Melissa's Story - A Graduate of Masada House



I was in the Masada House program for three months. I heard about it in prison from a fellow inmate that I attended church with who also attended the Isaiah Ladies Recovery God's Way group. A lot of prayers were involved that made me decide to go to the program. Two to three years before my release, I started praying. Going with my family wasn't an option, so I needed to find a place to go. Many people discouraged me from coming to Farmington, but when I prayed, there was just a pull. It was a spiritual thing, and all the credit goes to God, who guided me into a relationship with Isaiah Ladies and Carolyn Evans.

When I arrived at Masada House, I felt overwhelmed with an ocean of emotions, uncertainty, and fear due to being in a new environment. One memory that stands out from my time at the house was with Executive Director Flora. Her embrace of kindness, at the time, I felt broken and insecure. Her ability to deal with someone in distress was something I hadn't experienced in such a long time. She stood beside me, guiding me until I felt stable enough to stand on my own.

One thing I would never change about the program is that it allowed for the freedom to seek your own recovery. It allowed me to go to church instead of AA meetings. Most programs are very different, but this allowed me to practice my faith and seek my recovery in my own way, and I am still clean and sober to this day. What I would say to any woman considering applying to the program is... don't hesitate. It's a great program, and I continue to blossom and grow wings. It was a great stepping stone for helping me to become who I am today. - Melissa
