While, we A limited amount of earth-tone rock may be permitted for occasionally find residents who simply place a low priority on drive up appeal, we are pleased that most of us have rock of any size or color as ground cover, requires prior worked on the beauty of our homes both inside AND out!

Before you spend \$\$\$ on changes, we wanted to remind you that our Landscape Regulations have been updated. Please make note of the following:

- 17.2 Front and side lawns visible from the street must be sodded predominantly with St. Augustine grass.
- 17.3 Trellises, lattices, window boxes, arbors, and permanent brick, stone, and poured concrete borders must have MC approval.
- 17.4 Landscape timbers and bricks without mortar do not need MC approval unless they exceed a height of two (2')
- 17.5 Planting beds located in front of the house must be planted with evergreen (non-deciduous) shrubs, which are dense enough to obscure most (at least 75%) of the slab from street view.

All planting beds in public view must be mulched and kept free of weeds and other yard debris, e.g. excess leaves. Mulch must be composed of natural material like hardwood chips or bark mulch, and be black or natural in color. No

drainage or for aesthetic purposes, but the use of gravel or approval.

Plant species considered noxious or invasive including, but not limited to, bamboo, weeping willow, cottonwood, and chinese tallow are prohibited.

17.6 Dead or damaged trees or shrubs, which in the opinion of the Modification Committee, and or its arborist, may create a hazard to property or persons, or to the aesthetic beauty of The Commonwealth, shall be promptly removed or repaired. If the tree or shrub is not removed by the homeowner upon request, then the Association may remove or cause to be removed, such trees or shrubs at the homeowner's expense and shall not be liable for damage caused by such removal.

Please be sure you keep this information in mind should you decide to do some outdoor work this year.

Commonwealth Tennis Courts are for Commonwealth residents.

We understand that many of our residents use Tennis Coaches to help enhance their playing skills. This is not a problem, however, these coaches MUST register beforehand with Crest Management.

The tennis coaches must then follow all Tennis Court Rules and must enter AND exit with the Commonwealth resident. They are not to monopolize the courts for hours at a time. Please be sure that the gate is secure as you leave the courts. The number of unauthorized users is increasing and we need your assistance.

Commonwealth residents have tennis court keys which help us manage the number of non-residents using our courts. WE pay for the maintenance and upkeep of the tennis courts and, while we are happy that residents make use of them, we do want to be diligent in ensuring that the courts are not monopolized by outsiders.

(There are plenty of Commonwealth homes on the market for those who REALLY want to enjoy our tennis courts!)

Spring Home Care Tip

Consider purchasing a protective cap for your chimney. One with a screen or that covers the entire top of the chimney. While you're at it, take a look at the grout. After 20-30 years, the grout at the top of the chimney often cracks and provides leakage paths for water. This can be done while you add the cap.

These caps keep out foreign objects (birds, tennis balls) as well as rain that can mix with the ash and eat away at the fireplace's walls.

Trim Them Right!

Tree removal and trimming provides multiple benefits. (while still as early in the season as possible). Removing/pruning trees will allow sunlight to penetrate to the turf below allowing grass to thrive and prevent soil runoff The City of Sugar Land has ordinances regarding branch during rain events. Tree removal will also allow streetlights to illuminate the street to allow for safer roadways. And pruning of branches allows for the free flow of pedestrian traffic on our sidewalks.

Most Texas trees should be trimmed during the coldest months of the year - for us, that would be November through February - when the tree is in the dormant part of its growth cycle. Trimming trees when they're dormant helps the cut wounds heal faster, reducing the risk of disease and insect infestation.

To get a little more specific about the best times to trim certain varieties of Texas trees, late winter is the best time to prune Texas trees that are either non-blooming or summerblooming. This includes crepe myrtles and many other varieties prevalent in many Texas yards. Trees that bloom in spring, on the other hand, such as mountain laurels and redbuds, should be trimmed immediately after they bloom

height. They do occasionally visit neighborhoods to check for compliance.

To ensure that your trees are trimmed properly, consider using a highly trained crew, people who truly understand how to effectively trim your trees to enhance future growth.
