

From the President

In September I wrote about the upcoming season and changes we were making that we expected would be improvements for our members. I can't believe how quickly the time has passed since then and that we are already nearing the end of another racquetball season. The only part left of the current season is the Motorola IRT Pro Nationals/USAR Regional Championships and the Nationals in Houston.

As I do at the end of every year in my real job, I thought I'd take this opportunity to do a performance review. My comments are in italics. The arrows indicate whether I think we did a good job, a bad job or something in between. You can probably interpret them pretty easily.

1. "Event" Memberships ↑
A new "event" membership was implemented by USAR this year that allows players

to pay a nominal fee to play one event.

Not as many players took advantage of the Event Membership as I anticipated. On the other hand, we had several new players who joined the ISRA right away with a one-year membership and our membership numbers did not drop this year over last year.

2. More Accurate Rankings for Illinois Players →

Geoff Peters used his time and talents to "right size" the USA Racquetball ranking system.

Geoff did spend time reviewing the rankings and submitting changes. His biggest challenge was getting the changes input into the USAR system. We are FINALLY starting to see some improvement in the rankings. That is a result of Geoff's work and the fact that we have entered all of this year's tournament results into the system. Lynn Yeazell has assumed the responsibility of entering results after each tournament and is doing a great job. It will take some more time for the rankings to be truly accurate so please be patient. I have noticed that this is listed as the number one irritant for members of almost every state organization.

One-Day Skill Events →
 Dave Negrete organized several one-day events.

I don't want to speak for Dave but I believe this was met with mixed results. Some of the events were well attended and players had a great time. I participated in the Women's tournament in December and it was awesome. We had a really good turnout and a lot of play. Others ended up not being held due to a lack of interest. Was it that some divisions were more interested in this format than others? Was it the timing? I'm sure Dave would be interested in knowing. I thought it was a great idea.

4. State Doubles Tournament 7

In the spirit of not giving up your entire weekend, the State Doubles tournament was scheduled in such a way that you will have a good idea of when your matches will be played before you enter the tournament.

This was not as easy to do as it sounded in September. We did publish when some of the divisions would be played – particularly Mixed doubles. I heard comments both pro and con. Some people liked knowing. Other people were concerned that they would have to play too many matches in one day and they would not be able to recover in the time between matches. Some people wanted even a more condensed schedule – matches that were back to back to back – in order to really consolidate the time they spent at the tournament.

5. A Relaxed Process for Petitioning to Play in a Lower Division \checkmark

Have you been out of competitive play for several years due to other commitments or injury? You can now petition to move down by e-mail.

This idea must have been a bust. I did not receive one e-mail request to petition to play in a lower division. Or, maybe everybody feels they are categorized right where they should be!

6. A New Division – Elite, perhaps? ↓
Discussion is underway to add a new division for those of you who have made it to Open... but have been unsuccessful at moving past "AA".

Another Story of Military Assistance On February 11, ISRA Member and Oak Park Police Sergeant Paul Jepsen was featured in Mary Schmich's Chicago Tribune column in an article entitled, Gift From Vet Shed's Light on Soldier's Plight. Paul, a Vietnam veteran, had been contacted by an old high school friend who told him of her son's need for a special rifle light — Kevin Landeck was stationed in Iraq.





Ms. Schmich reported, "Jepsen had never met Landeck-a 6-foot-2, 26-year-old with reddish hair who loved skiing and roller hockey-but any kid of his old high school friend Vicki's was a friend of his. So was any soldier. It was only natural then that when word got around that Kevin was yearning for a special rifle light, the old soldier made sure the young soldier's wish was granted." "He also understood what it must feel like for Kevin to be trying to do his duty in the pitch dark Iraqi nights, guided only by light from the sky, blind to what is just a few feet ahead. Without a good rifle light, he knew, turning a corner could feel like stepping into a black hole.

"'It's something every soldier should have when he's out at night,' says Jepsen. 'It's something the government isn't popping for.'"

In a matter of hours, Paul had raised the money to purchase this special light for Kevin's rifle. On February 2, Paul received an email of thanks from Kevin: "I plan on sending something back to you from over here, I will let you know when to look for it. Thank you again, I can't say it enough." In the end, it was not the lack of light that caused Kevin's tragic death from a road bomb, just 8 ½ hours after he sent the email to Paul. The treasured rifle light was gifted to Kevin's best army buddy in Iraq.

For the third consecutive year, Lake Bluff's Ben Croft led his Colorado State University – Pueblo Men's Team to the Intercollegiate title by winning the Men's #1 Singles Championship. This ties Ben with such notable racquetball players as Jack Huczek (Oakland University), Andy Roberts (Memphis State University), Tammy Brockbank (Boise State University) and Kristen Walsh (Baldwin Wallace/University of Utah) as the only players to win three Intercollegiate Titles at the #1 Singles position. Another Illinois player, Tim Sweeney, remains the only player to take four consecutive Inter-

collegiate Singles Titles when he competed for Southwest Missouri State in 1991–1994. In addition to his Singles titles, Ben has now captured the Men's #1 Doubles title all four years of his collegiate career (two with Chris Barton and two with Mitch Williams) and the CSU-Pueblo men's team has been the top collegiate team in the country all four of those seasons.

In reviewing the Intercollegiate Record Book, Ben is now the most decorated collegiate racquetball player of all time with 7 National Intercollegiate Titles at the #1

Singles or #1 Doubles position. He eclipses Andy Roberts with three singles and two doubles titles. When Ben was asked about his accomplishments as a college athlete, he stated that he was most proud of having been a team member who contributed to his school winning four Men's Titles in a row. There was no mention of his seven individual titles!

Ben is pursuing his degree in Criminal Justice at CSU-Pueblo and expects to graduate in 2008. While completing his degree, Ben will compete as much as possible on the IRT Pro Tour where he is currently having a breakout season. In

2007 alone, he has logged wins against Jason Thoerner, Mitch Williams, Jason Mannino and Shane Vanderson, all of whom are ranked higher than his current #10 position.

As a result of his win, Ben has received another one-year appointment to the U.S. National Team and is eligible to compete for the United States in the 2008 World Championships.

remember the exact year, but it was when Brian Stuertz was ISRA President." Pam has served as ISRA Travel League coordinator for 12 fun-filled years.



Is That In The Rules?

By Keith Brown

When people start to play a new activity, one of the first things they need to learn is how to play by the rules. Imagine playing baseball and not knowing what a "ball" or "strike" was or how many outs there are to an inning. Could football be played without knowing about "offside" or "holding" calls? By the same token, we should know the rules of racquetball so we can play fairly and consistently. Many people have learned how to play racquetball from their friends and have accepted what they've been told about the rules. Few people actually take the time to look at the USAR rulebook or to view it online at www.usra.org. Fewer still have become certified referees and can correctly apply the rules. It's tough (and dangerous!) to referee a match when you don't know the rules. Similarly, it's frustrating for players to have a referee who doesn't know the rules and how to correctly apply them. Here's a little test that will challenge your knowledge of the "Official Rules of Racquetball." See how many you can answer without looking them up!
