Criteria for Instructor Approval—AP Studio Art: 2D

Successful completion of Digital Photo 1 and 2.
 OR

 Applies only to 12th graders who have only completed Digital Photo 1: Provide a 24 image portfolio to the instructor which will be evaluated using the Arizona State CTE Digital Photography Grade Scale. The student must score a 3 or 4 on this rubric to be admitted to the course.

Criteria for Instructor Approval—Medical Professions 2—Student Requirements

This program has strict attendance, dress code and achievement requirements.

 Successful completion of Medical Professions 1 with a final grade of at least 76% and Basic Life Support (BLS)

certificate.

- 2. Complete Student Information Form.*
- 3. Copy of Fingerprint Clearance Card. Card cannot expire before June 1, 2022. Obtain the Fingerprint Clearance Card packet and application from the Program Instructor.
- 4. Complete Health and Safety Documentation Checklist.*
- 5. Signed Healthcare Provider Signature Form.*
- 6. You will be required by the Clinical Care Facility to show proof of negative drug test result.

*Refer to Nursing Assistant Program Manual for more information - contact Instructor.

Failure to meet above requirements will result in non-admission to the program.

Off-site clinical training:

- 1. Outside of class time.
- 2. Minimum 40 hours of clinical training.
- 3. No more than 1 absence or 2 tardies.
- 4. Student is responsible for their own transportation to and from clinical training site.

Criteria for Instructor Approval & Student Requirements —Cooperative Education

Enrollment for Cooperative Education classes requires Instructor Approval.

- 1. Students must have taken pre-requisite course(s) in CTE and provide verification of their passing grade.
- 2. Students must be in 12th grade (senior), at least be 16 years of age and be a completer in his/her program area.
- 3. Student must be eligible to complete an I-9 and provide appropriate documentation of citizenship.
- 4. Students must average 15 hours of work study per week at a paid position related to his/her program area.
- 5. Students in the program should have obtained their job by the end of the fourth week (20 Days) of school. This is the last day the student may drop the class WITHOUT a grade/credit consequence.
- 6. If the student has not obtained a job by the end of the 1st nine weeks, their grade in the work portion of Cooperative Education class will be an "F" and the points lost thus far will be difficult to make-up (weekly hours lost and points for weekly reports that are turned in).
- 7. During each semester a student should work a minimum of 240 hours (18 weeks in a semester-first 4 to get placed = 14 weeks plus 2 weeks of fall break = 16 weeks X 15 hours per week).
- 8. Students must follow the attendance policy of each school. Students are not permitted to attend work on days they did not attend school without teacher approval.
- 9. Students with an "F" in either the work portion or class portion at the end of first semester will be dropped and not enrolled in the course sections during the second semester.

Criteria for Instructor Approval & Student Requirements —Internship

Enrollment for Internship program requires Instructor Approval.

- 1. Students must have taken pre-requisite course(s) in CTE and provide verification of their passing grade.
- 2. Students must be in 12th grade (senior), at least be 16 years of age and be a completer in his/her program area.
- 3. Students must complete 90 internship hours each semester, outside his/her normal school day in a paid or unpaid position related to his/her program area.
- 4. Student must meet on designated dates to complete the required paperwork and lessons. This time can be counted towards his/her internship hours.
