## Michigan Racquetball Mourns Ray Vanover

Labor Day weekend the racquetball world lost one of its most flerce competitors, and most colorful players. Ray Vanover was likely caught off guard by a large wake and thrown from his 27 foot powerboat near the Crand Haven State Park on Lake Michigan. A witness who spotted Vanover's body in the water jumped to rescue him, but Ray disappeared under the surface before the swimmer could reach him. The US Coast Guard was unsuccessful to locate Ray's body for nearly ten days when a fisherman finally spotted his body not too far from the original site of the accident.

Ray at times, was very expressive, full of feeling and spirit. He never wanted to lose, and never would quit. He loved racquetball and at one time was the best of the best in our state. Aside from his love for tournament action, Ray was an excellent teacher of the sport and one of our best promoters.

Off the court, Ray was one of the kindest individuals you could ever meet. A very popular high school industrial technology instructor, and a teacher who really cared a great deal for his students. We will all miss Ray, the tournaments just aren't the same without him.

Ray is survived by his wife Laura, who he married just a few months ago, his two daughters and two step-children.


#### RACQUETBALL ONE'S HOLIDAY EVENT SET FOR DECEMBER 9-11 IN GRAND RAPIDS

I apologize for not including the names of both finalists in all divisions of the 1994 State Singles tournament in the last issue of The Racquetball Reporter.


Please understand that all information printed is

During my seven years here in the Motor City, I have met some beautiful people on and off the court. I look forward to us working together for the best interest of Michigan racquetball.

### Chris writes home...

Greetings Everyone,

I am sitting in Hobby Airport in the flooded out city of Houston, awaiting a plane to take me away from this wet mess. My neighborhood was only slightly waterlogged—the water was about ten feet from my front door and cars parked in the street had water covering their hoods, not nearly as bad as Northern Houston that saw homes completely washed away or water levels reaching the rooftops. I have not even been down here for six months before a we have a major weather catastrophe and hurricane season has yet to bring a nasty storm to this area.

My job is progressing well, I have developed a great working relationship with the General Manager at my new club and she is allowing me free reign to run the racquetball programs as I see fit, without placing so much emphasis on making a profit off of racquetball. I know we will be able to accomplish many of the same things I achieved at Davison.

I hope all is well with the RAM Board. I have not kept in contact like I should, but hope Tom, Lou Ellen, Marta, Rick and Maureen are not having any major problems in my absence. The above mentioned are great people volunteering their time and energy for the good of the

sport, not their own personal gain. This effort is to be commended, not ridiculed. and with the understanding that they cannot continue helping racquetball grow in this state without more support from the players out there. The Texas president practically forced me to be part to the Board here and I said I would despite initially turning it down. I hope to take on a small role to assist them with something like their Junior Team Texas, but nothing on grand scale like I have for the past three years in Michigan.

Two weeks ago, my club hosted the Texas State Doubles Championships and since I am the Director of Racquetball there, I ran the whole event. They do it differently here, the Board helps, but the host club is in charge of everything and it is a chance for clubs to showcase their facility, staff and make some extra cash as well. It was a long and grueling week, I am so glad it is over, but we had a very successful event with 109 players entered in one event and 129 entered in two.

My responsibilities as Head Coach of the AARA's Junior Olympic team are kicking into high gear with Junior Worlds only a couple of months away I want to make a major difference for the Team this year in coaching and fund raising to provide those kids

that survived the try-out camp in late August. I tell you, that camp was the most taxing, both mentally and physically, of any racquetball event I have ever been a part of. Forty-two kids busting their rears for one week to make a sixteen person squad would be difficult enough, but this was my first camp where I was in charge. Overall, it took me nearly a month to recover from such an emotionally and physically draining event.

Despite my hectic schedule, I am still planning two visits to Michigan. Jim Floyd and I are doing an exhibition at Davison, October 29 and I am also giving lessons to Davison members that day. In November, both Nancy and I are coming back for Thanksgiving and I will give some more lessons while in town.

I am still hoping to do some type of Junior Olympic Team fundraiser event in Michigan. I just have to find an opening in my schedule to coincide with Davison's new addition being completed. January through May will be a busy tournament time for me in Texas, but I still hope to schedule something in that four month span.

I am looking forward to my visits to Michigan and I hope some of our paths will cross while I am back home.
