Fecher retires from RAM Board of Directors

Following years of exemplary volunteer service, Lou Ellen Fecher recently announced her resignation for the RAM Board of Directors

Lou Ellen has been with the organization for over a decade. She's held several positions on the Board, most notably the Treasurer duties since 1991.

Besides Treasurer, Lou Ellen has helped run Regional tournaments and every State Doubles and Singles Championships in Michigan for the last decade. If that weren't enough, Lou also plays in a summer women's soccer league and a mixed fall league out at Grand Blanc's Soccer Zone. Since she doesn't play that much racquetball anymore, this takes care of that competitive fire which used to burn so brightly on the racquetball court.

Girl Scouts? Lou Ellen's got that covered as well as a Troop Leader. Geez, where did she ever find time in the past to be on the RAM Board in the first place!

Will she miss racquetball? "Around the time of year for State Doubles and Singles, I

will surely miss it; the people and excitement surrounding the tournaments. With the girls so active, it's just a matter of priorities and doing things with them," she said
