Annual Meeting Highlights

The following is a recap of information at our Annual Meeting held at the Clubhouse in May.

- **Board Member Election** Incumbents Dave Bristow, David Cao and Bob Bestow were unanimously re-elected to another two year term. (Thank you for volunteering to run again and devoting your time and expertise to our community for another two years.)
- Landscaping update- Over 30 trees were planted throughout the community. Old trees, and those at the end of their lifecycles, were replaced. New trees were planted in some areas that never had trees but, it was determined, needed them. There was more landscaping added along the oldest parts of fencing along Commonwealth Blvd. to partially hide the old wooden fences many of which need replacing. This year we will be working on revamping our irrigation system by moving rain sensors that, because of tree growth, are now located under trees and those sprinklers that are not working properly.
- Architectural Control Guidelines- Our document has been revised and is posted on our website for residents to review before updating or remodeling Commonwealth property. You may view it at www.commonwealthcivic.com, on the Guidelines and Forms page. Please take the time to review the new updated guidelines before starting modifications to the outside of your home.

Modifications/Deed Restrictions

The Modifications Committee has completed its periodic review of, and revisions to, our "ACC Guidelines" document. The resulting updated version has been reviewed and approved by the Association Board and filed with the county by our attorney. This document is available on the Commonwealth website, from Crest Management, and the Modifications Committee.

Generally, the numerous updates appearing in the newly revised document were made to clarify and simplify the existing Guidelines, however, **significant** changes have been made in the section regarding "Landscaping". The guidelines for landscaping have been changed little over the years, and were largely dictated by the original developer through our Deed Restrictions and CC&R's.

In our early years, all of the builder installed landscaping was new, or at least young. Over the years, like everything else, trees, shrubs, and other plants require maintenance and replacement. One area addressed in particular is the density of the plantings in front of houses with a view towards hiding the slab. In many cases, homeowners have removed dead shrubs and have not replaced them so that the front view of the house looks barren. In some cases, the trees planted in the yard have grown to the point where they shade the planting beds and so shrubs that are more shade tolerant than the shrubs planted by the builder are required. Landscaping has a lot to do with the "look" of a home and our neighborhood, as well as our neighborhood's curb appeal.

The new ACC Guidelines can be downloaded from the Commonwealth website (www.commonwealthcivic. com). Please submit an exterior modification request form for any outside work you want to do on your home. Just because you see something on another home does not mean that it complies with the current ACC Guidelines. The same applies to like-for-like replacements.

Exterior modification request forms should be delivered to Crest Management by the end of the day on the second Tuesday of the month.
