## President's Message: Digesting '94 and What's Ahead!

At this time of year this column lends itself to a review of events from the past twelve months. In keeping with this stance, following are some of the highlights of 1994:

1. The National Governing Body for our sport (AARA) revealed some worth for the first time; complementing its substantial archives and great staff with real estate and cash assets.
2. The number of tourney players was down, and the percentage of female players to male players decreased. ON THE UPSIDE... the quality of events improved and directors became more sensitive to needs of entry level and older players. Also, the percentage of female players at the World Seniors increased to 33 percent.
3. Racquetball started its second generation; it no longer is in its infancy stage. Focus should turn towards the direction of quality programming and a steady growth.
4. Episodes of *Deep Space Nine* indicated that racquetball will be around for a LONG TIME.

So what is in store for our immediate future? January of '95 will mark the twentieth anniversary year for the New Mexico Invitational Championships. Perhaps we will surpass the 300 participant mark again!

Our sport will be in the Pan American Games this March in Argentina. Many sports are not included! A stronger presence from the professional game is likely, with an increase in manufacturers' involvement, stronger purses, and more tourney stops. Will this insurgence filter down into the grass roots levels; at clubs, fitness centers and apartment complexes where court removal or conversion to

office space and activity centers have been realities? I think so; but we must use all of our available resources to assure success.

Politically speaking, racquetball has been successful, having reached Group A status under the U.S.O.C. in a relatively short period. It is now campaigning with Squash for a cooperative entry into the Sydney Olympiad in the year 2000.

Schools must give more support through P.E. programs and focused administrators. Colleges must utilize existing facilities with stronger

programming at the intramural, extramural and instructional levels. More industry personnel should train in the areas of marketing, teaching, and human relations.

We racquetball players have many options for filling our leisure time and for spending our discretionary income. We must not allow for our courts to be removed; and we must not allow for them to remain idle either.

Our professionals must make their positions count, by creating opportunities for enjoyable programs to keep courts filled. Include singles and doubles to cutthroat activity, entry level players to seasoned veterans, juniors to golden masters, and women and men. Let's welcome participation from members and guests, disabled and disadvantaged, and Olympians and Special Olympians.

Emphasize safe and enjoyable recreation for all who have the ability to lift a racquet

and walk or wheel onto a court. Encourage our constituents to play other court activities including handball, squash, and paddleball.

With the onset of the Holiday Season, make resolutions that are realistic for a healthy, consistent lifestyle. "I am going to get in shape," is overused and abused this time of year. Use racquetball as part of your overall workout regimen. Enjoy the game; practice and improve your skills. Purchase new equipment locally; support your club pro shop and other outlets.

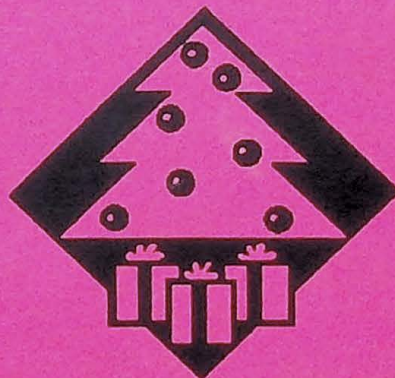

## AARA Initiates U.S. Open Championships

The U.S. Open Championships, among the most prestigious events in the world of golf and tennis, has made its entry into racquetball. The inaugural three-day tournament will be held February 17-19, 1995, in Indianapolis, Indiana.

Patterned very closely after the World Seniors, the AARA U.S. Open Racquetball Championships will use a round-robin format, with four to eight players in a bracket, before going into the medal round. More than 350 players are expected for the event which will utilize the Keystone Fitness Center and Greenbriar Athletic Club which boast a total of 22 courts.

Two specific items will separate this from all other AARA National Championships and Invitationals--it will be played in three days versus the normal five to six days, and along with open and age divisions of 19+ to 80+, it will include A-B-C-D skill divisions.

**Luke St. Onge**, AARA Executive Director, called the U.S. Open "unique and exciting. This event, and the format under which it is played, offers players of all skill levels a chance to compete under the same roof."

The age and open divisions are Level 5 events, which put them on par with the World Seniors, National Golden Masters

Invitational and National Women's Invitational. The Ektelon/AARA U.S. National Singles and National Doubles are Level 6 events. The skill level division segment is a Level 3.

There are a few twists in the format, according to **Mike Arnolt**, tournament director for the event. Round-robin matches, 3 games to 11 (and you must play all 3) will be played back to back. They will be self-officiated. Disputes will be settled with a choice of dueling pistols, knives, or disqualification, Arnolt said with levity.

He pointed out that all other tournaments which run with this system are virtually problem-free. The scoring for the round-robin bracket will play in a straight draw Sunday. Those matches will be two out of three games to 11, and the finals will be two out of three games to 15, with an 11-point tiebreaker.

This inaugural event promises something special. Olive Garden is providing the hospitality. Each player will receive a

monogrammed shirt. Players not eligible for the straight draw may participate in a complimentary blind draw handicap doubles event.

A Saturday Night Social will feature a catered snack buffet. In addition, silent and live auctions will benefit the National Scholarship and Olympic Dream Funds. Finally, there will be a disc jockey and door prizes.

The entry fee is \$55. Homewood Suites, which offers a multitude of amenities including free breakfast and scheduled shuttle service to the clubs, is the host lodging site. Special air fares are available from United Airlines. Penn Ultra Blue is the official ball for the U.S. Open. Ektelon will offer product door prizes.

Play begins at 8:00 a.m. on Friday, and because of the round-robin format, once a division is scheduled, all players in that division will start at the same time.

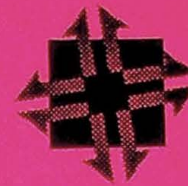

## You Make The Call

Is a referee, after a fault serve, obligated to announce "second serve"? What is the call? Answer in the next issue of **NMRA News**.

### From Last Issue...

If the server legally serves a 2nd serve, and the receiver, on the return, breaks the ball, what is the proper call--replay with 2nd serve or replay with 1st serve? What is the call?

The correct call is 2nd serve. A ball must be put in play in order to nullify a previous fault serve. A ball is put in play when a served ball is returned to the front wall unimpacted by a ball breakage.
