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

- Entries in all departments in the building, unless otherwise stated, must be made between the hours of 2 and 5 PM on Monday, September 6th (Labor Day). All exhibits must be in place no later than 5 PM, September 6th except as stated elsewhere in the catalog.
- 6 All exhibits (except livestock) must remain in place until Sunday afternoon September 12th. Exhibits must be removed between the hours of 2:00-4:00 PM Sunday, September 12th.
- Management will not be responsible for exhibits after 4 P.M. on September 12th.
- 8 The management will use every precaution to prevent any accident or loss to persons, animals, or exhibits, but will not be responsible for any accidental loss or damage.
- 9 Department coordinators will have the authority to refuse entry to any exhibit which is not a credit to the Robertson County Fair.
- Junior exhibitor is any member of Robertson County 4-H Club, FCCLA, or FFA Chapters.
- 11 All farm and garden products must be grown and exhibited by residents of Robertson County.

- 12 Competition open only to Robertson County in all departments except open Dairy and Beef Cattle which are open to the world.
- 13 Premiums will be paid only on lots listed in the catalog.
- 14 No premiums will be awarded where the exhibit is considered unworthy by the judges.
- **15** No limit as to number of entries in each lot except where specified. No more than one premium will be paid to exhibitors with more than one entry per lot, except livestock.
- **16** Premiums will be paid as announced.
- **17** All awards and prize money must be claimed within thirty days from last day of fair.
- 18 All premium checks are to be cashed within 60 days.
- 19 In all cases, the decision of the judges shall be final.
- **20** All protests must be filed with the secretary of the fair before noon Sunday, September 12th and such protests must be made in writing.



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2021 ROBERTSON COUNTY YOUTH GOAT SHOW ROBERTSON COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS - SPRINGFIELD, TN SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 11, 2021

Pre-Entry requested for paperwork to simplify check-in on show date. Weigh-in will be 12:00 PM - 2:00 PM. Showmanship Classes will begin at 3:00 PM Market Classes will follow Showmanship Classes.

- 2 Any breed or cross breed of goat can be shown. All classes will be shown by weight.
- 3 30 pounds minimum weight. There will be 5 divisions of goats shown: Market Kids, Replacement Doe Kids, Yearling Does, Junior Bucks, and Senior Bucks. Bucklings under 1 year by weight, and 1 year & over by age. (Market Kids, Does, & Wethers will be put in the ring together by weight. Does in this class will not be eligible for the Replacement Doe Class).
- Wether Kids must NOT exhibit any testicular tissue. Animals having 4 this will be dismissed.
- 5 Wether Kids and Doe Kids must have all milk teeth at weigh-in. Wethers not having them will be dismissed and Does without all milk teeth will be moved to the Yearling Doe division. Yearling Does are allowed to have no more than two sets of adult teeth (4 large teeth) to be eligible to compete in championship class.
- All goats must be polled or have their horns either tipped or cushioned with a material to help prevent injury to the exhibitor.

- 1 Animals are not to be unloaded until Health Certificates are checked. 7 All goats must have legible tattoo or scrapie tags in ear in order to show.
 - 8 Each exhibitor is limited to (5) animals for the show. You can show up to (3) bucks also. Pens will be supplied for BUCKS ONLY.
 - 9 All goats will be weighed and classified prior to the show and will be divided into classes in their division.
 - 10 Show management reserves the right to disqualify any animal that exhibits any sign of disease regardless.
 - 11 Robertson County Fair Association is not responsible for any accidents.

SPECIAL NOTE: Federal Law requires that all goats that are exhibited in shows must meet USDA Regulations and have a Scrapie ID Ear Tag permanently attached to its ear, or other approved ID. Exhibitors may contact the USDA Office at 615-781-5310 to order their tags. Animals without proper Scrapie Tags and Certificates of Veterinary Inspection will not be allowed to exhibit.



2021 RULIS & GUIDHLINIS

- Applications MUST BE RECEIVED BY AUGUST 27, 2021
- After this date, there will be a \$25 ENTRY FEE
- Parade entries may include the following:
- Floats: a decorated trailer pulled by a vehicle (truck, SUV, semi-truck)
 - Autos/Trucks
 - Business Advertising
 - Marching Band, Cheer/Dance Teams
 - Other: fire trucks, police car, horses
- All vehicles must be in good working condition and capable of towing your float to the parade staging area, during the parade and after the parade.
- 2 Line-up will be on Hill Street entering at 9th Avenue. Only parade participants will be allowed past this area. Riders maybe dropped off here as well.
- 3 All entries MUST be lined up before 4:30pm. Parade will start promptly at 5:00 pm Line will begin to move by 4:45 pm.
- 4 Entries must abide by all rules on the application.
- 5 All vehicles, including go carts and similar vehicles must be driven by a licensed driver and have proof of insurance. Drivers and vehicle owners are liable for any damage or accident.
- 6 Entries may use sound amplification for musical purposes, but not for addressing the audience – no speeches/campaigning please! No inappropriate language or profanity
- 7 NO PERFORMANCE STOPS along the parade route. You may, perform as the parade is moving.

- 8 Throwing candy from vehicles is NOT ALLOWED. For the safety of all, no materials may be thrown along the parade route. This includes candy, flyers, literature, etc. However, walkers alongside entries may hand out candy and other items. Violations of this rule will result in your candy being confiscated & could result in rejection for future parade entries.
- 9 Motorcycles are permitted however, they may not squeal tires, rev engines, or cause a disturbance that might endanger anyone in or along the parade route; anyone breaking this rule will be subject to arrest and at the very least, immediately removed from the parade.
- **10** No graphic images will be allowed (to be determined by the Robertson County Fair Board).
- 11 Leave at least 1 car length between floats and maintain a speed of 3 MPH.

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
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
