Long Island Open Boasts 993 Entries

The Eighth Annual Long Island Open, sponsored by Lite Beer from Miller, Coral House Restaurant, DP, Frozfruit and Penn Athletic Products, continued to prove to be the premier tournament in the country, drawing 993 entries from 21 states to the Sportset Clubs in Syosset, Massapequa, and Rockville Centre, November 15-18, 1984.

Continuing its commitment that every player and spectator go home feeling like a winner, the 23+ tournament staff headed by Al Seitelman, directors Bob Supple, Ernie Fraas, Jim Mortimer, and Regina Corrigan, provided a quality tournament with a multiplicity of tournament souvenirs. They ran 1600 matches on time and awarded 230 oak laser-engraved plaques in 42 divisions of play.

The banquet at the Coral House was unequaled with 200 prizes given out including \$3,200 in cash awards, \$1,000 in savings bonds, Windjammer cruises, DP racquets and bags, Lite displays, Footjoy sneakers and bags, Penn gloves, sweatsuits, Thorlo Socks, and the awarding of an individual cartoon portrait to 43 winners.

The food and drink consumed by the players included 5,000 Frozfruit bars, 35 kegs or 7,000 glasses of beer, 3,000 hot dogs, gyros, hot dinners, and chicken combined with the banquet and the rest of the festivities made one wonder if this was a tournament or a party?

Players of all skill levels (beginner to National Champ) and ages (10-72) provided fierce action in the many categories. Over 250 women proved that they constitute a meaningful force in tournament racquetball.

For over 17% of the players, this was their first tournament. Six reigning National Champions competed in various divisions.

