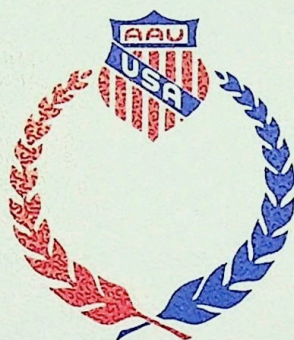

Dear Player----- To make your participation in this great tournament enjoyable,
the following is passed along to you

- . . . FOOD SERVICE --- The MAC, being a private club, does not serve non-members in the dining areas, unless they are hotel guests or with a MAC member. Food will be served to players in designated areas at designated times as a part of the tournament hospitality. Should you be a hotel guest and eating in a dining room- please wear proper street clothing.
- . . . BEVERAGE SERVICE-- Beer and soft drinks are available in the court area for players at all times. A Cash Bar is available in the "Top of the Mac" Lounge, for those wishing other service. Proper street clothing is required.
- . . . FRONT CLUB LOBBY-- The front lobby is off-limits to players in gym clothing.
- . . . REST AREAS ----- If players wish to rest, mats are available in the gym above the courts.
- . . . COURT LOCATIONS -- Courts #1 and #2 are located on the 5th Floor. Courts #3,4, 5 & 6 are in the Addition on the 1st Floor.
- . . . LOCKER ROOMS ----- All players will dress in the Addition Locker Room. Some open lockers (12) are available. However, clothing storage areas are plentiful. Caution ----- either check valuables at the pro-shop or lock in an open locker.
- . . . PLAYING TIMES - - You know your first. Check in with the Floor Manager 30 minutes prior to that match and each succeeding one you are in. PLEASE READ THE POSTED DRAW SHEET-----
- . . . CONSOLATION ----- Other than those divisions playing round-robin, consolation will be played.
- . . . AAU MEMBERSHIP - - Because this is an AAU Tournament, a \$6.00 membership is required.

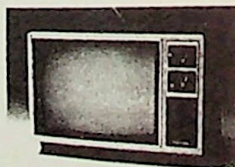


Dear Tournament Participants:

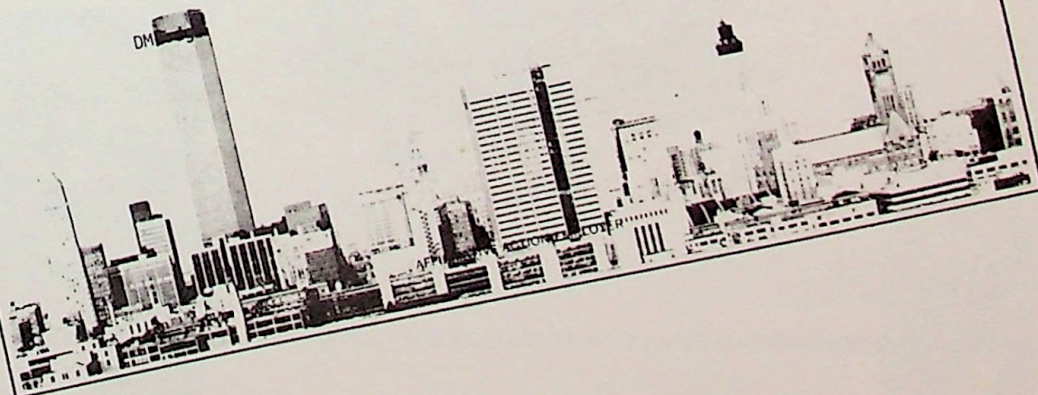
