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The Circle Rocking "S" Children's Farm held a sheep shearing event May 13 to show attendees how sheep are sheared for wool.

The Children's Farm hosts the event annually.

The farm's sheep, "Agnus Del," is a 6-year-old CVMX Merino-Corriedale-Dorset breed sheep born March 1, 2019. She

grows layers of wool that are sheared during the winter and spring.

Nancy Supran spoke about the importance of shearing sheep.

"Well, their wool always grows, otherwise they wouldn't be able to see," Supran said. "We do it for their health, otherwise it would just keep growing. Picture your own hair. So for hygiene and everything else, she can't wait to get it off. She's been rubbing her back and all that, you know, to get nice and clean."