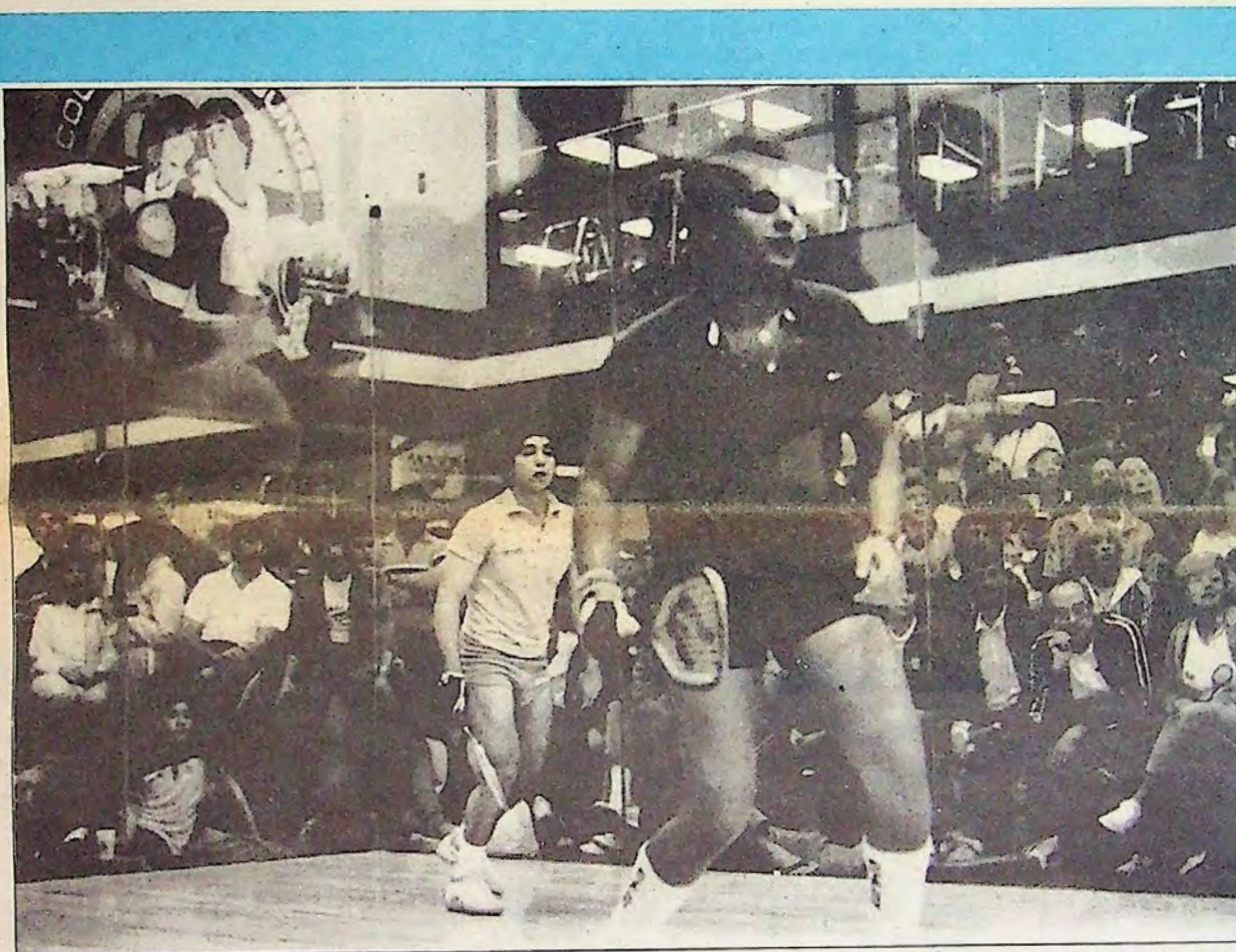

Men's Open

Historically, the interest in any tournament focuses on the open division. The interest was well deserved at the Long Island Tourney. Players came from all areas including doubles teams from Canada, Florida, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and Long Island.

Tim Hansen, FL, the #1 seed, battled his way to the finals with a thrilling 9-15, 15-11, 11-7 quarterfinal win over

Pete Chardavoyne. This match was a replay of last year's National 19+ Championship match.

Tim continued his winning ways with a 15-8, 15-14 win over #4 seed, Hayden Jones, Canada.

Fred Calabrese, #2 seed, reached the finals with straight game wins over former champion Charlie Horten, Jr., in the quarters and Bubba Gautier in the semis.

The Championship match had over 900+ spectators with Fred Calabrese shooting his way to a 15-1, 15-2 romp.

Women's Open

No woman has ever held this championship two years in a row. Three former Long Island champs as well as two runners-up were on hand to try and get that elusive second title. None of those players emerged victorious.

Janell Marriott, #1 seed and former finalist reached the finals by beating former champion Maryanne Cluess in the quarterfinals and former finalist Robin Levine in the semifinals.

Molly O'Brien was working her way to the finals by beating defending champion Jessica Rubin, 15-7, 15-8 in the quarterfinals and destroying 1982 champion Bonnie Stoll in semifinal competition, 15-7, 15-9.

The championship match proved to be a grueling battle with Janell Marriott using her years of experience and home court advantage in an attempt to beat Molly O'Brien's superb passes and court coverage.

In the end, O'Brien emerged victorious with scores of 10-15, 15-8, 11-4.

Men's Open Doubles

This event featured a battle of North versus South in the finals. Bubba Gautier and Tim Hansen, FL, beat Hayden Jones and Steve Melosche, Canada, 15-6, 12-15, 11-2. Former champions Tom Montalbano and Ron DiGiacomo lost in the semifinals as did Jim Young and Joe Klein. Art Dremar, playing with his sixth different partner in six years did not make the finals for the first time since the Long Island Open started.

Women's Open Doubles

Janell Marriott and Mary Lou Holroyd, FL, a team put together just before entry deadline approached, took

this championship with 15-11, 15-5 wins over defending champions Porotty Burden.

Men's 25+

Home club advantage again made the difference with John Petersen winning this event and John Ochevat taking second.

Men's 35+

Mike Clifford continues to dominate the senior division in the Northeast. He went through the draw without losing a game.

Men's 45+

Despite pulling a muscle in the round of 16, Charlie Garfinkel finally managed to break his Long Island Open jinx and win a championship by defeating Don Costleigh.

Men's 55+

Eli Krodman continues to dominate this division. He won his fifth straight Golden Masters Title by defeating 15 other players eager to dethrone him. Eli remains the only player in any divi-

sion of the Open to never lose a match.

Men's Juniors

Nolan Slanty took the Boy's 14 crown while Pierre Dubrin took first in the Boy's 16. Eric Crawford brought home the award for Boy's 12.

The high activity time for our sport is upon us and for clarification purposes we should review the events that are just about upon us.

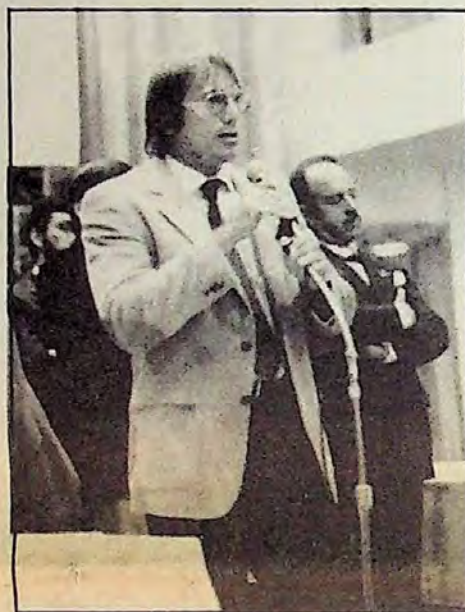
Shortly, your State Championships will be held. Needless to say, this is the highlight of your state activities and should receive your full support. Many states hold their yearly elections in conjunction with their State Championships. Take an active part in your state organization and VOTE! Elect the people that care and are going to represent you properly.

