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VANOVER/FREDERICKSON CAPTURE STATE TITLES

The 1983-84 tournament season of the Michigan Racquetball Association came to an end on April 13-15. On those dates the State Singles Championship was held at Franklin Racquet Club and Spa.

Two hundred and forty of the state's finest players converged on the Southfield site for a weekend of top notch racquetball. As usual, the top names in the state showed up along with a few unknown but determined players. The level of competition provided spectacular viewing all weekend long.

Franklin Racquet Club's racquetball director, Jim Reading, provided excellent hospitality throughout the exciting weekend. Ron Slavik and his Fourmidable Group, along with Viking Sports of California, AMF Voit and Wheels Inn were the major sponsors for this year's State Championship. Without the support of these sponsors, the tournament would not have been a success.

This year's tournament saw a repeat winner in the open and also crowned a new state champion in the open division. In the women's open, last years winner Cathie Frederickson came back to defend her MRA State Champion title. Frederickson had to defeat her cousin Kathy Stellema in the finals 21-18, 21-15 to retain the title. This is the first time that the two cousins have met in a tournament match. To get to the finals Frederickson defeated Sheri Anderson 21-8, 21-7 and Stellema had a hard fought match with Irene Ackerman-Chmura winning 15-21, 21-13, 11-4.

On the men's side of the open division, a new state champion was crowned this year. Ray Vanover won his first MRA State Championship by defeating Radiation Man 21-20, 21-14 in the finals. To get to the finals this year Vanover defeated Jim Easterling 21-1, 21-3. Easterling just didn't have much left against Vanover after pulling off the upset of the tournament in the quarterfinals. In the quarterfinals, Easterling defeated last year's second place finisher in the open, Steve Jeziorski 11-21, 21-17, 11-9.

Radiation Man got to the finals by defeating Stu Hastings 21-14, 14-21, 11-3. This match was a fine display of racquetball ability and sportsmanship.

This tournament in one sense could be called the tournament of the young player. Two junior players won divisions and the third junior player finished second in his division. Doug Gage who two weeks ago won the Junior 17 and under title, won the Men's A

division 21-15, 21-14 over Mark Casey. Dave Larry who finished second to Doug Gage in the 17 and Under won the Men's D division 21-20, 8-21, 11-9 over Mark King. The third junior, Nick Rallis, finished second to John Bakalis 21-17, 20-21, 11-9 in the Men's C.

Two other divisions saw repeat state champions extend their streak of victories. In the Golden Masters, Richard Caretti again defeated Duane Russel 21-4, 21-1 to win his third state championship. In the Masters A, Lynn Hahn again successfully defended his title by defeating Dave Matyas 21-17, 21-16. (Look out guys--see the picture opposite--it looks like Hahn is training another Hahn to carry on the tradition.

In the Seniors A division, what some people term as the second open division, there was what many consider to be the other upset of the tournament. Gordon Kelly, who while in his mid-40's still competes to the semifinals and second place in the open division, was defeated in the semifinals by Larry Jackson, 21-14, 21-15. This match also was one of fine play and fine sportsmanship by both players. Larry Jackson went on to the finals against Jim Santino. He then lost to Santino 21-8, 21-17. Santino reached the finals by defeating last year's State Champion, Bob Lipin 21-8, 21-12.

The women's divisions featured two divisions of double elimination. In both of these brackets the person in the loser's half of the bracket came out to win the first match forcing a second match show down. This proves again how competitive the women's brackets are becoming. In the women's B, Janet Insko came out of the loser's

bracket the first time around to defeat Judy Carson in a tie-breaker. Then in the final match Carson defeated Insko 21-16, 21-17 to capture the B title.

In the women's veterans the same thing happened with a different result. Hanel came out of the loser's bracket to win the first match. These two women have a "war" of a match each time that they play. Then in the final match Hanel came back to defeat Jahn 17-21, 21-15 11-10 to capture the state title.

The MRA would like to thank all of the players, sponsors and the host club for making this year's State Championship one that will not be forgotten. Other results are on page 8.

PATRONS WIN 1984 CONTRIBUTION AWARD

The Grand Rapids Racquetball Patrons Association, known locally as the "Patrons", is the 1984 winner of the MRA Contribution Award. This four year old volunteer organization has made significant contributions to our sport since its beginning. This year the Patrons sent a complete team to the MRA State and AARA State Championships for Juniors. In 1984 alone over \$2,500 will go directly into juniors who play at the tournament level. Patrons members have also spent time teaching initial entry players the basics and higher level players have benefited from the free teaching clinics.

Money is collected to support the programs through a variety of activities. Running tournaments, providing hospitality to tournaments, donations and sponsors are the primary sources.

