DAVID LUND AND JOEL BONNETT INDUCTED INTO MICHIGAN'S HALL OF FAME

The 2010 inductees into the RAM Hall of Fame are **David Lund** of Lansing, Michigan and **Joel Bonnett** of Kentwood, Michigan. Both players were nominated and inducted under the player category.

Dave Lund began playing racquetball in 1976 and played his first tournament in 1979. His impressive resume includes eighteen local and statewide tournament championships beginning in the 45 and over division and continuing through the 70 and over age division. Mr. Lund is the holder of nine consecutive Michigan State Singles Championships beginning in 2001 and continuing through 2009. He holds a total of eight regional championships (55+, 65+ and 70+) and three US Open Championships (Memphis, Tennessee) in both the 65+ and 70+. Mr. Lund is the title holder of one USAR National Championship in 2006 in the Men's 70 Open division and one National Masters International Championship in 2001 in the Men's 65 Open division.

What Dave hoped people will remember him as "a club player and tournament player who was able to blend winning, learning, fun and comradery into his style of play." Dave is married and has six children and six grandchildren. Congratulations, Dave!

The second inductee for 2010 is **Joel Bonnet**. Joel started playing racquetball in 1977 at age of six and entered his first tournament at age eight. Mr. Bonnett won numerous Men's Open singles and doubles championships in Michigan, Ohio, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Tennessee and Canada. He was a three

time national Olympic Festival participant and two time US Olympic team member in 1990 and 1992.

Mr. Bonnett was a National High School Singles Championship in the 18 and under bracket in 1990. He holds the title of Singles 18 Under Junior Olympic Champion in 1990 and was a Junior Olympic Champion in the Doubles in the 16 and Under bracket in 1988 and the 18 Under bracket in 1990. Joel holds the title as Michigan State Singles Open Champion in 2002 and a title as US Open Men's Open Champion from Memphis, Tennessee in 1996.

What Joel hopes people will remember him for is "his competitive spirit both on and off the court, his focus and determination to compete at the highest levle, his 180 mph drive serves and power racquetball and most importantly, his love for the game." Joel is married and has two children. Congratulations, Joel!

Dave and Joel will be honored at the 2010 RAM Hall of Fame and Awards Banquet to be held in conjunction with the 2010 RAM State Singles Championship on March 27, 2010 at the Davison Athletic Club and Country Club. Plan to attend these festivities and help Joel and Dave celebrate achieving the highest racquetball honor in Michigan.

Dave and Joel become the 30th and 31st members of Michigan's Racquetball Hall of Fame. Joel joins his dad, Ken becoming the only father and son members of Michigan's Racquetball Hall of Fame.

Our youngest competitors took to the courts for the Junior Championship. When the dust cleared, **Braeden D'almeida** and **Chris Wilkens** got past the team of Zachary D'Almeida and Caige Duryea to claim the Championship.

After tough matches with close competition, the ladies teams split the championships. **Laura Johnson** and **Melody Gorno** beat the team Maureen Price and Natalie Gilbert to earn the Women's 40+ Division.

We have the same great expectations for our current Juniors. In the WMO Juniors Division, Michael Bronson

showed his strong racquetball genes and won. He took the Championship over Zach D'Almeida, Caige Duryea and Braeden D'Almedeida, who also have pretty darn good bloodlines. All of these players should be fun to watch in the coming years.

The Men's 35+A Championship went to **William Garrow** over Chris Sailor in the finals.

Attica Mitchell defeated Bryan Galloway in the finals to win the 45+A Division.

Dan Deitrich and Rich Westerbrink faced off in the 45+B Finals with Dan taking first.

Ed Arias and Jim Therrell put on a great show in the 50+ Open Championship, with Ed finishing on top.

Art Murphy claimed another championship after beating Richard Bronson in the Finals of the 55+B Division.

The 25+C/D Championship went to **Jeremy Brunan** who defeated Doug Mol in the finals.

Leon Rivera showed a glimpse of thing to come by taking the 25+B Championship over Pat Trainor.

Dave Lund proved he is one of the best of the best again by winning the 60+ Open Championship and getting past Tom Sharum in the finals.

Scott Duryea defeated Paul Kramer in the championship of the A Division.

Two of the aforementioned Juniors squared off in the Final of the B Division with **Mercedes Arias** taking out Nathan Tucker.

Nathan came back and won the C championship by defeating Michael Brennan in the Finals.

Doug Mol won the D Division by defeating Jack Groot in the finals.

Brad Schopieray continued his rise through the ranks by defeating Jason Kenendy to win the Elite Championship.

Andrew Price also took another step up and beat Jim Bronson to win the Open Championship.

And now for the Pros. The draw of thirteen featured Andy Hawthorne, currently ranked # 10; Cliff Swain, the Greatest Player in the History of Racquetball; Brian Simpson, a veteran of the tour coming up from Indiana; and a full slate of players ready to take them on.

