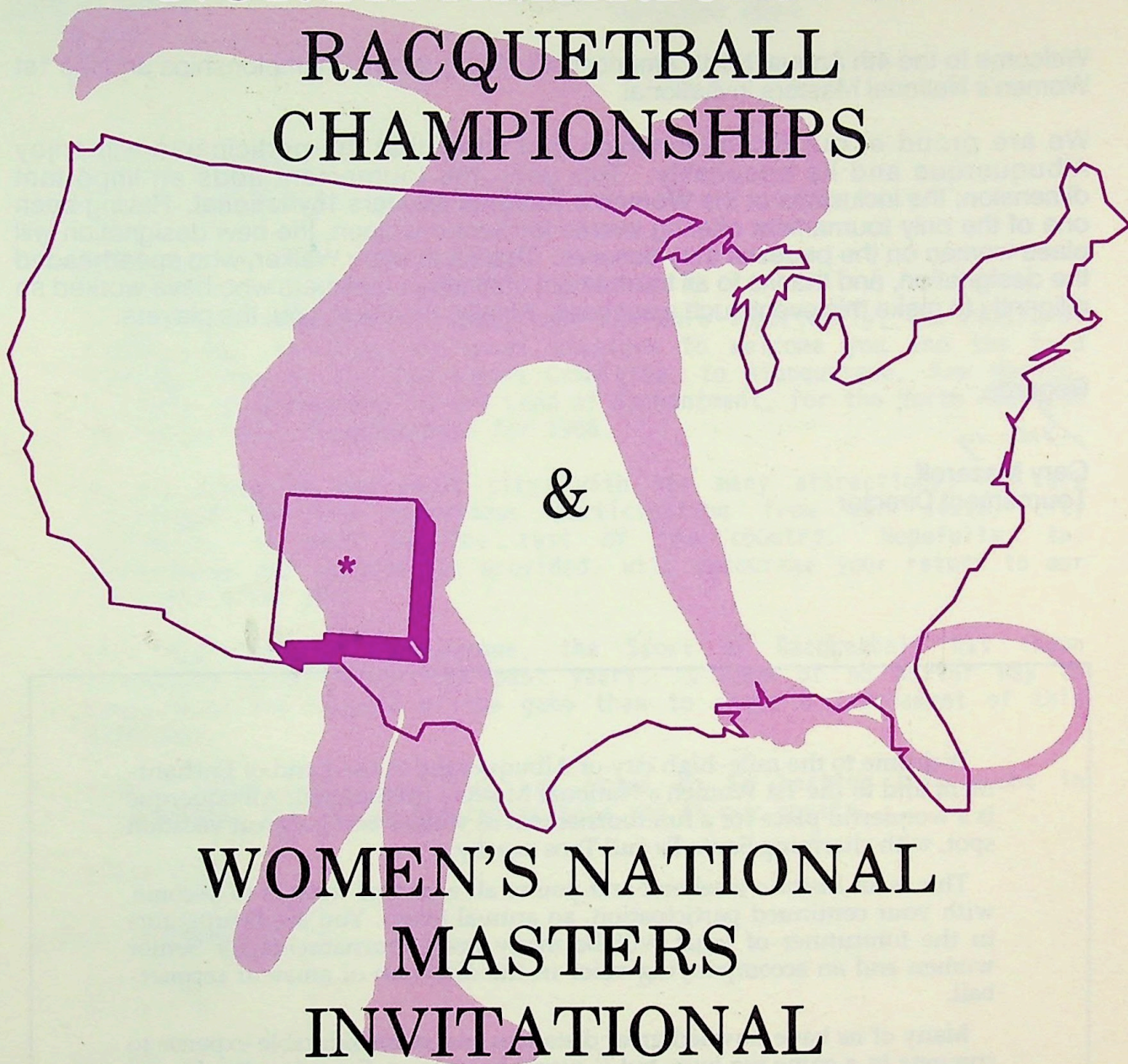

TOURNAMENT RULES & GUIDELINES

American Amateur Racquetball Association Rules apply, unless otherwise designated.

All matches are self-officiated. Please remember **the drive serve rule, the screen serve rule, and the eye-guard rule.**

Official Ball: PENN BLUE

Players will be given a game ball for each match, which will be returned upon completion of the match.

Players will be provided with a score card and a pencil for each match. It is the winner's responsibility to return the card and pencil to the control desk, immediately following the match, with the proper scores of each game recorded. Failure to do so may affect the outcome of the standings.

For Thursday and Friday Matches: Each match consists of 3 games to 11 points, with normal scoring procedure. Make certain that 3 games are played, regardless of the outcome of the first 2 games. The scoring tally system is as follows:

1 point for each point scored
3 points for each game won
<u>7 points for each game won</u>
49 possible points earned per match

For Saturday Matches: (note that all players participate on Saturday)

For single or double round-robin divisions, continue play from Thursday and Friday schedule.

For divisions with more than one flight, Championship rounds with single elimination format to determine all final positions per age division.

