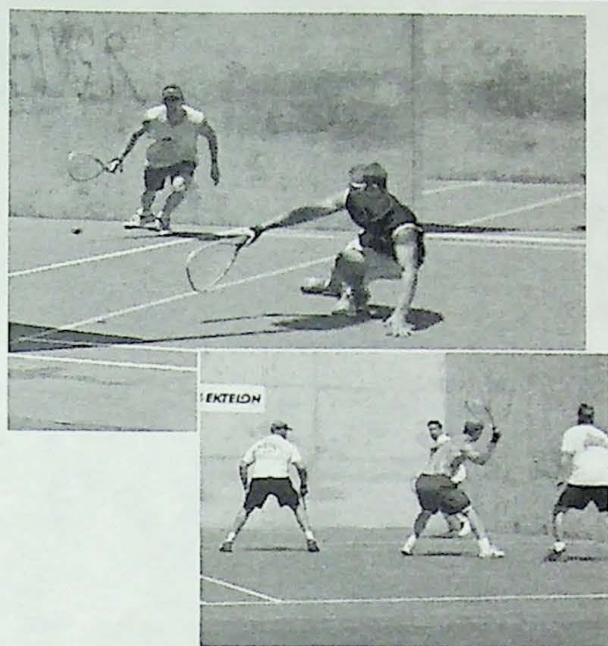


Outdoor racquetball, while played with the same racquets and balls used on an indoor court, the sport is completely different. The side walls (if there are any) vary in length, from the full-court side walls at the club in Boston where Cliff Swain holds a yearly outdoor tournament, to walls that are only 1/4 of the length of the court, like the ones in Hawaii. The courts in California have high walls that end just past the service line – the length of these walls makes a huge difference in the player's shot selection. I quickly realized that having indoor experience wasn't going to help me win any matches. Shots that are great indoors simply won't work outdoors. There are also many shots that would be sitting ducks on an indoor court that are fantastic when playing outside. High, firmly struck lobs are a great defensive play – the same shot in racquetball would come flying off the back wall to set your opponent up for the kill.

Outdoor racquetball also requires more control – the .....continued on page 3

back and side walls on an indoor court can keep you in a rally, even when you've hit a horrible shot. As long as it hits that front wall, you can still win the rally. Far more control is needed to keep the ball in bounds and hitting overhead serves is the way to go on your service game. Outdoor players love to take on the indoor racquetballers, knowing that the angles are likely to frustrate opponents who are new to the game. A favorite shot of many outdoor players is to hit a high pinch that you think is going to sit up high, a nice plum for a down

the line kill. Instead, the spin on the ball sends it angling off the court, parallel to the front wall while you are still setting up for a straight in shot.

Once you get accustomed to the difference in court dimensions and strategy (in doubles, lefties are expected to play the right side!), outdoor racquetball is a great experience that should be tried by anyone with access to a court. The sun is shining, the birds are singing and you can play racquetball in the summer without being locked inside. Pull up a lawn chair, grab a drink and watch the pros play while the tournament director's are getting together some BBQ for the event's hospitality. The players can hear every comment you make and they enjoy interacting with the crowd – it's an atmosphere unlike any other in racquetball.

There aren't that many courts outside of sunnier climates unfortunately. There are many courts in NY and also in Detroit, but most courts are in California, Florida and Hawaii. It was worth the trip out there though, just to check out another side of racquetball and to see an indoor pro take the title for the 2<sup>nd</sup> time. Rocky Carson did the impossible again this year, defeating outdoor king, Brian Hawkes, in the semis and then avenged his 2003 semifinal loss to Dave Genevay by defeating him in the final. If you ever get the chance, outdoor racquetball is a sport that is both fun to play as well as being a great spectator sport. Check it out!

## NHRA Spotlight Player • Kip Jackson

I started playing racquetball over 6 years ago. I was fortunate enough to live very close to the Nashua Athletic Club when I moved to Nashua. I used to watch people play whenever I was taking a break while working out. I was intrigued by the pace of the game and thought it might be challenging to try. I was also getting tired of trying to find sports which allowed me to compete. I was getting sick of trying to find places to play basketball in the area and the racquetball courts were right near my house. So I gave it a try and really enjoyed the game. Unlike many other sports you can take up racquetball and have a good time right away, especially if you are playing with people at your own skill level. I was also fortunate enough to start playing when there were a number of very good veteran players at our club and also a number of people just starting out. Most of these players still play on a consistent basis so it was easy to develop a positive relationship both on and off the court.

I think the NAC is great because you can go and play 7 days a week with (and against) a variety of different playing styles and personalities. You can go Monday, Wednesday, and Friday to play singles and doubles; Tuesday and Thursday to play more doubles and also the challenge court; Saturday afternoons for Jungle Rules Doubles; and Sunday morning's for some good hangover racquetball which can include singles and doubles. Monday evenings also has the Ballbuster's league which provides a great mix of being extremely competitive but with a group of people that you can hang out with afterwards to watch a ball game and have some beers.

The thing I love most about the game is that it's physical, mental, and emotional. It is a great sport. The speed of the game is obviously appealing, but there is a great deal of strategy involved. When you first start playing you think you just have to hit it as hard as possible but there are so many nuances to the game. Since I am not very smart, I obviously do not pay attention to these nuances and revert back to trying to hit the ball as hard as possible when playing in tournaments. You have to make so many decisions in a very short period of time with the proper mechanics to execute the correct shot AND be prepared for your opponent to counter your move. Every shot, every rally, every point, every game. I try to explain the sport to people that do not play and it is difficult to communicate all that is involved in playing. You are playing chess but with the intensity of football.

I love playing in tournaments. I get to compete against other players above or at my level in a different environment with the intensity of each match getting greater and greater. And afterwards we can hang out



and have a beer. I also enjoy watching other matches and hanging out with people from different clubs that I normally don't get a change to see.

I am trying to grow the sport by playing with anyone that asks me regardless of their level. I think some people do not encourage beginners to play enough because it might be boring to play them. But everyone at one point starts at that level and it can get discouraging some times if people will not play with you. I also have started to assist Dennis Krysiak in doing beginner's clinics at various locations in Massachusetts and I would like to try and get more kids to play the sport.

Dear State Presidents,

The United States Junior National Team has been selected to represent the U.S. at the Junior World Championships in San Luis Potosi, Mexico in December 2004. It is a small, but very talented team with 16 athletes, many of them double qualifying.

Due to USRA budget cuts, the funding for the Junior National Team does not exist this year. Each athlete and coach must pay for their own airfare, hotel, entry fee, and uniform. This is at a minimum \$1,500 per child. Some of our families can afford this, many cannot. It would be a shame that we could not send our best team to Mexico, based on who could afford to go.

It was difficult to tell the parents and athletes that they must pay to go to the World Championships, however we have all chosen to take responsibility and get ourselves there. One of our ideas was to come to you the state organizations and ask for your help. We are hoping that you will consider us a worthy cause for your donation.

Whatever amount your State Association is able to share would be greatly appreciated, and will be used for helping develop the future of racquetball. If you have any questions, or have any ideas of how we could raise money please feel free to contact me at, 603-759-2729.
