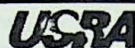

On February 27th & 28th, Jim Winterton will be at the Executive Health & Sports Center in Manchester NH, teaching an AmPRO certification class. This is an opportunity that we are very lucky to have here in N.H.

I took the certification course in 1995 and I can tell you that I learned a lot about teaching and equally importantly a lot about programming and how to create successful racquetball events. It has helped me increase my skills and my knowledge and I firmly believe that it is why I am still involved in the sport.

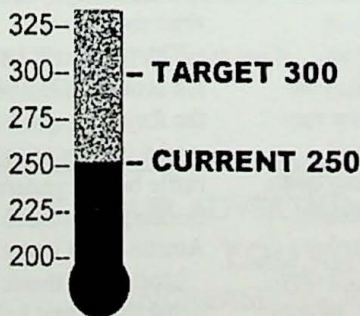

Why are the entry fees are so high??

This is a common question that is asked or complained about every tournament. Having run many tournaments over the past 5 years, I am asked this question all the time. The intent of this article is not to defend the cost of entry fees but to try to shed some light on what goes into running a tournament.

First, a common fallacy is that the Club runs the tournament and bears the cost. While this may have been the case years ago, in most instances, it is the tournament director (s) who run the tournament, pay the bills and hope they break even on their expenses.

So, let's you and I plan a typical tournament. To run a sanctioned tournament we need to pay a sanction fee of \$75.00. Next, we discuss with the club how much they will charge us to use their courts. This time the club will not charge us! Great! Next we need applications. A typical tournament will mail out between 1,000 and 1,500 applications to USRA members and Clubs. So copies will cost us around \$100 and mailing will cost us around \$400. Next we need tournament shirts. How many do we need?? This is a question that haunts all of us. Unless it is an established tournament and you have a history, this is a guess. We are going to assume 100 players, so we buy 110 shirts that cost us around \$8 each (\$880 total) including new screens and printing. Prize money and trophies. Let's assume we have 18 divisions, 10 we are giving trophies and 8 are prize money. Two trophies per divi-

sion at \$25 per division is \$250. Prize money will be \$200 for 1st in the Opens and all others are \$100 for 1st and \$50 for second. Total prize money is \$1,400. Let's see what else, oh yes tournament balls, 100 players, 120 balls, total \$120.

So where are we, we haven't got a dime in from the applications yet but we have paid out \$1,825 for everything except prize money. What else do we need to run a tournament? My favorite, the food. We will provide lunch and dinner on Saturday and lunch on Sunday, plus some type of hospitality in the morning. Throw in plates, napkins, utensils, fruit and Gatorade and this will cost us around \$12 per head for the weekend.

Let's assume we get the 100 players we were hoping for and 40 players play two events. 100 X \$35/1st event and 40 X \$15/2nd event. Total income from fees is \$4,100.

Our tournament was a great success. 100 players, everything ran on time, we worked 50 hours preparing for the tournament (making the applications, doing the draw, running around getting everything ready) and we spent all weekend working our butts off running the tournament. We are exhausted but feel great. One last thing, So how did we do financially? \$4,100 of income and \$4,425 of expenses, we lost \$325 thus our tournament directors need to chip in another \$325. Welcome to the wonderful world of running a tournament

For the last several years I have been playing tournaments on the East coast and nationally. I've had a chance to play some good racquetball, win a few trophies and meet some really nice people. I've reached the point where I consider myself something of an expert on what makes a good tournament.

All tournament players are experts on what the tournament directors have done wrong. We all know it's important for the matches to be on time -- food must be abundant -- the tournament shirt must be unique -- and its imperative to have great refs who are always available. Well, two out of three ain't bad. . .

This years event, only two days gone by at this writing, looks to have raised over \$5,000 for kid's racquetball. That is \$5,000 dollars! That is such a great reflection of how racquetball is doing here in New Hampshire. Our state was greatly represented in all the divisions and I am noticing quite a few NH people on the winners list. See the Mitch results.

In all, the draw took 3 nights and 1 day — over 270 players, with most playing 2 events; over 480 matches in 25 divisions; and, over \$6,000 given out in cash prizes! Our juniors were well represented, with the winners receiving the coveted jacket, sweatshirts for 2nd and shorts for 3rd. We scheduled 20 - 24 courts an hour, using only 2 clubs. THANK YOU

Executive and Nashua! Hey wait a minute that's only 18 courts!?! Maybe that's why we ran a little behind. . .

Thanks to everyone involved on the front, Mike Normand, Bill Gargan, Jim Lukeman, Dave White, Chris Zalegowski, Carl Savage, Rich Barker and Janice Marcel. Thanks to everyone behind the scenes: Mikie Dalton, writing all those scorecards; Brian Fisher, doing all the errands on Thursday and Friday; and the staffs of both clubs in helping out. Thanks Louise! Also to Denise Kilmer for her tireless fundraising help and banging on all those doors in order to raise a ton of money. The Antics shuttle trips wont be forgotten any time soon!

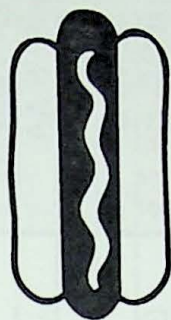

JOHN CUMMINGS AWARD (This award not given out often; goes to outstanding contribution of a person to promote and support racquetball in New Hampshire)

IRONMAN / IRONWOMAN (Person playing the most tournaments or maybe playing the most matches in a day or weekend)

COMEBACK PLAYER OF THE YEAR (Not just for people coming back from injuries)

GRANITE STATE CHALLENGE CUP (This is the one we want the most feedback; possibly changing the format so that all the winners of each division end up with their names on the NH cup)

Do you know of anyone that would fall into one of these categories? Are there others that you can think of? We will have ballots available at the State Singles Championship (March 5-7th @ the Executive) to poll for your comments. Denise Kilmer (who heads the Awards & Banquet Committee) will be there to collect your input and answer any questions you may have. As you might know we also have a good time giving out some 'Fun' awards – do you have any ideas or recommendations? These 'Fun' awards are usually flexible, so if you have an idea or a situation that strikes your funnybone or that you feel needs recognition – *WE WANT YOUR FEEDBACK!!!* Or, as the saying goes (for those of you who have taken the 'plunge') "*Forever Hold Your Peace!*"
