New clinic concept

Adams ready for Orlando

ORLANDO — A new concept in professional racquetball clinics will take place at The Racquet Ball during the Florida Racquet Journal Spring Fling May 24-26.

Lynn Adams, the nation's No. 1 female player the last three years, will be offering a seminar and play an exhibition in conjunction with the tournament.

In previous clinics, Adams gave a lecture to the group, answered questions and played an exhibition. "I've been doing that for years and I think this format is neat. The subjects we'll be covering are good and people can come and leave as they please if they have a match to play," Adams said. "I'm excited about this tournament."

Adams, considered one of the top clinicians in the game, will begin her first seminar on Saturday, May 25 at noon. The entry fee covers both the tournament and seminar.

Her first topic will be a video tape analysis of a pro match. Adams will analyze her match against arch-rival Heather McKay.

"It's really a good way to learn. A lot of players don't know how to watch a match and they should get a lot out of this segment of the seminar. Once a year I pull out the tapes and Jim (Carson) and I watch them. We try to spot things that are consistent about her game and watch the patterns of how I react. It's very helpful."

Adams will delve into conditioning for racquetball during her second seminar. "It's a subject most people don't consider because of time constraints and I can understand that racquetball is a recreational vice for most people after work. But there are things one can do which won't take a lot of time. Also, for those who want to spend more time on conditioning, we can be more technical."

The third session will be a Strategy Skull session. Adams will review

certain situations and discuss the finer points of racquetball. "There's nothing mystical about strategy. Basically racquetball is pretty straightforward and that's how I approach it," Adams said.

In her final session, Adams will play an exhibition. She'll take on the top male players in Orlando including state junior champ Scott Richborg.

The \$25 entry fee covers both the seminar and the first event of the tournament. Juniors receive a discount of \$15 for the first event and \$5 for the second event.

In an effort to reduce costs, husband and wives who play in the tournament will receive a 20 percent spouse discount off the total entry fee. And players who compete in several tournaments a year can take advantage of a new program put

Adams regains urge

ANAHEIM, CA. — The urge has returned. Lynn Adams, ranked No. 2 on the women's pro tour the last two years, is ready to regain her top spot.

"I'm excited again. I've been working real hard since Christmas. I'm working out like I used to four or five years ago," Adams said prior to the Ektelon Nationals the first weekend of May. "The difference is I'm hungry again. I have the same attitude I had when I wanted to be No. 1."

Adams, who gained the top spot two years, became complacent and began losing to players who barely gave her a workout. "When I first became No. 1 it didn't feel like I thought it should have. The world didn't stop. I had worked so hard to reach that goal. We (her husband/coach, Jim Carson) had talked about it before it happened and how I would react to it. But it's something you really can't plan. You have to experience it. It's a real mind blower."

The No. 1 ranking made Adams

In the open division, Campbell defeated Tim Hansen 15-4, 15-8. Simon captured the 30+ division with 11-15, 15-2, 11-3 triumph over Jack Ross. Former National Champ Diane Bullard edged Martha McDonald 15-8, 14-15, 11-9.

In Houston last month, six-time national champ Jay Schwartz of Pensacola, won the 30+ division. Hansen finished second in the open division.

All three winners received an all-expense paid trip to California.

On the road when I make mistakes, I can step back and assess things. When I'm here I just panic and that makes things worse. That's been the pattern the last three years."

