

From the President

Here we go again! We're on the brink of a new racquetball season. This season will be different — between the changes being made at the national level and some changes we are making locally, it should be a fun and exciting season.

The changes are designed to make things more "player friendly" to increase participation at events and bring some of our old pals out of the woodwork:

1. "Event" Memberships

USA Racquetball membership fees increased August 1, 2006. The fee increase is needed to provide financial stability for USA Racquetball. However, a new "event" membership allows players to pay a nominal fee to play one event. This gives new players a chance to "try us out" and old players a way to make an occasional comeback.

2. More Accurate Rankings for Illinois Players

Geoff Peters used his time and talents to "right size" the USA Racquetball ranking system. Using our ISRA ranking system, Geoff provided the information to place Illinois players in the right place in the national rankings. That means players will move up and down as they should based on the results of matches they play this season. Thanks, Geoff!

3. One-Day Skill Events

Dave Negrete is organizing several oneday events. For instance, there might be a Men's A/B event one weekend and a Mixed Doubles event another weekend. Now you can play competitively at your skill level without giving up your entire weekend.

4. State Doubles Tournament

In the spirit of not giving up your entire weekend, the State Doubles tournament will be scheduled in such a way that you will have a good idea of when your matches will be played before you enter the tournament. For example, Women's Doubles may be scheduled for Friday night, Men's Doubles on Saturday and Mixed Doubles on Sunday. You can enter the tournament knowing the schedule based on the events you want to play.

5. A Relaxed Process for Petitioning to Play in a Lower Division

Have you been out of competitive play for several years due to other commitments or injury? If that's the case, we all know the clock doesn't stop while you're away and your skills may not be at the same level as they were before you left the competitive racquetball scene. You can now petition to move down by email. Just send an e-mail to israpresident@comcast.net. Indicate when you last played, at what level and why you feel you should be able to move down. Your case will be reviewed quickly by the ISRA Board and a decision will be delivered back to you via e-mail.

6. A New Division - Elite, perhaps?

Discussion is underway to add a new division for those of you who have made it to Open but have been unsuccessful at moving past "AA." Rather than having a dropdown division that feels like consolation, how about a division for those players that are better than "A" players but are not skilled enough to compete against the top Open players? That's what we're working on.

7. Your Other Life

Let others know what you do when you're not on the racquetball court. Joe Silius is soliciting advertising for the ISRA newsletter. For \$80, your business card will appear in the newsletter for a year (4 issues). For \$25, you can have it published in just one issue. For more information, contact Joe at jsilius@yahoo.com. What a great way to find out what we all do so that we can support each other on and off the court!

Illinois Players Cross State Lines

Croft Dominates the 2006 Intercollegiates

Tempe, AZ March 29-April 1, 2006

Ben Croft once again took the Intercollegiate Championships by winning both the #1 Singles and #1 Doubles to lead his Colorado State University - Pueblo team to the Men's Division I Team Championship (and third place overall behind Oregon State University and The University of Alabama).

This year's tournament was held in the beautiful facility at Arizona State University in Tempe (the same courts will host this fall's National Doubles Championships and the World Junior Championships in December). Ben wasted no shots in wrapping up his second Intercollegiate title by defeating Augustin Tristan of the University of

Alabama 9,6 in the finals. In the Men's #1 Doubles final, he partnered with Mitch Williams to take out Augustin and his partner Shane Karmelin, 14,9. In 2005, Williams had competed for the University of North Carolina and finished second to Ben in the #1 Singles position. Ben's win also re-qualifies him as a member of the prestigious U.S. National Team that



A break in the action:



2nd Annual Racquet for the Cure

Landmark Racquet & Health Club, Peoria, IL August 25-26, 2006

This fundraising racquetball event was held in support of the Peoria Affiliate of the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation. The foundation was established in 1982 to help fight breast cancer by funding research grants and supporting education, screening and treatment projects in communities around the world.

Our Planning & Fundraising Committee (Jim Maroon and Pam Schubach [co-directors], Karen Carter, Gail Goeppinger, Joann Kempthorne, Traci Steen, Terry Sutton) set the goals and objectives for this year's tourney. We also had an Advisory Committee consisting of Kelly Carter (Bloomington), Laurel Davis (Chicago), Jean Gallagher (Colorado), Cheryl Kirk (Naperville), and Kurt Mankle (Peoria) to gain input and pass the word to their local clubs.