Sunglo provided warm-ups for all Team Grand Rapids members. The Patrons then provided the entry fees, travel, lodging, and adult supervision for the team to compete at the tournaments. Of the 28 members of Team Grand Rapids, 8 qualified for Team Michigan. The remaining 20 members will be supported by the Patrons when they travel to the Regionals and the Nationals.

During the upcoming season the Patrons will expand their tournament series to four or more junior emphasis events in West Michigan. Stops in Muskegon and Holland are a possibility. Opening new avenues for initial entry players by teaching in the YMCA system will be attempted. New parents are the life blood of the Patrons, luckily those individuals are identifying themselves and offering their time and expertise. We hope that the upcoming season will be as successful as 1983-84.

The Patrons was established in 1980 as a non-profit organization with a seven

person board of directors under the leadership of first year President, Roy White. As a player organization, every effort has been made to add players and parents to the Board. They have replaced the owners, managers, and operators who had financial vested interests. Open communication with all area clubs has been encouraged with equal opportunity for all clubs.

Second year President was Larry Nix and during this year a large financial gain was made by providing hospitality to clubs with large tournaments for a fee. This also gave the Patrons exposure for providing better than average food at a reasonable cost.

Under third year President Lee Frederickson, the Patrons assumed responsibility for the Grand Rapids City Championship Tournament. Also, a city ranking system was developed along with a consecutive weekend doubles championship and expanded junior divisions at reduced costs.

1984 began with Sandy Wiegierink being elected as President and with new board members and more parents volunteering to help. The Patrons are doing what others are talking about. The story of the Patrons can be an example for other local volunteers who wish to help racquetball in their area.

RULES

At the recent State Championship tournament held at Franklin Racquet Club, an issue came up which I feel may require some clarification. This issue is LINESMEN.

Are you as a player entitled to linesmen? Yes or No! The answer is a matter of opinion. Yes, you can request that linesmen be present for your match. All players would rather have three pair of eyes watch a match instead of just the referee. Yes, your opponent would probably feel the same way. It is really great to be able to appeal any call the referee makes that you think is wrong.

But at the same time, the game SHOULD NOT be halted or delayed excessively if linesmen cannot be found. If the referee cannot locate additional help and the players proceed to the tournament desk to ask for linesmen, the tournament director has the right to order the match to continue without linesmen. So, you as a player are certainly entitled to linesmen but it is not your right to have them. Linesmen will be found, if possible, every attempt should be made for a smooth running match. But remember--LINESMEN ARE A PRIVILEGE NOT A RIGHT!!!

BROWNEE WINS SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD

The winner of the 1984 Sportsmanship Award given out each year by the MRA is Tom Brownlee. The Sportsmanship Award is given out each year at the State Singles Championship and is voted on by the players at that event. The award is a travelling trophy which the next year is replaced by a plaque for the player to keep says "Awarded with honor, to the person who most represents the ideal of good sportsmanship under extreme competitive conditions."

I talked to Tom, who is the Ektelon Sales Representative for Michigan, about this award and racquetball in general and his thoughts are below.

"What do you think about winning the Sportsmanship Award?"

First of all I am sorry that I was not there to receive the award in person, but due to business circumstances I was out of the state that weekend. Secondly, I am very excited about winning the Sportsmanship Award. A lot of people can win or place in a tournament and get a trophy, but only a few people can ever win this award. To win an award based on your actions not just your racquetball ability and being elected by your peers is definitely an honor.

Tom Brownlee started racquetball by playing paddleball in 1970 at Schoolcraft College. Then in 1971 he went to Wayne State University and became a racquetball-handball-squash instructor. The first racquet club that Tom worked at was the Southfield Athletic Club, which is known now as the Executive Athletic Club and he worked there for nine years.

At the Executive Club, Tom started the Super 16. With the help of Tom

Carpenter and Fred Lewerenz, they would invite the 16 best players in the state to come and play at this tournament.

The main racquetball thing that sticks in Tom's mind that he was involved in starting was the Detroit Metro Travelling League. Along with Tom Carpenter, Joe Finn, Mark Wiegand and Fred Lewerenz, Tom set up the travelling league which is still going on.

Tom has been sponsored by Ektelon since 1972. He has also been on television more than once to promote racquetball. He has been on "PM Magazine" (Channel 2) twice and has been on "Kelley and Company" (Channel 7) live with Mike Yellen five or six times.

I try to play intense, but at the same time have a good time. If I don't win, but I put out 100% I still feel good.

My biggest thrill in racquetball is teaching and watching the people I teach do better.

A few years ago racquetball players were very vocal on the court. They yelled at the refs and their opponents. It seems now that during the last year the pendulum has swung back and the players are showing much better sportsmanship on the court. The problem now is that the parents are getting abusive.

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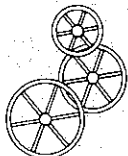
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TOURNAMENT RESULTS....