After the states, we move to the LITE/AARA Regionals and the Junior Regionals. The Regionals have taken on more and more importance each year, as they are now bonified qualifying events for the Nationals. A special feature has been added this year. All semi-finalists of each Championships division will receive an automatic invitation to attend the National Racquetball Training Camp this summer at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs. Remember, the only place that you can get a National or Junior National Entry Blank is at your Regional event.

The U.S. Intercollegiate Championships will once again be hosted by the prestigious Racquet Club of Memphis on April 12, 13, and 14, 1985.

The U.S. National Singles Championships, presented by Lite Beer, will be held once again at the Downtown YMCA, Houston, TX, during Memorial Day weekend. If you haven't attended the Nationals, then you really miss out on the event of the year. The host hotel will again be the Hyatt, two blocks away. All major activities will take place there. Over 3,000 people were in attendance last year either as competitors or spectators.

The Junior Nationals follows closely thereafter on June 22-June 25 at the Newport Sporting House, Newport Beach, CA. The beautiful Western Hotel will be host hotel for most of the major social events. The facilities, location, and event speak for themselves and promises to top any Junior National held to date.



July entertains the National Training Camp at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs.

August finds the U.S. National Team traveling to London for the World Games and tentatively to Japan in early September.

The U.S. National Doubles Championships will be held October 24-27 at the Rocky Mountain Health Club which boasts one of the finest facilities in that part of the country, with hospitality second to none. 1985 will close out with the Prestigious Orange Bowl Junior International Championships over the New Year.

We are very close to an agreement with a major airline that will provide considerable discounts off all Super-saver fares with no restrictions for all the events. Check closely with your State and Regional associations for dates for Junior Clinics, leagues, Referee Certification Clinics, Rules Clinics, Rankings, Newsletters, etc. With such an exciting year ahead of us, racquetball and its amateur organization are a wonderful thing to be a part of!

The rules will be voted upon by the board during the U.S. National Singles Championships in Houston, during the Memorial Day weekend. Any rule changes will go into effect, September 1, 1985.

Proposed:

1. Reduce the rest period between the first and second game to two (2) minutes. The time between the second and third games remains at five (5) minutes.

Current rule: Rule 13.D. Between Games: A five-minute rest period is allowed between all games of a match.

Reasoning: The regulation game has been shortened from 21 to 15 points. Additionally, tournament directors have allowed only two minutes between games.

Proposed:

2. Allow the winner of the toss the option of serving first in game one or game 2. In case a coin toss is necessary for determining the service order in the tiebreaker, the winner should have the option.

Current rule: Rule 2.A. Serve Order: The player or side winning the toss becomes the first server and starts the first game. The loser of the toss will serve first in the second game. The player or team scoring the most total points in games one and two shall serve first in the tiebreaker. In the event that both players or teams score an equal number of points in the first two games, another coin toss shall determine the server in the tiebreaker.

Reasoning: If one does win the toss then he should have his option of serving or receiving. Remember also, in doubles the team serving first gets only one out serve. Thus, the team winning the toss may choose to serve last in Game 1. And in the case of a tie in points, the team or player winning the coin toss should have the option of serving or receiving in the tiebreaker.

Proposed:

3. Adopt the board recommendation that makes the imaginary plane of the receiving (five-foot) line, a dotted line that extends the width of the court.

Current: 2 — COURTS AND EQUIPMENT e) Receiving Line. (Paraphrased from the official rule book) The only time which denotes the receiving (five-foot) line currently is a 3-6 inch line on the side wall. The hash mark on the wall is five feet behind the short line.

Reasoning: Short-hopping the serve and the attempted fly return of the serve are important elements of the game; however, infractions of the five-foot line are very difficult for the referee to judge. Adopting the dotted line will make the rule easier to follow for the player and easier to enforce for the referee and line judges, in case of an appeal.

Proposed:

5. In case of an out-of-order serve in doubles, allow the referee to subtract those points (which he can recall with the help of the line judges when possible) and penalize the team by cancelling the serve of the person who should have been serving.

Current: Rule 7.H. Out-of-Order Serve: In doubles, if it is discovered that the second server served first (and is still serving), the penalty shall be that the first server loses his serve. The second server may finish the inning and all points scored will count. If when the first server is serving it is discovered that the first server served, the second server served, and the first server is serving again, the penalty shall be assessment of a technical and all points scored during the first server's second inning shall be subtracted from their team.