Our goals for this year were 1) to have 50+ players enter the tournament and 2) to donate \$6,000 to the Foundation. Both goals were exceeded: 77 players participated (up from 51 last year) consisting of 53 women (up from 34 last year) and 24 men (Mixed Doubles only). The players traveled from points throughout the Midwest as well as Colorado. A donation in the amount of \$10,500 has been presented to Linda Maricle, Program Director of the Peoria Memorial Affiliate of the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation by Terry, Pam and Jim.

The format was a two-day tournament be-

ginning Friday evening with Women's Singles, Women's Doubles, and to include the men, Mixed Doubles. Saturday was a very full day of racquetball with many women playing in three events. Overheard from Pam Schubach,



USAR Racquetball High Performance Camp

July 29 - August 4, 2006

This past summer my teenage son, Mike and I had the pleasure of attending a weeklong racquetball camp at the United States Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs.

The High Performance Camp is an annual summer event conducted by former U.S. National Team Coach and member of the Racquetball Hall of Fame, Jim Winterton. It was a thrill to be training in the same facility where world-class athletes have trained for their Olympic events. During the week we saw Olympic athletes from sports such as volleyball, gymnastics and wrestling.

This year's camp had five instructors with 24 campers in ages ranging from 14 to 55. Also in attendance were four guest speakers on the subjects of speed training, weight

training, nutrition and goal setting. Besides Jim Winterton, who currently coaches a number of top IRT pros, and Dr. Jim Hiser, former camp director and currently Executive Director of USA Racquetball, the instructors included two top pro players, Illinois' own (now Ohio resident) Andy Hawthorne and Jo Shattuck along with Dennis Fisher, coach of the impressive Brigham Young University racquetball team. All were excellent coaches with the ability to translate instructions into language that was easy to understand. All players were taped and sent home with an excellent set of materials to review after the camp concluded.

This camp is physically demanding. You must train beforehand to withstand the rigors of playing and working out at high altitude. You don't have to be a nationally ranked player in order to attend; however, the coaches are looking for players serious about racquetball and who are prepared to push hard when every muscle in the body is saying "I've had enough." A few of the players had to cut back during the week after realizing they had not properly prepared. Still, the camp is very do-able if you

put in the proper time. The schedule each day had us up at 6:00 am for a two-and-ahalf mile run, followed by 45 minutes of calisthenics and stretching with the alwaysupbeat Dr. Hiser. There definitely is a "boot camp" feeling but this was balanced with the tremendous sense of accomplishment you felt as your body adjusted to the rigors of the camp and the altitude as the week progressed. After breakfast, campers began a full day of drills and playing at the Lynmar Athletic Club, located a few miles from the Olympic Training Center. In the evenings we met as a group to listen to guest speakers. Mid-week there is the infamous "Hell Day" where we were required to run a simulated racquetball game on a local high school track. This is where we ran for 11 minutes to Jim Hiser's whistle, alternating all-out sprints with jogging to simulate an intense racquetball match. After a two-minute "time-out," we did it all over again. Thank goodness there was no tie-breaker!

The dorms on the campus of the beautiful Olympic Training Center are three bunks to a room. It was a nice way to remind me what my son will be experiencing in just a few weeks as he heads off to college. The

setting was stunning, with beautiful weather and Pikes Peak in all of its purple majesty off in the distance to inspire us on our morning run.

The junior players were extremely talented. I expect to see a number of them on the pro tour in a few short years. One of the junior players, John Sanderson, took the end-of-camp tournament, besting all adult and junior players. It was great seeing juniors taking some of us old-timers aside to help with different aspects of our game. It was never a problem to get one-on-one time with the coaches and they were always available to help address inadequacies in your game (of which I have found too many to discuss in the space provided here). If I only could have had such quality instruction when I was younger!

There are a variety of racquetball camps around the country and many knowledgeable instructors, but getting a full week of training and instruction with this group was an amazing experience. I hope you get a shot at this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity – it is not to be missed!


