The 2014 Michigan Racquetball Hall of Fame is thrilled to welcome three new members in the Class of 2014. Randy Anderson and Bob Gravelyn are being honored for their on-court Ability and Twayne M Howard is being honored for his Leadership.

Randy Anderson lives in Grandville, MI and he began playing in 1976. Randy amassed an impressive win record in the 1980s and 1990s winning countless local, state and regional championships. In addition to being a great player and a fierce competitor, Randy is one of the true gentlemen in the sport. Randy's talent placed him among the best to ever play the sport, and he was not found lacking. Congratulations to Randy.

Bob Gravelyn lives in Rockford, MI and has played for over 30 years. Bob has a rich history of achievement which includes two National Doubles Championships as well as dozens of local and state championships. Bob has been a top-ranked player in his age bracket for over two decades. He also served on the RAM Board and was a corporate sponsor

for the West Michigan Open. Congratulations to Bob.

Twayne Howard lives in Byron Center, MI. In over 30 years in the sport, Twayne has won 40 championships including two age/skill national championships, but his greatest accomplishments have occurred off the court.
