2018 POOL SEASON

Pool tags are required for entry to either of The Commonwealth pools. They will be issued to any homeowner that is in good standing with the Association. To obtain pool tags, go to **www.crest-management.com** and complete the pool registration form on the home page. Pool tags will be mailed to residents upon receipt and verification of the request form. Registration and pick up of pool tags <u>in person</u> at Crest Management's office will incur a \$20 Charge.

Pool tags will be checked by management personnel when entering the pool facility. If a tag is not in the resident's possession or cannot be verified, residents and/or others may be asked to leave the facility. With the exception of community pool parties, only residents with a valid pool tag will be allowed into the pool area. Each pool tag allows 2 guests. A Pool Tag Application form will be posted on our website once Crest has it ready (www.commonwealthcivic.com).

Incorrect repairs can be extremely costly.





- · equipment must be located in unobtrusive locations
- · wiring must be hidden from public view
- · equipment and mounting hardware must be of color similar to mounting surface
- · camera viewing area must not violate neighbor's privacy.

Spring Has Sprung

It's spring cleanup time for our yards.

We should soon be learning which plants and shrubs survived the freezes. Please keep in mind the current Landscaping Guidelines (ACC Guidelines, Sec. 17) when you replace your missing plants, shrubs, and trees.

Generally, landscaping does not require a Modification Application unless it is intended to achieve a structural objective such as a hedge. Front and side lawns in public view must be primarily sodded with San Augustine grass.

Lattices, trellises, and permanent borders require approval. Planting beds in front of the house must be planted with non-deciduous shrubs that are dense enough to obscure the view of the house slab from the street (at least 75% coverage). Planting beds that are visible should be covered with natural color or black mulch (i.e. no dyed red mulch).

The current ACC Guidelines may be found on the CommonwealthCivic.com website.

Please note: City of Sugar Land ordinances prohibit ANY signs from being placed in the common areas of our community.

This includes Garage Sale, Realtor Signs, political signs, and signs for all goods and services. The City will pick up and trash the signs when they drive through.

Don't forget about your trees!

By city ordinance, all trees and limbs growing in or near a right-of-way must be trimmed to the regulated height stated by city ordinance:

Where the tree overhangs a residential street, there
must be a clear space under the tree that is 12 feet above
the street surface and 8 feet above the sidewalk surface.