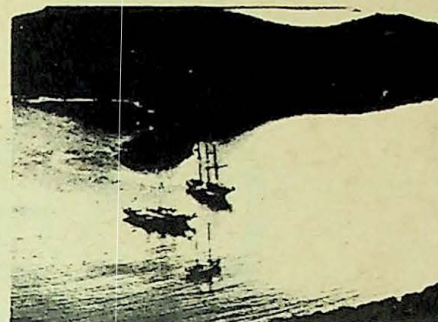

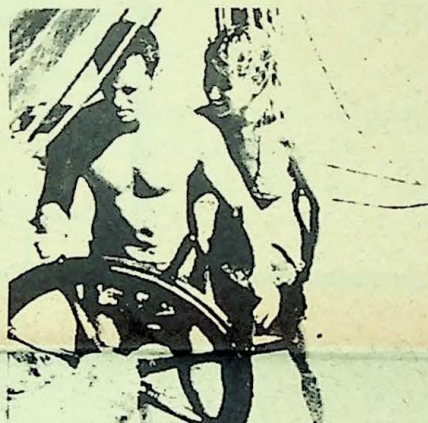

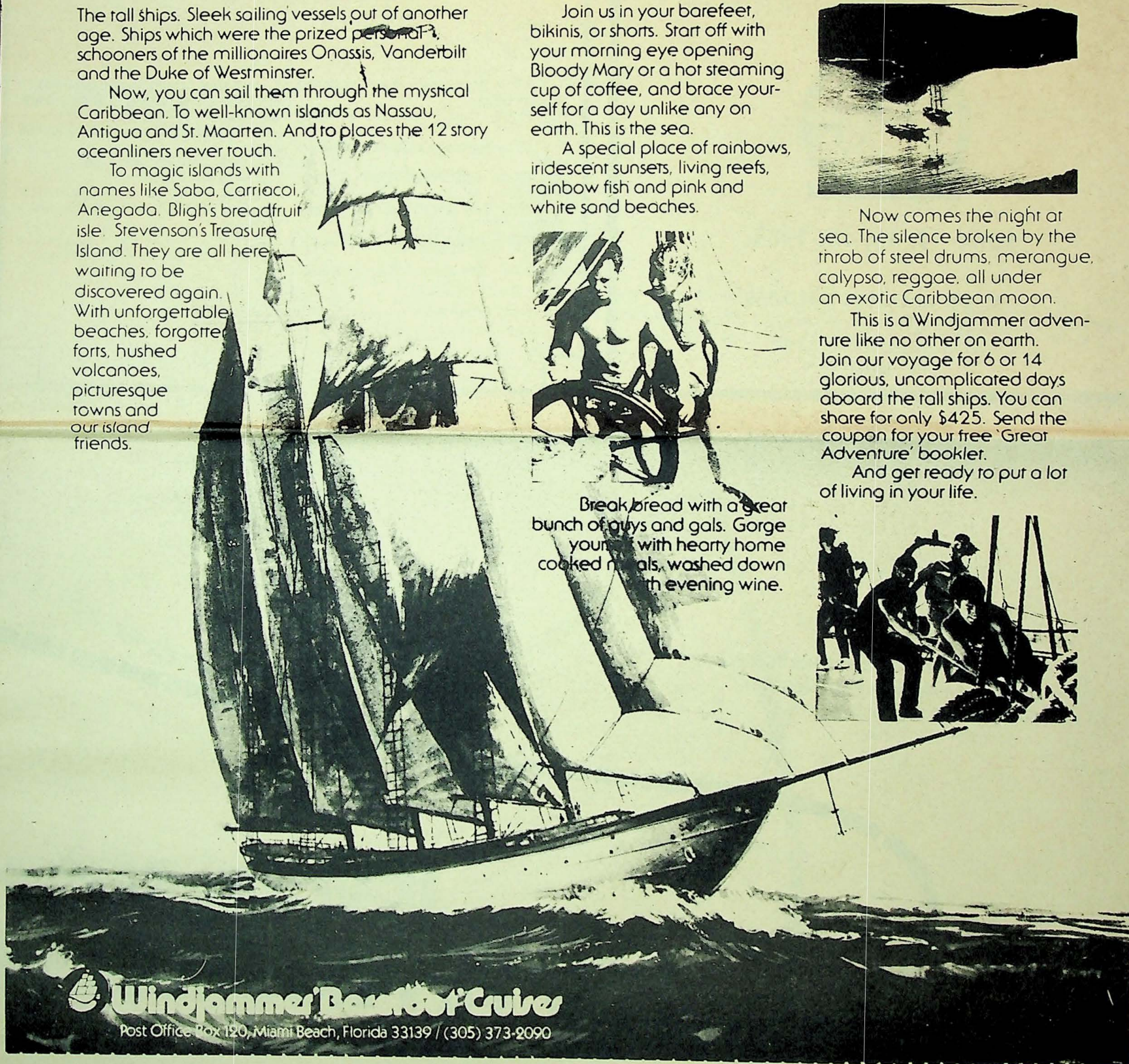

The state board of directors is currently reviewing a sanctioning guidelines document. When a tournament is sanctioned, the club or organization putting on the tournament will have to adhere to certain rules. These rules will be published in next month's *Florida Racquet Journal*.

A new tournament report card is on its way. The past one had too many holes in it and it wasn't effective.