Reasoning: The intent of the current rule was to eliminate some of the judgment on the part of the referee - he would not have to remember how many points were scored. However, under the current rule a team could win a game, or the match, even though it serve out of order.

Military Racquetball

It's official! Eye protection is required by all racquetball players on the Air Force Racquetball/Handball/Squash courts worldwide.

Through a joint effort of the Air Force Manpower and Personnel Center and the Air Force Inspection and Safety Center, the requirement became effective the first of December, 1984.

Some players will certainly object to the idea, citing some sources question the protection provided by most eye-guards. However, in order to justify this protection, just ask anyone who has been hit in or near the eye.

This enforcement may be difficult, just as enforcement of the mandatory use of seatbelts at most installations is difficult. Nevertheless it is felt that this policy will reduce injuries and may in fact save the vision of someone who otherwise might never wear eye pro-

tection. So, I hope everyone will support the rule and its enforcement so that we may protect one of our most valuable assets - our vision.

Additionally, the Interservice Sports Committee voted to pass an item which requires eye protection to be worn at the 1985 Armed Forces Championships scheduled to May 12-18, 1985 at Chanute AFB, Illinois.

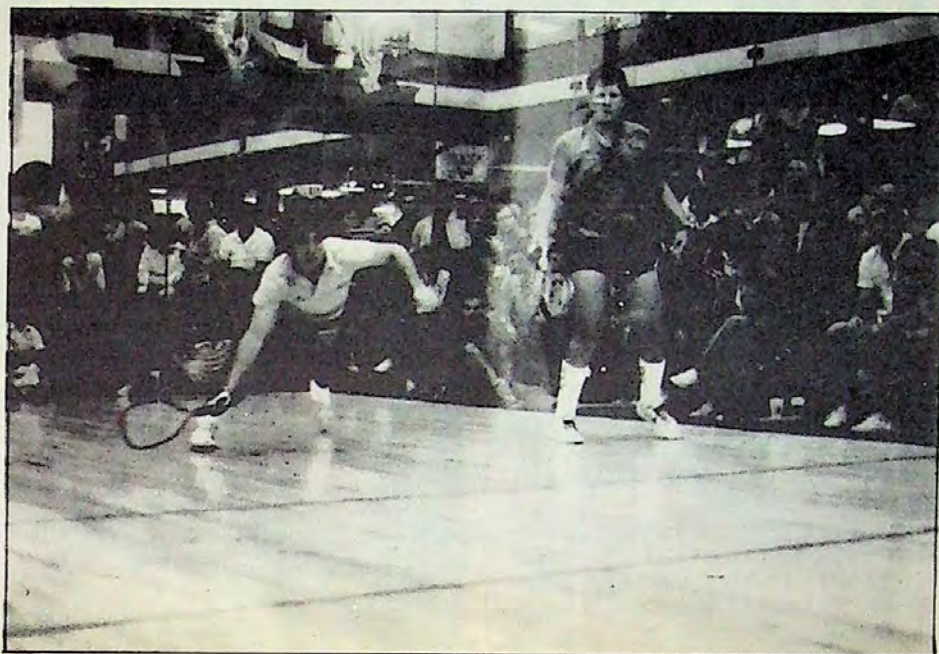

PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

Now that I have personally reached the mature age of 40 years, I have finally realized what many of our older players have been telling me for the past several years.

It seems that the "magic" cut-off for age divisions is 35+, both in the men's and women's classes.

For those tournament directors who are under the impression that racquetball life ends after 39, I can personally attest that it does not.

We are doing a great disservice to our senior and masters players by not offering them a division to play in. Anyone who has directed a tournament is aware that you can combine or cancel divisions that do not draw a sufficient number of participants, so why do so many tournament directors overlook these divisions?

I contacted tournament directors who had upcoming events and asked them that very question. Their answer, to my surprise, was "I didn't think there were enough people that age interest-

ed in playing tournament racquetball."

The solution to this problem seems to revolve around three areas. First, players who are eligible to play in the seniors and masters divisions should make themselves heard. Complain to tournament directors, club managers, and state directors.

Secondly, as an association, we should stress to tournament directors that they should offer all of the official divisions as stated in the rule book, noting that they can cancel or combine divisions as is necessary.

Third, as members of the association, we should talk to people responsible for tournament applications because if you don't qualify for the seniors or masters now, you will sooner than you think. Just ask yourself, "Would you like three or four months to pass between tournaments if you were eligible to play in your division?"

Let us no longer treat our elder players in racquetball as second class citizens. Give them an equal chance to showcase their skills.
