State Singles time is drawing near! And for those of you who have not played in three tournaments, only the State Doubles/State Juniors Championship on March 25, 26, 27 at Mt Clemens is left for you to qualify in (This year playing in the doubles will count as one of your three tournaments necessary to play in the State Singles — you don't want to miss this tournament!)

The State Singles Championship hosted by Franklin Racquet Club, April 8, 9, 10 promises to be the BEST TOURNAMENT OF THE YEAR. This year's tournament sponsored by Dr. Pepper, AMF Voit and Bata Shoes will feature a free pair of Bata Shoes to each division winner as well as door prizes compliments of Wheels Inn/Racquetball and Fitness Center in Chatham, Ontario and AMF Voit. RULES REVIEW by Bob Szuch

I would like to clarify a point which arose recently at the Brighton Tournament Stop Neither the MRA or the USRA has an official equipment time-out. All equipment changes, whether it be for a broken string or a glove exchange should be counted as a regular time-out. The only exception to this rule is: if a player has used his three time outs and requests an equipment change, the referee can grant an additional timeout for equipment repair or replacement only if he deems it necessary. It is purely a referee's discretion call. The call should be based on safety and play factors.


