From The President

In my last article I talked about the "lazy, hazy days of summer". Some of the days may have been hazy, but my summer has been anything but lazy. I have been so busy that I sometimes feel like my head is spinning. I think a return to the normalcy of fall and racquetball will be a welcome relief this year.

The 2000-2001 racquetball season was officially kicked off with the Glass Court's Summerfest tournament in July. The Summerfest is always a great tournament and a great way to ease back into racquetball. In order to continue the season's kick off, this issue is dedicated to the topics of ranking and seeding – and they are definitely not the same thing!

The USRA uses a **ranking** system. Players acquire points based on where they finish in tournaments or other sanctioned events. Points are given for quarter-final, semi-final, second, and first place finishes. Tournaments are also weighted based on type. For instance, a national tournament carries more weight than a regional tournament; a regional tournament has more weight than a state tournament, and so on. This system rewards players for participating in lots of events and placing in the top eight in each of them. The names of the top 10 players in each category appear in *Racquetball Magazine* (as long as their USRA/ISRA membership is current). It's always fun to see your name appear in a national publication...provided it's not the FBI's Most Wanted list! Just a hint – playing in national events will get you on this list the fastest.

The ISRA uses a **seeding** system. Our goal is to ensure that players are placed in the right position in a tournament draw. The first time a player participates in an ISRA sanctioned event, the ISRA system assigns a base point value to the player, based on the skill division for which they are eligible. Every player has a point value in the system. When "Player A" plays "Player B", the system will predict the outcome based on the relative point values of the players. The actual outcome is entered into the system and a new point value is assigned to each player. If the lower player scores more points than the system predicts, they can increase their assigned points even though they didn't win the match. The higher player may also see a reduction in their points because they didn't do as well as they should have.

Player points are used to seed tournament draws. The player with the highest point total is seeded first. Adjustments are sometimes made to ensure that two players from the same club are not playing in the first match or that a player whose point total is inflated does not get seeded improperly. The system does not have the ability to discern between age groups and skill divisions. So, a player who plays predominantly age divisions may have a higher point total than a player who plays Open. We have to use our collective knowledge of the players to ensure proper seeding in a case like that. We also try to make sure that all players are eligible for the division they have entered....and sometimes somebody sneaks into a lower division. We depend on people being honest and playing where they should.

Whew! Now that I've explained all that, here are a couple of other things you should know. All matches played in ISRA sanctioned tournaments for approximately the last **eight** years are entered into the system. You can receive a history of every match you have played by contacting ISRA secretary, Judy Young. The history will provide you

Bruce Nelson Wins 45+ NMRA Masters

Illinois own, Bruce Nelson, in his 4th attempt in as many years, finally comes over the top and takes the National Masters Racquetball Association's (NMRA) International Masters Racquetball Championships Men's 45+ division, at the US Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs this past July. Bruce, currently ranked fourth in the USRA ranking system in Men's 45+ in Illinois, won all 8 of his matches in the round-robin tournament. Bruce made steady progress over the past several years, going from 6th to 5th in 1997 and 1998, to 2nd last year in Champaign, before coming out on top this year. Those who know Bruce would say that his trip to the top is just a small indication of his character, showing perseverance and endurance as he strives toward a goal.

Competitors in his division came from all over the country, including players from Indiana, Texas, Florida, Arizona and Colorado. In all, over 220 Masters attended the tournament. Players must be at least 45 years old to enter. "I was disappointed with the draw from Illinois players last year when the tournament was held in Champaign," he said. There were more Ohio players in attendance than from our own state." This year saw a few Illinois players making the trip including long-time Illinois players, John O'Donnell, Jr. and Leo Klimaitis, among others. "This is a great tournament," Bruce noted. "It is held in a different facility each year during July. It is well run, with no refs and the matches are spread out over three days, Thursday through Saturday." Next year, he notes, the tournament will be back in our neck of the woods, since it is being held in West Allis, Wisconsin. Illinois players should take notice.

