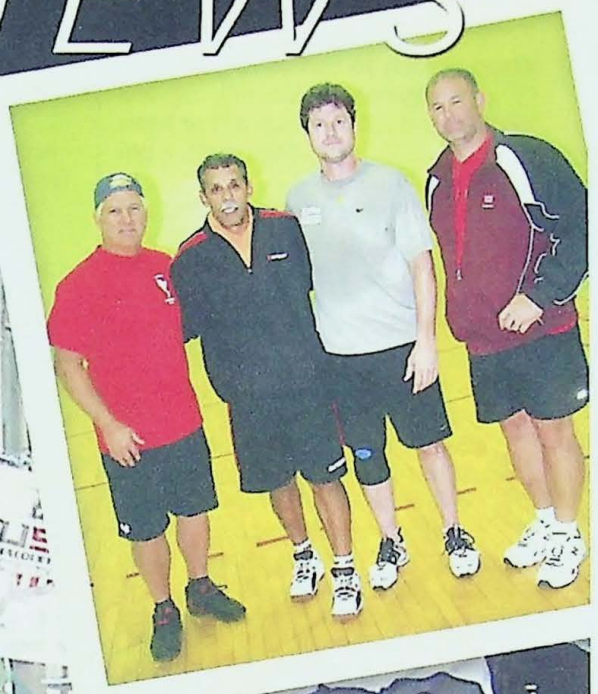
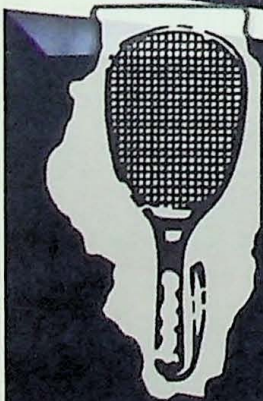

These are people I probably wouldn't know if not for racquetball.

We're at the beginning of a new racquetball season. Travel leagues and tournaments are in full swing again. I've seen some "retired" players come back to the game recently. They stopped playing for different reasons – injuries, tired of playing tournaments or whatever – but maybe came back because they know that the people they will encounter on the court all have something in common – they speak the language of racquetball.

I hope everyone has as much fun this season as I am having right now. I'll see you on the courts!

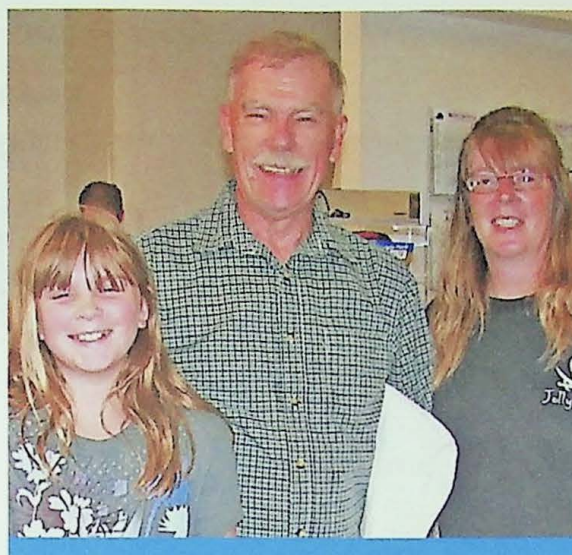

Ben Croft of Lake Bluff, currently ranked #7 on the International Racquetball Tour, defeated local favorite Eugene Coyle of Palatine to claim the \$200 first place prize at the Sixth Annual Dog Days Open Racquetball Tournament. Over 50 players competed in this annual summer event with Croft capturing the Men's Singles title and teaming up with his father Bob, who teaches racquetball at Southlake and coaches Ben, to take the Men's Doubles title over a brother/brother combination, Southlake members Dave and Frank Milazzo.