For the Championship Flight Divisions **only**, play the best 2 out of 3 games to 11 points.

Matches are scheduled at 45-minute intervals. Please be on time for your match. The 10-minute forfeiture rule will be in effect. Players who report early will likely be able to begin their match before the designated time.

Towels will be provided by Academy Court Club.

Shuttle service to and from the Club and hotel will be provided. Check the tournament desk for schedule.



Playing His Best Is Nello's' Main Aim

ERNIE NELLOS doesn't worry about winning racquetball tournaments anymore, although he has won several in the 18 years he has played.

His most prestigious titles of recent years are two national age 40-and-over championships.

Nellos is the two-time champ in the 45 division of the North American 40-and-over Racquetball Championships, which have been played at the Academy Court Club the past four years.

This year, the tournament will also include the Women's National Masters Invitational for players 35-and-over. The tournaments run simultaneously at Academy, Sept. 8-10.

"I really don't even look to see who I play in tournaments anymore," said Nello, 49. "I don't really care if I win tournaments so much as I care if I go out and play the best I can each time. I still play to win, but I'm just not in this sport for the tournaments."

Nello is into racquetball for exercise. He started playing when he was 30, which he said was too late. But he added he has made the most of his late start.

"Anytime is a good time to pick up this sport," he said. "But if you want to be at a more competitive level, like open players, I would think that you would have to start a little earlier than I did."

Nellos is a self-taught player. He didn't have intricate lessons. His techniques are the ones he from the school of hard knocks.

Nellos and his friend Clay Childs would play five days a week. That lasted for a year at the University of New Mexico courts, he said.

"We would play there, legally or illegally, all year," Nellos said laughing. "I wasn't a student, but Clay was. It was fun and, at that time, UNM was one of the only places with courts."

Childs and Nellos were equal when they began, which made the learning process that much more fun.

Now, Nellos only plays two or three days a week, but with the same intensity. All that holds him back now are aching knees, on which he has had three operations.

"I still play, but it's mainly for the exercise now," said Nellos, who owns the Quarters Restaurant in Albuquerque. "Anymore, my knees won't really allow me to play more than that without a lot of pain. The two days or so is enough for me to get my exercise."

When Nello enters the North American Championships, he said he won't be surprised if there are many more players after the title. The tournament has been increasing in popularity throughout the country. "I hope it does get bigger and better," said Nello. "It's good to play

tough, competitive racquetball in your own division."

Nellos still plays many people who aren't in his age division. He has played some of the state's best, including Tom Neil and Gary Mazaroff.

"Those guys are in a whole different

league," said Nello. "And believe me, when we play, it's just for fun."

Nellos tries not to let his worn joints or minor flare-ups of arthritis dampen his spirit. And although it's not the most important part of his game anymore, winning is still one reason he plays.

"I played a 14-year-old kid the other day," he said. "I played well in the first two games, but the kid didn't get tired and he beat me anyway."

"It was good to play like that and not win. But the reason I still enjoy it is because sometimes I still win. It's like that thrill of victory and agony of defeat thing on television. Winning is still a thrill."

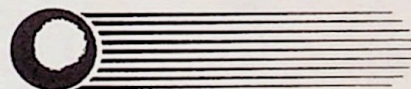

Racquetball coach looks to Olympics

Wants to add sport to Games

To say that Gary Mazaroff sees the world through the strings of a racquetball racquet is only a slight exaggeration.

The man has dedicated a large portion of his life to the game.

He was a professional racquetball instructor for 16 years. He was a member of the U.S. National Racquetball Team. Eight times he was ranked the No. 1 player in New Mexico.

But now Mazaroff, an Albuquerque real-estate agent, has broadened his view of the game.

As one of two assistant coaches for the U.S. National Team, Mazaroff would like to see racquetball grow into an Olympic sport.

But first racquetball has to get its foot in the door.

That brings Mazaroff to Operation Barcelona — a trip to Barcelona, Spain, the site of the 1992 Olympics, to convince the organizers to make racquetball an exhibition sport that year.

"Four players and two coaches off the U.S. National Team will go to Barcelona after the World Championships to play in a tournament there and to present evidence in an attempt to convince them that it should be an exhibition sport," Mazaroff said.

"To make racquetball an Olympic sport isn't critical because so many sports aren't Olympic sports. But if it did become an Olympic sport, that would be a tremendous boost to the game."

"It would be important in terms of exposure and because of all the potential monies that would flow down. If we could get some of those monies into the grass-root areas, the support areas, the junior programs, it would be a great plus."

The two coaches who make the trip to Barcelona will be determined after the World Racquetball Championships to be conducted Aug. 5-13 in Hamburg, Germany. This tourney is Mazaroff's next assignment as an assistant coach.

He said the United States should be favored to win the world championship, with the strongest threat coming from Canada. The World Championships are conducted every two years.

"Coaching this team is the opportunity of a lifetime," Mazaroff said.