"This tournament is always held in great locations," he says, "but I never saw a finer facility than the US Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs. The courts were just as clean as can be and playing at altitude (Colorado Springs sits at 7,200 feet above sea-level) was really something."

Hopefully, Illinois Masters' over 45 will follow Bruce's lead and catch some summertime competition next July. For the rest of us Juniors, we now have something else to look forward to in the summer of our racquetball careers.

Klimaitis takes on the World(s)



Leo swears every word of the story is true. Especially the last part. "Playing racquetball overseas is a great feeling. You feel like you are a pioneer. Helping to energize the sport in Europe. Maybe this helps in some small way bring the sport to the Olympic level." To be in the Olympics, a sport has to be played on a worldwide basis. Gary Mazaroff, Ampro Coordinator and tournament director for the World Singles in Albuquerque and the World Doubles, feels that way as well. "This is an excellent way to bring racquetball overseas. We had participants from 6 countries and everyone had a great time."

What about the time spent playing racquetball when you could be traveling around Europe? "As it turns out," Leo noted, "this is an excellent way to see Europe. The number of contacts that you make is incredible. The schedule is not demanding and leaves plenty of time for fun. You play 2-3 matches per day over a 4 day period, with the matches scheduled back-to-back so that you don't spend the whole day at the club. One night a banquet is held with all of the participants invited." Gary Mazaroff noted that they intend to eventually move the tournament around to different locations but that it will be held next year at the same facility in Paris (the Club Form) April 26-29, 2001. Although 'the old man of racquetball', Ruben Gonzalez, attended the tournament and won the 45's, pro level of play is not required.

So, congratulations to Leo and Sue. They both seem like World Champions to us.



1999/2000 USRA Rankings for Illinois Men Players

These are the USRA rankings for the state of Illinois, taken from all sanctioned tournaments through the 2000 National Championships in Houston. As such these are your official year 2000 National rankings. Remember you get USRA ranking points for each quarterfinal finish and higher. National and Regional tournaments give more ranking points than the State Singles which gives more points than your local state tournaments. However, the more you play (and the better) the more points you get. Simple. Since points are maintained for a rolling 12 month period, some of the ranked players are now playing other brackets. Remember, in Illinois: NATIONAL RANKING DOES NOT EQUAL SEEDING. Even the National Singles Championship did not use the national ranking system to seed players. Because it captures the quantity of play (the more you play, the more points you get), as well as quality, it is not a seeding system. A perfect example is Jim Ellenberger's #1 ranking in Men's Open over #2 ranked Tim Sweeney. Tim hasn't played in as many tournaments as Jim, although both do very well in the tournaments that they enter. One or the other usually wins and Tim has beaten Jim every time they have met in the finals. Tim beat Jim in this past year's State Singles, but Jim won Regionals in which Tim didn't play. That cost him points and leaves him ranked second. Tournament Directors would seed Tim ahead of Jim.

SO, what do the national rankings mean? Well, even though these points don't mean anything for seeding, the USRA national ranking system is still a fun way to judge your performance versus others playing in your division or playing in other states. And let's face it...getting a high ranking in the USRA system is a nice recognition, especially if it is high enough to gain top 10 status nationwide. That means you get published in the USRA Magazine. (The top 25 nationally in each division get published on the USRA's Racquetball Magazine website at www.racqmag.htm)

Illinois tournaments are seeded using the Illinois ranking system. This system compares your actual performance versus predicted performance and gives seeding points based on those predictions. You have three main ways to gain points in Illinois: win a match you were expect to lose, win bigger than expected or lose by less than expected and you gain points. You also are awarded bonus points for every ten matches recorded in the system. Quantity counts in Illinois too, but it is not as big a factor as with the National system. You can lose points three ways as well: Lose a match you were expected to win, win by less than expected or lose by more than expected and you lose points. Every point in every match counts in Illinois. If you are getting blown out...keep fighting. It might help your seeding in the next tournament. Winners can still lose points even while winning so you have to play hard no matter what. Anyway, for what it is worth, here are the USRA National Rankings for state of Illinois players:

