National Racquetball Organizations!!! Are you confused?? It seems that every six months there is a new racquetball organization (and a new set of letters) being formed. What I hope to do in this article is to help you understand what each organization is.

In the beginning there was the IRA (International Racquetball Assn.). Ihis was the first national racquetball association and it was founded by Bob Kendler in November, 1968

Bob Kendler then resigned from the IRA and formed the NRC (National Racquetball Club) in June 1973, which started professionalism in racquetball (money for pro players)

In July of 1974, the USRA (United States Racquetball Association) was formed. This was another national organization geared toward the amateur player.

In October 1979, the IRA became the AARA (American Amateur Racquetball Assn.). The AARA is now recognized as "the" national racquetball organization. The first president of the AARA was Keith Calkins and the executive director is luke St. Onge.

In May 1982, the USRA went bankrupt leaving the AARA as the to publically thank them for all their work.

Gary and Peggy Doty form our husband/wife combination on the Board. This couple too has done much to promote racquetball in Michigan as well as help the Board function as well as it does. Gary and Peggy have been on the Board for many years, and their insights and logic have helped the Board through rough times. I would like to thank them for the stability that they have given the Board through the years.

Jim Emerson and led Dutcher are two of our more mature Board members led is involved with the Team Concept this year while Jim is primarily serving as a tournament director and devil's advocate. These two individuals will often put problems and concerns into perspective. They were both instrumental in the formation of new player divisions (Masters B and Seniors C). I am pleased to have been associated with these two fine gentlemen.

Judy-Gonyea and Bill Gottlieb are two relatively new members. Judy serves as Secretary and Bill as primarily a tournament director. These two people are evolving into strong Board members. Bill and Judy are two of the Board's more silent members, but when they speak, they usually provide insight into a situation. Bill's big concern is seeding of the players. The Board often teases these two for their silence, but they are in the position of most new Board members—still feeling their way around and finding a place with the established Board members.

sole national organization.

OK on the National level--now on to the state level. As always, Michigan has been a hotbed for racquetball and this is shown by the fact that their are three organizations operating in the state.

The MARA (Michigan Amateur Racquerball Association) is the state affiliate of the AARA: The MARA was formed in July 1982 and its president is Larry Cole from Flint. The goal of the MARA is to promote racquerball at all levels (especially juniors) in Michigan

The MRA (Michigan Racquetball Association) was formed in the summer of 1976. The MRA was the state affiliate of the USRA until the fall of 1980 when the MRA felt it could better serve the Michigan player by existing independently. The first president of the MRA was Dennis Wood from Lansing.

Ihe goals of the MRA are to promote racquetball at all levels in Michigan and to run a series of oine state-wide tournaments which culminate in a state championship

The MCRA (Macomb County Racquetball Association) was formed in the summer of 1983. This organization was formed by and is run by Mike Witherspoon and Pancho Gutterrez. The MCRA is supported by Petitpren, Inc., distributor of Bud light Beer in Macomb County. The goal of the MCRA is to promote all levels of racquetball in Macomb County

I hope this cleared up the alphabet soup of racquetball organizations for you. In my next article I will explain the state organizations and their activities in more detail.

MRA Board of Directors

The MRA and you

One of the questions most often asked of Board members of the Michigan Racquetball Association is: "What does the MRA do for me?" As a neophyte player, I was extremely critical of those dedicated individuals attempting to provide QUALITY tournaments and organize racquetball in our state. Now, from the inside, is the time to answer this question from a fresh perspective.

There are this year, as there have been for the past five years; nine high-quality, well run tournaments which are geographically placed throughout Michigan for your convenience These tournaments are placed throughout the state irregardless of which areas will draw the most players. Men's, Women's and Junior divisions are offered at each stop. The State Championship is decided by the MRA Singles, Doubles and Juniors' tournaments WHEW!!!! That alone is an unbelievable amount of time and effort by a group of volunteers who all hold other full-time jobs.

Rating each player every month for each tournament that they enter is a statistical nightmare. Up to 600 computer entries are done monthly along with name and address changes. The rating print-out is available monthly at the tournament desk.

Quarterly newsletters with the latest information for the player are mailed to your home. Ratings, tournament results, articles, pictures, opinions, future tournaments and general information are all routine in your newsletter

Rules are set down in a well-organized booklet available to all members upon request. Complex rules are further explained in each newsletter Referee clinics are held all year at tournaments, clubs and on college campuses.