Early round action mostly went according to the seeding as Andrew Price defeated Jason Gorski, Shannon Kohl got past Steve Goedker in five tough games and Brandon Cortese eased past Matt Barbuscak. The two upsets featured Ryan Covell taking out Jim Bronson in three close games and Brad Schopieray taking out Ed Arias in four.

The Quarters also went in straight form as the Pros took the stage. Andy Hawthorne dispatched Andrew Price in three quick games and Cliff Swain sent young Brad packing in similar fashion. The kids have made great progress, but this is a whole different universe. Brian Simpson snuck past Brandon Cortese in a long five game match, but only after Brandon was injured diving for a ball. Shannon Kohl, the top-seeded local Pro managed to get past Ryan Covell, but it was a struggle every step of the way.

It's truly amazing to watch this level of racquetball, and how much difference there can be between the levels. In the semis, Shannon and Brian put up a great fight, several times taking a game to the brink, but in the end Andy and Cliff

2009 US OPEN IN MEMPHIS TENNESSEE

The U.S. Open occurred earlier this year than in previous years, with play commencing in October versus its normal mid-November start. Just a few short weeks earlier, but it made a huge difference in the weather in Memphis, but not in the caliber of tournament play. Michigan saw a smaller contingent of players than normal, however, given the economy, it was still a great showing.

For racquetball players, tournaments are a wonderful experience. You get to play against your friends (or nemeses), have a great work out, eat some great food, etc. Of course, for tournaments, your level of intensity goes up from playing in leagues or on Saturday mornings. That same intensity goes up when you play at the States Singles Championships. If you are new or fairly new to going to a national event, it normally takes you five or six points just to get your legs to stop shaking.

This event is the equivalent of racquetball's Olympics! So how did Michigan players do? Twelve players made the trip to Tennessee to test their skills against the some of the best players in the world.

Young **Matt Barbuscak** lost in the round of sixteen in the tie-breaker, 11-7, in the Under 24B. In Men's B he won the first round, but lost in the round of 32.

Ron Griggs entered into A and 35+A. Ron had a rough time getting into the groove, losing in a tie-breaker in 35+A in the first round. Ron slipped past the first round of A, winning 11-10 in the tie-breaker, but did not have that much fortune in the next round.

Mark Candy jumped up to B and made an impressive run to the round of 16, finally losing in a tiebreaker. While still playing impressively, he lost in the tiebreaker in 45+A.

Lewis Forest and **Tom Blakeslee** both lost in the round of sixteen in tie-breakers in the 55+ division.

George Goudie played in an exceptionally large draw for 55+A, cruising through the first round, but was taken out in the round of 16 by the #1 seeded player. In the 55A+ division, he lost in the round of 16.

Sharon Huczek, normally our perennial gold medal winner did not have that extra step this year in the Women's 55/60+ division placing sixth.

Stanley Kurzman went to Memphis to play in the Men's 75+ division. That in of itself is impressive!

Mike Malcolm and Dan Mullin had poor showings in the B division, losing quickly; however, both had impressive runs in the 35+B division. Both advanced from the round of 32 to the semifinals looking to set up an all Michigan finals, but both fell short of their goals. The actual game to determine third/fourth place has yet to take place, but will in the near future. Malcolm and Mullin also paired with each other for B doubles losing in the round of 16 to a couple of kids from Mexico.

Chuck Van Hoose made his annual trek but could not escape losses in the first round of 60+ and 55+B.

Leon Rivera made his first trip to Memphis not knowing what to expect. Leon started playing racquetball just a year ago and had little experience under his belt. When advised on where to go, he followed suit and dropped down a division from local tournaments. What he lacked in national tournament experience, he made up in running, stamina, and a big heart. Leon came away from his national tournament first experience with a gold medal in D

and a gold medal in 35+C (11-10 in the tie-breaker!). Leon has taken ahold of racquetball and is quickly becoming a regular in tournaments and climbing up the ranks. Great job Leon!

Congratulations to all who representated Michigan at the US Open this year. If you have not been to Memphis, mark the date for 2010 on your calendar and plan to attend. The tournament is fantastic and the extra events superb.

LYNN HAHN INDUCTED INTO HALL OF FAME

RAM Hall of Fame inductee, Lynn Hahn was honored again this year as he has been inducted into the **Muskegon Area Sports Hall of Fame**. Mr. Hahn becomes the first racquetball player to be so honored in the 24 year history of the Muskegon Area Sports Hall of Fame.

The Sports Hall of Fame now has 96 individual members and eight sports team members. The Muskegon Hall of Fame considers hundreds of nominees yearly before naming a select group of inductees. The Muskegon Hall of Fame Board received a letter signed by a large number of Muskegon area racquetball players indicating if the board were to ever honor the sport of racquetball, Lynn Hahn should be the first inductee.

Mr. Hahn began playing racquetball in the early 1970s and continues to play today at the age of 78. He continues to hold his own against the younger players in the 70 and older division.

Mr. Hahn will be honored on June 5th with an induction ceremony to be held at the Holiday Inn-Muskegon Harbor. Congratulations to Lynn as a great ambassador for racquetball.