The Ektelon regional championship results will not count toward the point standings in the AARA state rankings. Originally, Ektelon had agreed to sanction it in Florida if all the money went to the state and not to the national office. The tournament application made no mention that AARA memberships were required and when a couple of people complained about paying the fee, the agreement became null and void.

In case you didn't hear, Fred White is the new president of the state AARA. The Journal will have a question and answer interview with Fred in a future issue.

A couple of key dates to remember. The Junior Nationals is June 22-26 in New Port Beach, CA. and you don't have to qualify for the Sunshine State Games, July 12-14 at the Tampa Bay Courthouse.

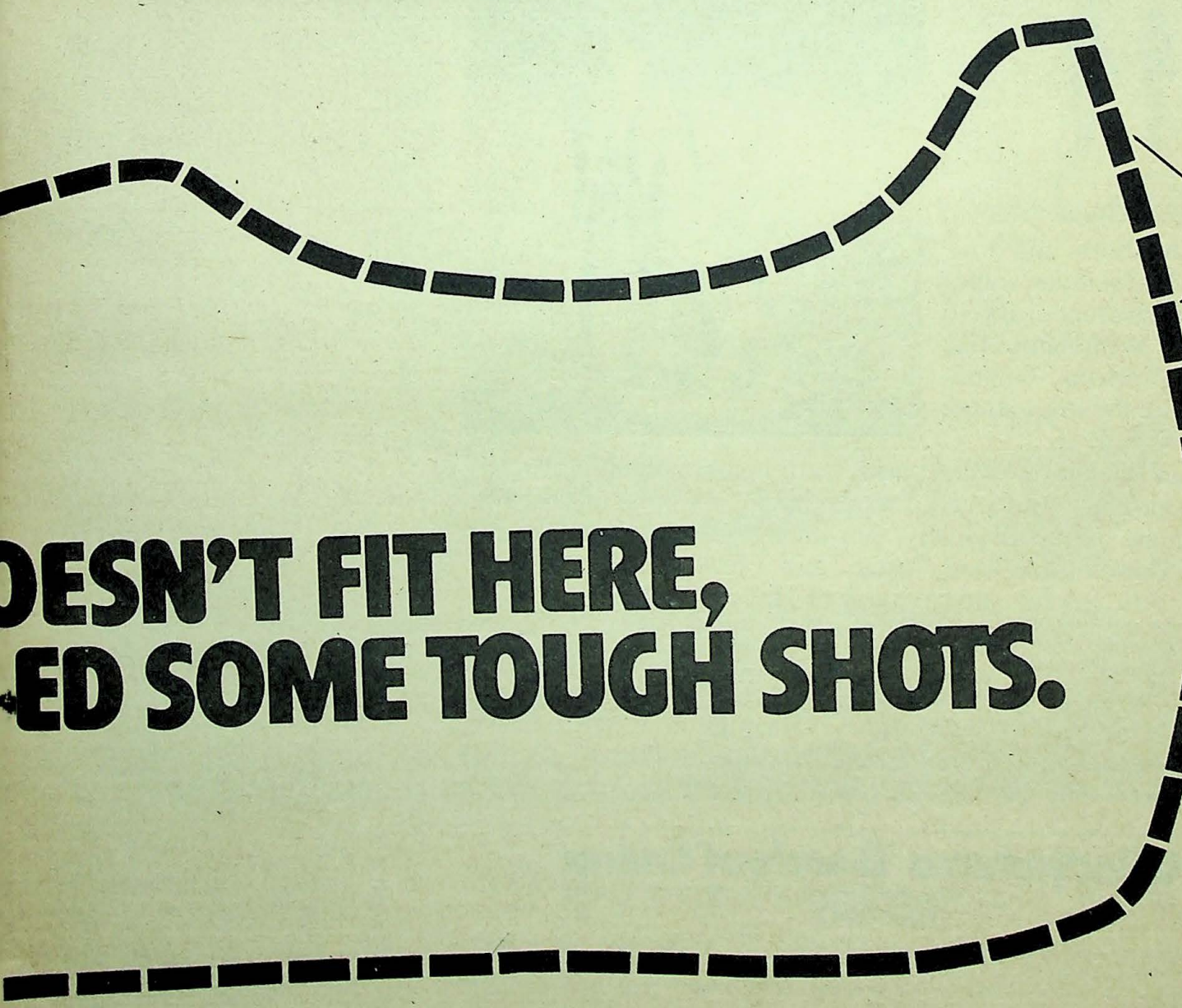

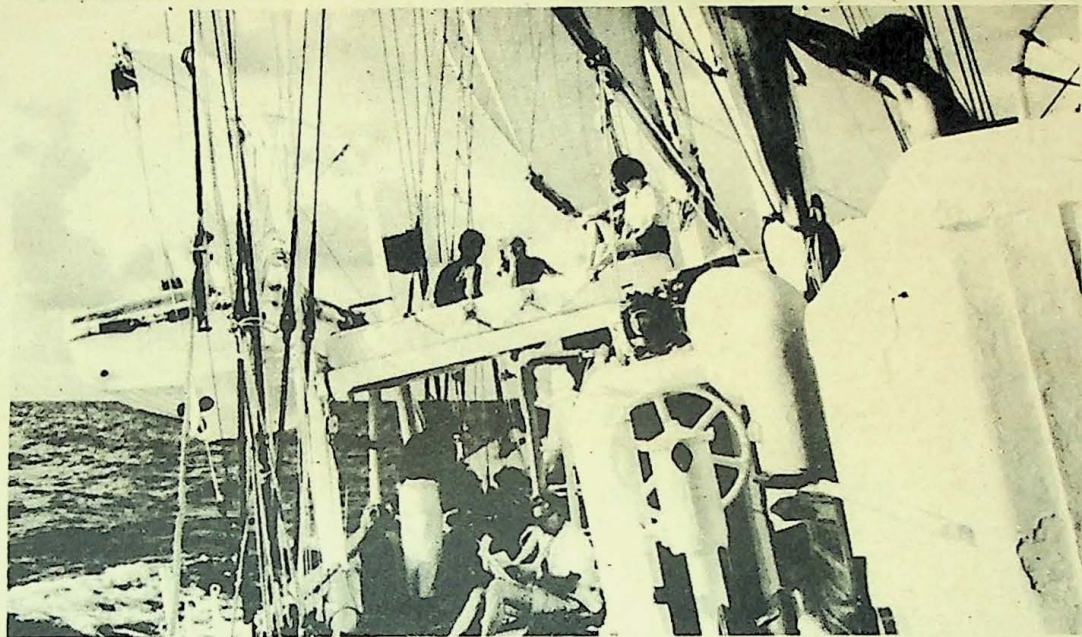

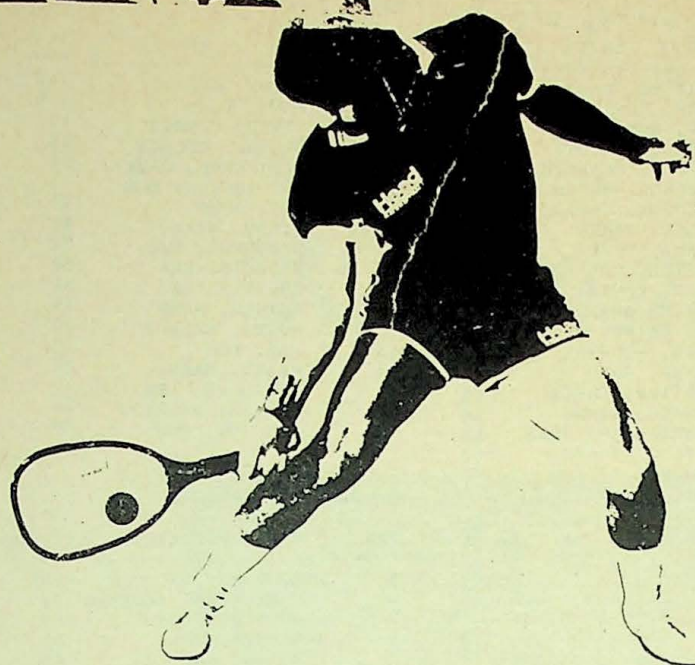

PRINCETON, N.J. — AMF Head announced the signing of women pro Vicki Panzeri last month.

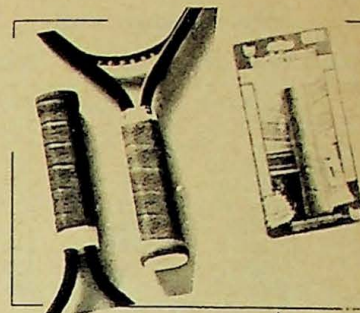