Grievances and special requests from members are handled at each Board meeting, providing the player will put the problem in writing or attend the meeting (Board meetings are the first Tuesday of each month at the Oak Park YMCA in Lansing and are open to all members and guests)

New to the MRA this year, is the membership card and the mailing of entry forms to each member's home. This membership card will help the player achieve special discounts at clubs, on housing, and for a national magazine. Just making sure each member receives his/her card requires a lot of time in preparing and organizing the cards (see articles on 50-Mile Raddius Discount and on National Racquetball Discount)

Also, this year the MRA has published the First Court Club Guide of Michigan. The effort taken to develop a survey that court club owners would respond to, mail the survey, receive and compile the results as well as type the book are some of the time consuming activities not readily seen by the player

The MRA continues to operate a tournament clearinghouse. Through this clearinghouse, conflicts of major tournament dates are held to minimum. This gives you, the player, a chance to compete in as many fine quality tournaments in Michigan as you choose to:

The MRA, long criticized for not having prize money tournaments, has scheduled two prize money events this year for any player who wishes to compete in the Men's Pro Open or Women's Pro Open events. These prize money events are funded only by the players who participate in them and through local sponsor contributions. No money from other division players is funnelled into a prize money event. The same is true for the Team Concept this year. It is a money event supported by the teams who enter. First prize in the Team Concept this year is 50% of all the money collected in the Team Concept during 1983-84

All these activities are carried on for you, the player, by eleven other players from Michigan who denate their time each month to promote racquetball. The MRA is a totally state-wide and state-based organization with you, the player in mind. So get involved and support and promote racquetball in Michigan

The MRA Board of Directors is pleased to announce the addition of a new Director. Gathie (Stellema) Frederickson was named to the MRA Board of Directors at the December 6, 1983 meeting. Cathie, a women's open player, is from Wayland and has been active in the Grand Rapids Patrons Association and in promoting racquetball in Western Michigan.

With the addition of Cathie to the Board, there are still three vacancies remaining to be filled. Qualifications for becoming a MRA Director include attendance at monthly Board meetings and a willingness to become actively involved in MRA activities and on committees

There are a few racquetball rules that people still are confused about at tournaments. This article is an attempt to clarify them.

Foot Fault - This is when the server has his/her foot outside or partly over, the short line when he/she begins the serve. And also when the server steps outside, or partly over, the service line on the serve And finally, when a person serves a ball (usually a lob) and steps out of the service zone before the ball has passed the short line plane.

Deliberate or not, all of the above are fault serves. A foot fault is like a short or long serve. It is a fault (bad) serve with one more serve coming. Yes, the foot fault is appealable

RULES

Receiving line violations - The receiver may not infringe on the receiving lines (5 foot hash marks on the walls) until the ball has either bounced beyond the short line or passed the receiving lines Therefore, the receiver may NOI execute a fly return within the 5 foot safety zone

This means that when returning a lob serve (which is going to bounce behind the receiving lines) the receiver must have his feet behind the receiving lines and make contact with the ball BERIND the receiving line plane.

The receiver, after making contact, behind the receiving line, may follow through and break the receiving line plane

on the serve, is the receiver allowed to break the short line plane with either his racquet or his body. Violation by the receiver results in a point for the server THIS IS A JUDGEMENI CALL WHICH CANNOT BE APPEALED

This receiving line rule is a MRA (USRA) rule and is used at all MRA tournaments. The "Super Seven" Series has also adopted this rule this year. Rumor has it that the AARA may soon adopt this version of the rule

Time Outs - Between the first and second games and also between the second and tie breaker are all five (5) minutes



3 Tournament Rule

Again this year, to be eligible for the MRA State Singles Championship to be held at Franklin Racquet Club in April 1984, a player must have participated in 3 MRA tournaments. The State Doubles/State Juniors Championship will again count as one of the three tournaments necessary. This means that there are still 4 tournaments left to qualify: MRA #5 - Oakland Racquet Club in Birmingham, MRA #6 - Court Players Club in Portage, MRA #7 - Racquet King Courts in Irenton and the State Doubles/State Juniors in Birmingham.

Any player forfeiting in the first round of a MRA tournament will be considered as NOT having participated and that tournament will not count as one of the three required. Also, MRA Doubles #1 held in Grand Rapids and MRA Doubles #2 held in Birmingham do not count as tournament stops to qualify for the State Singles Championship.

Any requests for special consideration or requests to have this rule waived should be addressed to the MRA Board of Directors in writing at the following address: MRA, PO Box 23035, lansing, MI 48909. All such requests must be received by March 31, 1984 and will be discussed for approval or denial at the April 3, 1984 MRA Board of Directors meeting
