Watching The Women's Game

A Spectator's Guide to Women's Professional Racquetball

Many fans of competitive racquetball consider the women's professional game the most thrilling of all forms to watch. While the men's game, because of its emphasis on sheer power, can sometimes be difficult for the average viewer to follow, the women's game has evolved into what is perhaps racquetball's highest level of refinement, precision, and strategy.

Dr. Bud Muehleisen, one of history's greatest players and an acknowledged expert on the sport and industry of racquetball, recently made this observation:

"The men's game presents some problems for spectators. They hit the ball so hard, and rallies are so short that even experienced viewers have a hard time following it, but the women professionals are an excellent showcase for the sport. Because the game is a little slower the rallies are longer and that is what makes racquetball exciting to watch."

In this tournament you will have the opportunity to watch some of the top female athletes in the world compete against each other. We're confident you'll agree with fans around the world that women's professional racquetball is a thrilling and entertaining spectator sport.

To enhance your enjoyment of women's professional racquetball, you may wish to familiarize yourself with some aspects of women's play which are unique within the sport of racquetball.

Scoring System

In 1982, the WPRA adopted a radical new scoring system which was designed for the purpose of maintaining the flow of the match and making the game more enjoyable for spectators. The highly popular system has become the hallmark of the women's game and remains in use today.

The WPRA scoring differs from all other systems currently in use in that a point is awarded to the winner of each

rally, regardless of who is serving. A match is won by the first player to win three games, with each game scored as follows:

Game 1 21 points, win by 2
Game 2 21 points, win by 2
Game 3 21 points, win by 2
Game 4 21 points, win by 2
(if necessary)
Game 5 15 points, win by 2
(if necessary)

Each game must be won by two points, a margin known as "lingering death." One of the best examples of the excitement created by this system took place at the WPRA Nationals in Ft. Worth 2 seasons ago where Heather McKay narrowly defeated Caryn McKinney in the fifth game of their thrilling quarterfinal match, 19-17!

Officiating

Most matches you will see will be officiated by one referee and two linesmen. While it is the responsibility of the referee to make all calls during the match, a player may challenge certain calls by making an *appeal*. When a referee's call is appealed, the two linesmen are consulted. If one or both of the linesmen agree with the referee, the call stands; if both disagree, the call is reversed.

The players themselves may also, by mutual agreement, overrule any call made by the referee.

Time-Outs

Because of the tremendous physical exertion during a professional racquetball match, each player is allowed two thirty-second time-outs per game. If you watch closely, you will notice that experienced players frequently utilize these precious breaks in the action to stall the momentum of a *hot* opponent.

Strategies

The relative skill level of the top

women pros is so even that matches are usually won or lost on the basis of strategy. A little understanding of various gamestyles can greatly enhance your enjoyment of the game.

Over the last five years, the women's pro game has been totally dominated by two players: Heather McKay and Lynn Adams. These two women rose to the top on the strength of markedly different gamestyles, and their dominance has effectively divided the women's game into two camps, the passers and the shooters. The two groups can be roughly compared to the base-liners and net-players in tennis.

With McKay's recent retirement, the school of passers is now ruled by the touch artist Vicki Panzeri. The passers are dedicated to winning by patiently playing the percentages. They are successful in forcing errors from the off-balance opponent.

The shooters are the aggressors, and play with a determination to end the rally as soon as possible by constantly going for bottom board. Led by Lynn Adams, perhaps the greatest shooter of all time, it is their creed to win the point before the passers have a chance to pass.

This explanation is, of course, simplistic. Top players have command of all areas of the game—shooters sometimes pass, and vice-versa. Players will frequently shift strategies during the match to be more effective. Watching for these sometimes subtle changes as players try to out think each other can be a fascinating part of watching professional racquetball.

There are many aspects of WPRA competition that are unique. If you wish to learn more about women's professional racquetball, you may obtain a copy of the *WPRA Official Rules and Handbook* by asking any member of the WPRA.

Since the creation of the Women's Professional Racquetball Association in 1979, no player has won more matches, earned more titles, received more acclaim, or generated as much visibility as Lynn Adams. Lynn's 1984-85 professional season was close to perfect, losing only one match in seven tournaments, to number three ranked Terri Gilreath. Her victory at the DP Nationals in June established her as the first WPRA "Triple Crown" winner; her victories include the Ektelon, WPRA, and DP nationals. Lynn's awards include Rookie-of-the-Year, Player-of-the-Year four times, and the prestigious Steding Cup which is awarded annually by the WPRA to the player who best personifies the ideal of women's racquetball.

Lynn's athletic successes evoke additional responsibilities and endeavors. Lynn's spotlight performances include appearances on ESPN, local cable broadcasts, USA Cable, Women in Sports, Good Morning America, and the ABC Women's Superstar competition. Currently, Lynn is actively supporting the National Arthritis Foundation as she tours the nation via the Upjohn Pharmaceutical company. This national media tour addresses the challenges of arthritis and drug abuse. Despite the impressive list of titles and honors she has garnered, Lynn Adams offers her fans a heart-warming, energetic, and sincere personality. Lynn's spare time is spent shopping, shopping and more shopping.
