Take A Bite Out of Crime

In a recent conversation with Sugar Land PD, we were informed that the rate of residential burglaries and burglary of motor vehicles are down in the City of Sugar Land.

The top locations for burglaries of motor vehicles are fitness centers and hotels. Restaurants and movie theaters can also be included. The rationale is that when the driver enters one of these facilities, he/she will be inside for a good length of time. That gives the perpetrator a reasonable period to break into your vehicle and take whatever is in sight.

Don't misunderstand, professional thieves can break into and steal from a car or truck in as little as 10 seconds!

Remember to take the following precautions:

- Remove all portable contents from plain sight. Do not leave ANYTHING in view. Take your cell phone, computer, purse, etc. with you. Even that bag of dirty laundry in the back seat can be a target. Wrongdoers do not know what's in the bag. As far as they are concerned, it could be an item of value.
- If it's not something you wish to take with you, HIDE the item. Lock it in the trunk, or place it under the seat. HINT: Do this before you leave home, you never know when you're being watched.
- •Lock your car. Even if you only plan to be away from it for a few minutes, LOCK it. Many officers will also suggest that you lock your vehicle even inside your own garage.

At Home.....

- · Always keep your doors locked.
- Get to know your neighbors and know which vehicles belong to them.
- Report any suspicious activity.
- If someone comes to your door when you are home alone, do NOT ignore them but do NOT open the door. Speak to them through the door. That way, they know someone is in the house (and they will have no idea you are alone!)

The Block Captain Program has worked in our neighborhood for decades! Even if you don't have an "official" captain, it would behoove you to have someone collect contact information for each home on the block. That way you can stay in touch and it gives you a way to get in touch with neighbors in the event of an emergency. (And you never know when a hurricane might come through!)



Did You Know?

The Sugar Land Fire Department will conduct a FREE smoke alarm check for city residents. Just visit the city's website: www.sugarlandtx.gov and go to Fire/EMS.

While you are at it, you can also schedule a fire and safety inspection. Consider doing this. It could save your life!

Fire fighting has become a highly advanced science. In truth, there is much, much more to the Sugar Land Fire - EMS Department ("SLFE") than fighting fires. Like training for terrorism events, emergency medical care, and providing smoke alarms for our citizens in need.

The Citizens Fire Academy has a limited enrollment. You'll put on protective fire fighting gear, learn about fire strategy and tactics, and practice the basics of life saving.

Applications for this program will be accepted through December 31. Class will begin on January 4 and runs through March 8, 2018. The classes begin at 6:30 p.m. and run through 9:30 p.m.. They include 2 Saturdays in the field.

*The only requirements are that you must commit to attending this ten-week program, you must be at least 18-years-old and either live or work in Sugar Land or within the City's Extra Territorial Iurisdiction.

FENCES

Fences are a huge bone of contention with some residents in our community. All homeowners are responsible for maintaining, repairing and replacing their damaged fences. Most of us take that responsibility seriously and do take the necessary steps when our fences begin to look run down.

There are, however, some residents who simply don't notice (or choose not to care) that the fences surrounding their homes are in need of care/replacement. It is the responsibility of our Management Company to notify those residents who are out of compliance and ask them to step up.

Crest does regularly send letters to those homeowners. These letters (which cost us money) are then followed up with attorney letters (costing us even MORE money) and can eventually end up in a law suit, costing EVERYONE money.

This should not happen. When we purchased our homes, we signed a copy of the deed restrictions agreeing to follow the community's standards. No Commonwealth neighborhood is held to a higher standard than the others.

It is incumbent upon all residents to do their part in maintaining our beautiful community. It DOES impact the value of **your** home <u>AND</u> your neighbors' homes.

Street Parking

Please keep in mind that, while we all understand that any family may have multiple vehicles at their residence, (three children might result in five cars for one family) parking on the street is discouraged.

Vehicles parked on the street can cause valid concerns during times of emergency. If there are vehicles parked on both sides of the street, a fire truck or ambulance may have difficulty getting to their destination(s).

If you park across from a mailbox and someone stops to retrieve mail, passage becomes a challenge.

We strongly encourage you to use your driveway to park your vehicles at all times and show some courtesy to your neighbors.

If you are leaving town for any part of the holidays, be sure to let a trusted neighbor know of your plans. Leave them your contact information, in case of an emergency. Ask someone to walk/drive by and pick up any newspapers, circulars, packages, etc. on your property. Be safe!
