DECEMBER MEETING

Honoree: **Det. Terence Mulvey.** Retired Detective First Grade Terence Mulvey was appointed to the NYPD in July of 1983 and assigned to the Mid-Town South Precinct. In 1986 he was assigned to Manhattan North Narcotics as an investigator. In 1989 he was promoted to 3rd Grade Detective and assigned to the 24th Squad. In 1993 he was assigned to the Intelligence Division and worked in the Executive Protection Unit. In 1996 he received Second Grade and was promoted to First Grade in 1999. In 2000 he was assigned to the DEA Task Force where he retired out of in August of 2003.

After his retirement, Terence went back to college full time at Lehman College and earned his BA in History and a Master's in Education. He began teaching 5th grade at Incarnation School in Washington Heights. He is currently the Assistant Principal of Student Affairs at Cardinal Hayes High School in the Bronx. In 1988, during his time in Manhattan North Narcotics, Terence began a toy drive to benefit the children at Columbia Presbyterian Babies Hospital. Members of Manhattan North contributed money or donated gifts and Terence and other detectives delivered the toys to the children dressed as Santa and friends. Once he left for the 24 Squad, the endeavor to deliver toys was moved to his neighborhood where an annual event to raise money has been held ever since. The event was given a name, "Toys for Children" and though no longer held in Terence's commands, NYPD members have always been a part of the event and detectives from 30 years ago still contribute. Any monies not spent on toys goes directly to the Child Life Fund at Morgan Stanley Children's Hospital at Columbia Presbyterian (formerly Babies Hospital). This year marks the 30th year in which he and some friends will deliver toys to the children at Columbia Presbyterian. Terence remains active in his community as well where he has coached basketball and baseball for the local school and Little League respectively. He is also the volunteer coordinator and moderator for the Exceptional Children's Program at Cardinal Hayes; a program that works with mentally challenged adults.

The RDNY is not honoring Terry for his career in the NYPD, which is an outstanding and prestigious in itself, but for his selfless kindness for 30 years without fanfare. Terry has been bringing happiness to children not just on Christmas but all year. So I ask you all to come and join us and bring an unwrapped gift on Dec. 6th and make this even more special. 
