CHANGE IN RAM BY-LAWS

At the March RAM Board Meeting, the board unanimously approved a change in the by-laws to make it a little easier to become a member of the RAM Board. Article IV, Section 1 of the by-laws previously read: "Must attend three consecutive monthly meetings." The section was changed to read: "Must attend three out of four consecutive monthly meetings."

Qualifications to become a board member are as follows:

- 1. Must attend 3 out 4 consecutive monthly meetings.
- 2. Must have an active participation in racquetball, and
- 3. Must submit a letter to the board requesting membership on the board.
- A vote of the board is then held to accept your request for membership.

The change in the by-laws was mad to recognize that other life commitments can make it difficult to attend 3 consecutive meetings. However, the purpose of the attendance qualifications is for the person to demonstrate a commitment to participate on the board before becoming a member. The board wanted to ease this requirement while still requiring the show of commitment

U.S. Racquetball Championships successful for Michigan players

Almost half of the small Michigan contingent that traveled to the inaugural U.S. Open Racquetball Championships in Indianapolis came home with plaques. This first Open draw drew 225 players, of which one-half were from Indiana. The tournament borrowed the round robin format of the Seniors-Masters tournaments and was open to all age and skill divisions. Round Robin play was three games to 11 points, with 3 points awarded for each game won and 7 points awarded to the winner of the match, based again on total points. Most divisions played a round robin on Saturday, with the top 2 point finishers in each flight moving into Sunday's straight draw battle. However, winners in divisions with less than eight players were decided on the results of round robin play.

Leading the way for Michigan by bringing home first place in Women's 40+ was Grand Rapids' Laura Patterson Laura was seeded first in a draw of 6, and entered the final match against number 2 seed Debbie Chaney of Indianapolis with a strong 20 point lead. However, Debbie had soundly defeated Laura in their only

previous encounter, and Laura was out to prove herself a better player. The first game was a hard fought battle, with Laura fighting back from a 7-10 deficit to win game 1 at 11-10. That seemed to take the steam out of Debbie, as Laura took games 2 and 3 with scores of 11-5, 11-5. This defeat dropped Debbie into 3rd place when all the scores were tallied.

Mike Johnston of Davison, entered the Men's Open draw as the number 2 seed. Both he and number 1 seed Eric Storey moved through their matches undefeated, setting up the final round robin match on Sunday to decide the winner. Eric seemed to be everywhere on the court and able to rollout shots from any angle, cruising to an 11-1 victory in game 1. The match was decided by the end of game 2. as Mike lost 9-11. However, Mike turned it around to take game 3, winning 11-6 to finish 2nd place overall.

Two Grand Rapids men placed in their age divisions. Clee Melvin competed in 35+ and dropped only one match in Saturday's round robin. Six players moved into Sunday's draw, and Clee won his first match of the bracket against Joe Ault of Indiana to move into the

semi's against Bill Lyman from Illinois. During game 1 against Lyman, Clee hit the wall hard with his shooting elbow. The injury affected his play, and Clee finished the day with the 4th place plaque.

Meanwhile, Bob Gravelyn moved into Sunday's bracket as the number one seed. losing only 1 game during round robin play. He met Ohio's Dick Wickline in the semi's and lost the first 7-11. In game two, Bob switched to a soft Z lob to the lefty's backhand. The serve frustrated Wickline, and Bob emerged from the semi's by winning the next 2 games 11-4, 11-5. Bob faced Illinois Frank Rusch in the finals. But, Bob could not keep his shots down. He repeatedly set Rusch up, losing in both games of the final 7-15.

Also competing from Michigan were Jason Carrol and Jeffrey Funke in Men's D, Gary Kazamerczak in C, Charles Kaiser in 60+, and Marta Rubcich in Women's 25/35+.

The AARA expects to send evaluation forms to all competing players to gather feedback on this experimental U.S. Open in determining the future of this new event. The tournament was well received by players, and you can look for it on the 1996 schedule.

Pudduck nominated to AARA Board

Ron Pudduck, active racquetball enthusiast from Dexter, Michigan has been nominated by the AARA to run for election to the AARA National Board of Directors. All AARA members can vote for this election which includes three other nominees: Van Dublosky, Julee Nicolia and Neil Shapiro. Ballots will be in the March/April issue of the *Racquetball Magazine* and also on the entry form for the 1995 National Singles Championships.

As a Michiganian himself, Ron would like support from the Michigan racquetball contingent. Listed are the reasons Ron considers himself qualified to represent racquetball.

- —Vice-President and 4 year member of the Board of Directors of the National Paddleball Association (NPA)
- Winner of the NPA Earl Riskey Award for the most significant contributions made

to the sport of paddleball, 1980

— Court sport instructor (racquetball, paddleball, squash) for over 20 years

—Editor/Publisher of the Racquet Racket the official newsletter of the National Masters Racquetball Association (NMRA)

—Elected to the NPA-National Hall of Fame, 1981

Why I want to be on the AARA Board of Directors

Also the words, amateur and all age brackets need to be refurbished.

As an AARA Board Member, I feel that I can offer positive and constructive service to our sport.