MEN's OPEN

Not a lot of changes in Men's ranking but the good news is we now have 32 players ranked. Through the first half of the year, only 15 Illinois players had made it to a quarterfinal match and earned ranking points. Players making a move included Andy Hawthorne, who jumped from 9 to 3, but might have trouble moving up any farther as he is off to college in Ohio in the fall. Might get him back for a few weekend tournaments, we'll have to see. Nick Radloff is back from injury and the golf course and moved to 8 on the list after being absent for a number of years. Tim Sweeney is going to have to play Regionals to get past Jim Ellenberger in points, so long as Jim does well at State's and wins Regionals, Tim can't make the move. Obviously he has the game to do it.

MEN's A

The turnover coming in Men's A is going to be interesting to watch. Out of the top 10 ranked below, only Al Rubiano, Chris Cotton and Bob Morrison are still playing Men's A!!! The rest have moved on to Men's Open and will be falling off the list over the next 12 months. That leaves a lots of room at the top so we are expecting to see big moves this year, especially from players such as Kevin Johnson, Jim Elliot, Jeff Grace and Keith Avery who are all playing well. Even those further down the list have excellent possibilities, if they get off the stick and start playing more regularly. My money out of that group would be on Chris Selvig and Keith Kareiva who both got game. Lastly, you have some solid B players who have the skills to challenge in the A group. Those would include Martin Gonzalez and Miguel Saavedra, among others. Still, it will be some time before anyone can best Cary Slade's top spot even though he has moved on to Open. Cary almost doubled his points with his high quality of play here in state (winning or taking second in a number of tournaments) and doing well in the Regionals in St. Louis and placing well at Nationals. His point total puts him as the #1 Men's A player in the country!!! Cary did it right. He booked a high quantity of top finishes and went out in style. He quite deserved his Illinois Player of the Year status. The race to take over Cary, Eric Rieman's and Ben Croft's top 3 spots begins now....

MEN's B

Wow! We have 61 ranked players in Men's B. That's impressive. However, as with Men's A, we have a wide open field coming into Men's B for the 2000-2001 season. With 4 out of the top 10 (Gonzalez, Ayres, Saavedra, Coyner) and 9 out of the top 20 (Mecklenburg, Gutierrez, Johnson, Cwynar and Brownewell) on the move up to Men's A, the rankings in this division will go through some rapid turnover. These changes should open the way for frequent tournament players: Dick Heithoff, Ed Libby, Ray Meisner to battle it out for the top spots, among others. You will have to watch out for Dan Pepin and David Royster as well. Both have the skills to challenge.



Men's Age Rankings.

Again, some differences with National rankings show up here in the age groupings. It is difficult to run every age group at every tournament due to the lack of court space and in the interest of having full draws for every age bracket. Often age groups are combined and it is hard to award points to the bracket that a participant signed up for. (Example: You sign up for 35+ and only one other player signs up in that age group. Your division gets combined with the 30+ and do to a lack of court space no play-off is offered. The points you get will go into the 30+ division.) We will not be able to solve all problems like this, but an effort will be made to try to improve in this area. Another example is the tradition in Illinois of offering Intermediate divisions in some age brackets, where Intermediate is defined as a B/C level of player. In the National system, there is no B/C division. It is A/B or C/D. Clubs in Illinois do not have the court space to play both divisions and demand has not indicated that full divisions can be filled. Again, we hope to work with tournament directors to improve in this area. Running a tournament is a difficult task and it is hard to accommodate all of the demands. Feedback away from the hustle of the tournament control desk would be very helpful. If you have any comments or suggestions email them to me any I will see that they get to the right person.
