## From The President

Sometimes being president of an all volunteer organization can be very trying.... And sometimes it can be great. Saturday, April 8<sup>th</sup> was one of the great days. I had the honor of recognizing the nominees and presenting awards to this year's ISRA award winners.

Ben Croft received the "Most Improved Player" award. Ben has hit the big time, although he's not yet old enough to drive himself there. Just last year Ben was playing in the Men's C division. This season he won the Men's B division at the Southlake Fall Open as well as two A tournaments. At the Palos Olympic tournament, Ben entered the Open division. Although he lost his first round match, Ben went on to win the Men's AA division playing against some seasoned tournament veterans.

Nominees for "Male Player of Year" were Bill Lyman and Cary Slade. Bill is a former winner of this award and a dominant player on the state, regional, and national levels. He is also a current National Doubles Champion. Cary is a player whose skills are on the rise. Cary won the ISRA State Singles Men's B division in 1999 and the Men's A division in 2000. In between he finished in the top four in the big tournaments and won several tournaments with smaller draws. I'm sure the guys will give him a great welcome to the Open division next fall. The award went to Cary Slade. Congratulations, Cary.

Nominees for "Female Player of the Year" included Terri Graham, Cheryl Gudinas, and Ellen Somberg. Terri completed a feat no one has ever accomplished. She won THREE national championships at this year's USRA National Doubles Championships. Cheryl's accomplishments go on and on. She has won this award multiple times. She is the current USRA National Open Champion, the reigning Pan-Am Games champion, and a member of the USRA National Team. Ellen has played in many tournaments this season and has been making some big noise on the court. Ellen won the Mixed A division at State Doubles with long time partner, Jim Hillman. She won a couple of singles tournaments and played on the Palos Olympic Travel Team. When Terri Graham accepted the award she gave much of the credit for her victories to partners Chris Evon and Bill Lyman. Congratulations, Terri.

It was really an honor to recognize the "Distinguished Service Award" nominees. The things this group does to support and promote racquetball just leaves me in awe. The nominees were Rich Clay, Mike Davern, Pam Grace, and Sean Nelson. Rich is the ISRA Treasurer, the USRA National Rules Commissioner, an exemplary sportsman, and a dedicated tournament volunteer. Mike has spent SO much time helping out racquetball this year. He attends every tournament, whether playing or not, so that he can gather the results and enter them on the ISRA's website on Sunday nights. He's also taken on responsibility for this newsletter and uses much of the information he gathers at tournaments to create articles for the newsletter. As ISRA Webmaster he is the ISRA's link to the racquetball world. Pam assumed most of the responsibility for the ISRA Travel League at the beginning of last season. She has maintained participation, organized the league and party, and handled all of the ongoing issues with the league. She's also helped at many tournaments and assisted me with phone calls and such whenever I've asked. Sean has been one of our best "grass roots" promoters of racquetball. He has been responsible for racquetball programs at 3 different YMCA's over the last few years, introducing the sport to many

## Golden Masters Show the Way!

I had some time to kill while waiting for my match to begin at this year's 2000 ISRA State Singles Championships at the Athletic Club of Bloomingdale and found myself watching Chuck Martarano play Ken Yahiro in the Men's 70+ division. Now, neither man will ever wear the ink off of their racquet strings or the label off of a new ball during a tournament match, but they epitomize what the game is all about. No fancy outfits (I don't think that Ken ever wears anything but a plain white T-shirt), just functional clothing and a good sweat while competing for a State Championship against a good friend and frequent foe.

These guys are over 70, yet moving like men twenty years younger—playing without a referee and never disputing a call. I saw compliments and smiles for good shots and disappointment when they got to the ball and failed to put it out of their opponent's reach. They relied on smart court positioning and control, rather than power. However, to my surprise, both had powerful serves, that I estimated traveled in excess of 80mph down the line.

