FAIRTRADE FORTNIGHT

22 February to 7 March 2021

Fairtrade Fortnight 2021 is focussing on the growing challenges that climate change brings to farmers and workers in the communities Fairtrade works with. The climate crisis is an immediate and ever-increasing threat and those in climate-vulnerable countries are already seeing its impacts from droughts and crop disease to floods, heatwaves and shrinking harvests. With the emergence of the global Covid-19 pandemic, the challenges that farmers face now are bigger than ever before with falling commodity prices and widespread shocks reverberating along our global supply chains. On-going poverty in farming communities makes it increasingly hard to cope with the effects of climate change.

Bishop Mike sums up the situation like this: *"In this time of global pandemic, it is important that we do not forget those who rely on the stable prices and social premium that Fairtrade offers. Many of our brothers and sisters in developing countries struggle to sell their products at a decent price but Fairtrade offers hope to 1.7million farmers, farm workers and their families around the world. Consumer choice is one of the concrete ways we can serve the poor with relatively little cost to ourselves. The more Fairtrade goods we can buy, the greater their chances of being lifted out of poverty and providing a brighter future for their children."*