In other divisions of play, John Puccio defeated Dean Hamiti, 13, 13, to take the Men's A division; Antonio Vasquez played a great tournament culminating with a hard-fought win in the finals, defeating Rick Nielson in the Men's B; in Men's C, Gerry Kudanian bested Mike Roberts to take home first place. One of the most closely matched divisions was Men's A Doubles where longtime partners Scott Fauque and Dean Hamiti prevailed over Juan Arteaga and Tony Medina, again in a tie-breaker after splitting the first two games 9 and 9. In the Men's B Doubles, Southlake members Pat McGrath and Jesus Aguirre took home the

gold over Joe Garay and Jesus Rojas, their first match of the day proving to be the most critical in their round robin division.

This year the ladies came north as well, and Joan Vande Kieft outlasted Cari Mory in a close tie-breaker to take the Women's Singles crown while the husband/wife pairing of Tom and Dolores Lamberson celebrated their upcoming first anniversary by besting Antonio Vasquez and Cari Mory in an 11-6 tie-breaker to win the Mixed Doubles.

The Sixth Annual Dog Days Open at the Southlake Club was sanctioned by USA Racquetball and the Illinois State Racquetball Association.

Play started at 9:00 am and continued nonstop

through 8 pm! 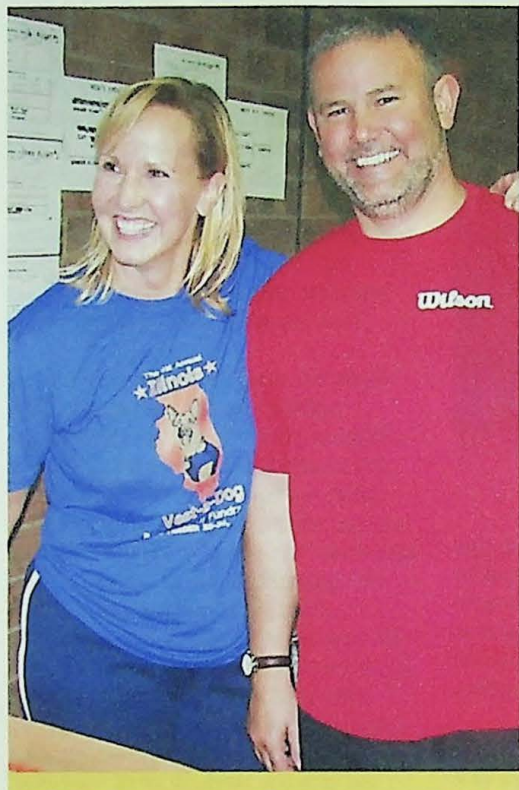

ball, a headband, and an Ektelon wristband. Thank you, Ruben, for being such a gracious person, and thanks to Ektelon for all of the goodies!

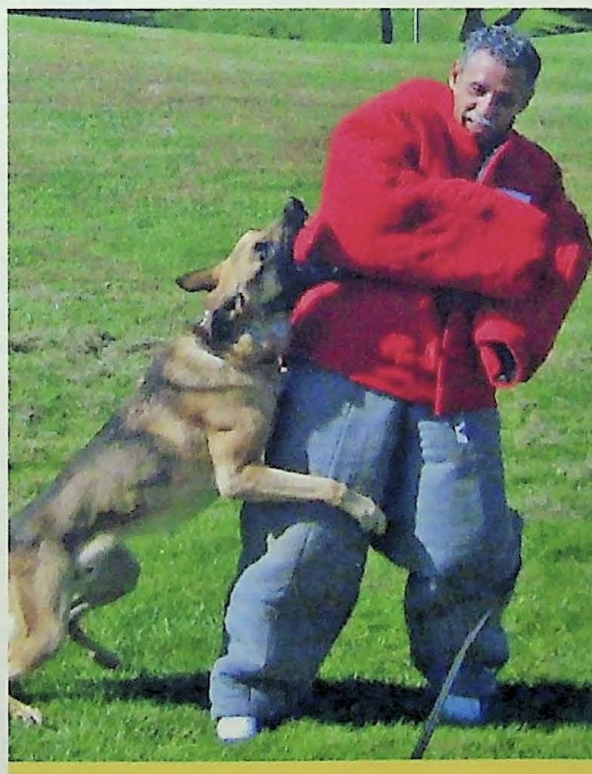