Racquetball is truly a lifetime sport and watching Chuck and Ken play reminded me of why many of us play racquetball. We can't all play like Sudsy Monchik or Cliff Swain, but when I see Ed Olah, John O'Donnell Jr., Joe Sulli, Bob Beiner, Chuck, Ken and all the other players 65 years young on the court, I realize that I'm only halfway through my racquetball career and that I have another 25 years to figure out how to hit my backhand!!!

## Summertime Blues

Well, the warm weather is on its way and our attention will likely focus on things other than racquetball. But for the diehards out there, myself included, who play year round, a few tips about caring for your racquet in the warm weather. First, never leave your racquet, just like your pet, in an enclosed space where the heat becomes oppressive. This does two bad things. It weakens the bonding agents that hold your expensive graphite together. Not a good thing. Second, it causes the strings, particularly if the racquet isn't kept in its protective cover, to get really loose. The high heat and humidity hastens the tendency of all tensioned strings to want to relax. You'll be wondering why the crisp feel you have now is mush in July. Of course, the stringer is happy, business is after all, business. So, like winter care, avoid extremes of heat and humidity. Store your racquet in a cool, dry place away from direct sunlight. I want to take these last lines to thank each of you with whom I've had dealings during this year's tournaments and I look forward to seeing you again next season. It's a pleasure serving the best racquetball people in the nation. During my travels in the racquetball world, I am always impressed by how well represented we are and by how we conduct ourselves in state as well as out. ## Sue Eazow inducted into ISRA Hall of Fame

There was an element of surprise in the air. When Sue Carow attended the USRA Regionals Tournament at Glass Court on Saturday, April 15th she had no idea she was there to be inducted into the ISRA's Hall of Fame. She thought she was just invited to come over and visit with some old friends and former competitors.

There was a great group of "old timers" present, people who were active tournament players in the 70's and 80's and whose participation has waned during the 90's, due to injury, family, time, or whatever. I think they would all tell you that it's not because they don't love racquetball. Anyway, it was great to see many of Illinois' best gathered together.

Sue Carow was presented with the "Hall of Fame Award" during the ISRA's annual awards ceremony. Sue's accomplishments are many. She has won several state and regional championships (both singles and doubles), and also has at least one national championship on her resume. Sue's home club was the Lattof YMCA in DesPlaines. Sue was something of a "gym rat", jumping on any open court she encountered to get in a few minutes of practice or play. Sue was also ranked in the top 5 in the early days of the WPRA (Women's Pro Racquetball Association), when she was in her early forties.

Many of the women in the crowd credited Sue for elevating the

level of their own play. Colleen (Shields) Johnson, Chris Evon, and Cheryl Gudinas all learned things from playing against Sue that helped them improve their own games. I remember watching Sue play relatively late in her career. I thought she looked pretty beatable... until I got on the court with her. Then I found that her tenacity and will to win overcame my skills. I also observed Cheryl playing Sue early in Cheryl's career. Sue helped Cheryl learn how to control her emotions on the court. Cheryl is one person you will NEVER see get rattled during a match these days.

#### St. Valentine's Day Massacre Tournament Results

February 11-13, 2000

We always start these things working on what happened on the Men's side of the draw. Hey, its Valentine's Day weekend so let's cover the Women first. While the women don't come out in force for this tournament (Illinois women seem to pick and choose their spots on the tournament calendar). Julie Vincent seems to like this weekend just fine. For the second year in a row, she takes her division, this time winning the Women's Open/A instead of the A/B. As a Bloomingdale member she must have felt right at home as she put down her fellow Bloomingdale travel league teammate, Donna Heinzl, 12-15, 15-12, 11-5. Now we just have to get her out to play at some other tournaments on the Illinois calendar. What do you say Julie? Speaking of feeling right at home, how about the mother/ daughter team of Pam Hepp and Krystal Csuk teaming up for the Women's Doubles. While not as nice a story-line as the last time they played as partners (which happened two years ago when they faced another mother/daughter team of Kerri and Gerri Stoffregren in the finals). This time at least the story had a happy ending as Pam and Krystal took out Barb Utterback and Diane Bunker, 15-11, 15-4.

