From the "Pres"

After the holidays, you probably reflected upon 1992 and wondered what 1993 holds in store. During this year of political turmoil, and ultimately, a changing of the guard, my generation of baby boomers came of age. We now have the power to change the course of the future. Only time will tell if we have the wisdom and courage to do so. The MSRA also took some important steps last year. We regrouped, solidified and decided on a mission. We assumed responsibility for another tournament; the Metro Regional Championships. With a little luck, we may balance our budget by June. There are some new faces in the Board of Directors, and more people willing to participate in the future of the sport. Possibilities for growth and development abound, needing only enough committed people to help.

Racquetball celebrates its 25th Anniversary in 1993. I was fortunate enough to be at the same promotional clinic that Nolan Zavoral, feature sports writer for the Star/Tribune, decided to attend. Because I was the only one with a rule book in her bag he decided to chat with me a bit. We rated a half page article in the November 1st Sunday Sports Recreation Section. If only we had a way to get the word out to more people that racquetball is here to stay! Perhaps the competitive sector of the game has reached a plateau, but its recreational popularity has increased. As people return to, or are introduced to, racquetball the number of competitors will again increase. As our children age, we may become teachers of the sport.

Our Board of Directors has decided that we must focus our attention on the promotion of racquetball to the recreational player. We are now formulating a membership development plan to educate the general population about racquetball, and to focus on its lifetime sport value. People who are competitive by nature will naturally seek out tournaments and challenges in their sport. But competition is not for everyone. New people must be introduced into the sport in order for those C and D divisions at tournaments to swell again. The busy club owner/manager, who often functions as sales rep as well as handyman, has precious little time to spend with new members on the court. We hope to develop a clinic program that will bring this new group of people into the sport, and help the clubs retain those members they worked so hard to recruit. Ideas, encouragement and volunteers are welcome: just let us know that you are interested.

Let's look ahead a little. Where should racquetball be in the next 25 years? Is racquetball a lifetime sport? You can compete as long as you like if you stay fit and healthy. If injuries have ended your competitive career, you can often still enjoy the sport with your friends. What is the equivalent value compared with other sports? A Vikings ticket costs about the same as playing singles in a racquetball tournament. After you pay to park, buy a few beers and eat a hot dog, a family member could have played at the tournament with you. We know what choice provided more exercise, but which was more fun? Will racquetball be an Olympic sport? The AARA is working tirelessly toward that objective. Will we see more racquetball on television? The MPRA (Mens Professional Racquetball Association) is seriously considering an ESPN spot for one of their 1993 stops. I certainly plan to be playing racquetball 25 years from now, and I hope you will be, too.

Order in The Court

It is time, once again, to consider the mixed doubles service rule, as it is observed in the state of Minnesota.

The American Amateur Racquetball Association does not address this subject in it's rulebook, as there is no national "Gender Rule," with regard to serving.

However, some states, Minnesota included, in the interest of safety and fair play, have established mixed doubles service rules that differ from the AARA.

The following is the mixed doubles service rule currently in use in Minnesota:

Mixed Doubles Service Rule

In mixed doubles the server must serve to the player of the same sex on the receiving team.

The ball must contact the floor, on the side of the court where the receiver of the same sex is located, after passing the short line. The receiver must have a reasonable opportunity to return the serve from his/her own side of the court or the ball must bounce twice on the receivers side of the court.

A fault serve results when:

The served ball does not contact the floor on the correct side of the court.

The served ball neither bounces twice, nor provides a reasonable opportunity for the receiver to return the ball from his side of the court.

If the receiver fails to return the serve, his partner may not return it.

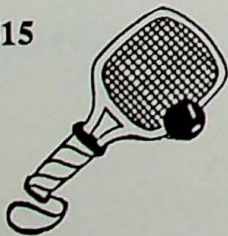
The Board of Directors of the Minnesota State Racquetball Association would like to solicit the input of any interested members with regard to this rule.

Mike Beugen and Marta Groess were inducted into the Minnesota Racquetball Hall of Fame for 1992.

These two outstanding personalities were a great addition to the Hall of Fame, not only because of their excellent play, but because of their devotion to the game and putting so much back in the game we all love so much.

Mike Beugen started playing racquetball back in 1966, and continued up until about a year ago when he had a hip replacement.

Mike was playing "paddle ball" at the University of Minnesota when a couple of guys asked him to join them in a game of racquetball. He played with a wooden paddle! Enjoying this fun little game, Mike continued playing and in 1969 played in his first tournament at the Jewish Community Center. Mike won 1st Place defeating Steve Singer very decisively. Steve, putting aside his feelings about the loss and not wanting to pass up a golden opportunity, asked Mike to be his doubles partner.

Mike and Steve continued playing together and won the State Doubles title in 1974 and were runners up in 1975. Mike then teamed up with Harold Chastain in 1991 and won the 45+ Men's Doubles title. Mike has won many other trophies and titles, too numerous to list in this article.

Mike has been a great asset to the sport of racquetball and has a fine sense of humor that we all have come to enjoy. Mike's biggest challenge was coaching his three beautiful children, Andrea, Brett and Jonas (now he can not beat any of them, and that was before the hip replacement). Mike began taking Jonas to the State Tournaments in Rochester when he was only five years old. Jonas would sneak on the courts in between matches to hit the ball. The rest is history as Jonas, Brett and Andrea have worked hard with Mike to continually

improve their game. Mike has turned them into real champions---both on and off the court.

Mike continues to work hard with the racquetball program around the state. He has been rehabilitating his hip and says that if Bo Jackson can make a come back, then so can he. We miss not seeing him on the court, and hope he will be back soon.

Marta began playing racquetball in 1976, after moving from Chicago to Minnesota. Ed and Marta were looking for a place to play tennis, but found they would have to be put on a "waiting list" at Normandale. A promotional flyer arrived at Ed's office.