On the men's side the story-line starts with the Men's 30/35+ and ends with a 15-year old. Although the draw was up (as with every tournament held so far this year), tournament director, Dave Negrete decided to go without a Men's Open division, opting instead for a fuller Men's 30/35+ draw. This change put Eugene Coyle in the unenviable position of standing in the backcourt of the 30/35+ finals, having to face Tim Sweeney's drive serve with another serve opportunity if that one goes short. In the Open at least, Tim only gets one photon serve. While Eugene played very competitively in the first game, losing 15-11, in the second Tim took his serve up another notch and all Eugene could say to crack after crack was, "Nice serve". What can you do when someone is on like that? Eugene called time out once, put the ball in his pocket and walked out of the court, but that didn't work either. Second game and match, 15-1, Sweeney. At the other end of the age spectrum we go to young Ben Croft playing in the finals of Men's A, where Ben turned 15 over the weekend. Now last year, Ben loses in the quarters of the Men's C. This year he ends up playing his doubles partner from Men's A doubles, John Bertholomey and wins 15-5, 15-12. #### State Singles Tournament

"State Champion". In some years past, that title has been slightly tarnished because the competition was not up to snuff. Not so this year. Tournament host Dave Negrete made sure of that. Illinois' State Singles Championships pulled in one of the largest draws in recent history. Even with 10 courts in action at The Athletic Club of Bloomingdale (now one of the biggest facilities in the state) competition had to start on Thursday in order to accommodate all of the matches. Dave also enlisted the aid of sponsors Dave Milazzo, Keith Minor, and Tony Sambo in order to add some cash to the prize list for the Men's Open division.

And, what a level of play !! Illinois' top men's Open players are not always required to perform at full throttle in local tournaments. Often they get to coast by in second gear as they beat up on some poor sap moving up from the A division. (They've even been known to take bets on how quickly they can dispatch the poor sap.)

The semi-final and finals matches definitely required more than 20 minutes. They were great matches. Tim Sweeney brought his whole arsenal and took the title away from last year's winner, Jim Ellenberger. No one in Illinois has ever learned how to handle Tim's hot drive serve.

But let's not get ahead of ourselves. The semi-final matches were something to watch. Dale Johnson met Sweeney in the semi's and scored 8 and 9, respectively. In an even closer match, Jim Ellenberger beat Eugene Coyle 11-15, 15-1 and 11-9. The finals match, pitting Sweeney against Ellenberger, left the spectators asking for more. Tim's serve was king, though, as each rally ended either on the serve or within 3 shots. Final score: 15-6, 15-4.

If you took a look at the Men's Open quarter-final draw you found the names of Illinois' eight best male players. Besides Sweeney, Ellenberger, Johnson, and Coyle, the draw included Andy Hawthorne, Dave Negrete, John Negrete, and Keith Minor. A VERY impressive group.

Other impressive wins in this tournament included Angelo Moca's AA win over Doug Halverson in a close match and Cary Slade's second full draw Men's A win over the always tough Eric "Rocket Serve" Reiman. Miguel Saavedra (Men's B) and Juan Alcanter (Men's C) solidified their seasons with impressive wins. Both are ready for a move to the next level. In Men's D, rapidly improving Vito Rubiano got surprised by newcomer Oscar Corona. While Oscar HAS to move up to Men's C, Vito's semi-final finish in Men's D and quarter-final finish in Men's C proves that he's also ready to move upward.

Consistency was the name of the game in the men's age divisions. Perennial winners Eugene Coyle (30+), Dave Negrete (35+), Bill Lyman (40+), Bruce Nelson (45+), and Joe Silius (50+) form a "Who's Who" roster of Illinois age group players.

The number of players in the Women's divisions were not nearly as impressive as the wins were. With powerhouses Cheryl Gudinas




# Notice of Election of ISRA Officers
